(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 12th day of October, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy-Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely), — (1.) so much of the parishes of Bradley, Haughton, Castle Church, and Penkridge, in the county of Stafford, as is bounded by the highway from Hyde Lea to Levedale, thence by the highway through Bradley village to Haughton, thence by the main-road to Billington Bank, thence by the highway to Doxey Wood, and by the footpath from Doxey Wood to Hyde Lea aforesaid, and (2) the townships of Great Wyrley, Hilton, and Essington, the parish of Cheslyn Hay, and so much of the parish of Shreshill as lies on the eastern side of the turnpike-road from Wolverhampton to Cannock, all in the county of Stafford,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the thirtieth day of August, and the second day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

(SWINE-FEVER.)

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Each of the Areas described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.
