## (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 13th day of September, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Metherringham, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Blankney-lane from Blankney cross-roads to the Great Northern and Great Eastern Railway on the south, the Great Northern and Great Eastern Railway on the west, the Metherringham Fen-lane to the Old Carr Dyke on the north, and the said Old Carr Dyke, an arable-field and a corn-field in the occupation of Henry Chaplin, Esquire, M.P., and the Fox Cover plantation and the Metherringham Moor-lane to the Blankney cross-roads aforesaid,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the first day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

THE Queen has been graciously pleased to signify Her intention to confer the decoration of the Victoria Cross upon the undermentioned Warrant Officer of the Royal Navy, whose claim has been submitted for Her Majesty's approval, for an act of gallant conduct performed by him during the Naval Attack, of 11th July last, on the batteries of Alexandria, in Egypt, as recorded against his name :—

Name and Rank.	Act of Bravery for which recommended.
Mr. Israel Harding, Gunner, of Her Majesty's Ship "Alexandra"	At about nine o'clock, on the morning of the 11th July, whilst Her Majesty's Ship "Alexandra" was engaging the Forts at Alexandria, a 10-inch spherical shell passed through the ship's side and lodged on the main deck. Mr. Harding hearing the shout "there is a live shell just above the hatchway," rushed up the ladder from below, and, observing that the fuze was burning, took some water from a tub standing near, and threw it over the projectile, then picked up the shell and put it into the tub. Had the shell burst, it would probably have destroyed many lives.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul-General at Odessa, enclosing a copy of the regulations respecting the Belogrudovsky Channel at the mouth of the Dnieper, of which the following is a translation, viz:—

REGULATIONS respecting the obligatory towing of vessels through the Belogrudovsky Channel, mouth of the Dnieper.

1. All decked sailing vessels desirous of passing down the Belogrudovsky Channel must let go their anchor before crossing the bar, near the Pilot's office, in such a manner, as not to block up the fair way. Vessels coming up from the Liman (estuary) must remain at anchor near the entrance. In both cases the vessels will hoist a flag at their foremast head, upon which the tug-steamers "Dnieper" will take them in tow, for which service Rs. 1 per 1,000 poods of cargo is charged. Empty vessels will pay 25 copecks per 1,000 poods burthen.

N.B.—Vessels going by the Zcurievsky Channel are forbidden to anchor at the point where the two channels Zcurievsky and Belogrudovsky intersect.

2. The Kherson town steamer "Dnieper" and steamers belonging to private individuals are not allowed to tow more than two vessels, one behind the other, at a time.

3. Vessels taken through the channel may draw according to the depth of water there, but not more than 12 feet; vessels drawing more than 12 feet are not allowed to pass through the channel.

N.B. All vessels must have their draft in feet marked on their sternpost and cutwater. The depth of water in the channel will be shown on the pilot office mast.

4. All shipowners and skippers must hand over to the Superintendent Pilot the manifests of their cargo on Government forms, which are delivered by the Chief of the 2nd Section of the Kieff District of Ways of Communication, who has an office at Kherson.

N.B. These Government manifests certify that the  $\frac{1}{2}$  per cent. on the value of the cargo river-dues for improving the navigation of rivers has been paid, otherwise the vessel will not be allowed to proceed.

5. Parties infringing the above regulations are

liable to be punished according to Articles 77 and 87, Justices of Peace Code of Punishments.
