THE Board of Trade have received a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Rio, reporting that, as a sanitary measure, vessels arriving at that port will be required to anchor and keep at some distance from the shore during the hot season, commencing from 1st November next. This will involve extra expense in the discharge of cargoes.
