(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 25th day of October, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the township of Cartmel Fell, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway to Cartmel on the west, the highway to Newton on the north and east, and a certain private-road that runs east and west and connects the two highways aforesaid on the south,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the eleventh day of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the parish of Wilford, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Trent from the borough boundary near Wilford Bridge on the north, along the river Trent to the Clifton boundary brook on the west, along the boundary fence to Ruddington-road on the south, along the Rud-

dington-road to Wilford blacksmith's shop, and along Wilford-lane to The Gravel House on the east, and along the river Trent by the borough boundary to Wilford Bridge aforesaid ; (2.) so much of the parishes of Willoughby, and Widmerpool, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Widmerpool to Wysall on the north, the highway from Wysall to Willoughby on the west, the highway from Willoughby to Broughton on the south, and the boundary fence of Willoughby and Widmerpool in a straight line to Broughton highway and Widmerpool highway on the east ; (3.) so much of the parishes of Carlton, and Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the main-street of Carlton from Carlton Mill to the post-office on the north, the foot-road to Colwick from the post-office to Savils Gate on the east, a straight line to Colwick Park farm from Savils Gate on the south, and the foot-road from Colwick Park farm to Carlton Mill on the west ; (4.) so much of the parish of Edingley, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Southwell to Edingley, the river Greet from Southwell to Kirklington, the Dyke from Kirklington to near Kirklington station known as the Mill Dyke and across to Hallam's House near Gold Hill, and thence down to the boundary of Mrs. Bilbie's farm to the river Greet ; and (5.) so much of the parish of Weston, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Great North-road on the north, Egman-ton-road leading from the Great North-road to Egman-ton on or towards the west, the road leading from Egman-ton to Moorhouse on or towards the south, and a bridle-road leading from Moorhouse to the Great North-road on or towards the east ;—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the eighth, nineteenth, twenty-first, twenty-second, and twenty-sixth days of September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-sixth day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

(PORT OF GLASGOW.)

AT the *Council Chamber, Whitehall*, the 25th day of *October*, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby define the following part of the Port of Glasgow, in the county of Lanark, as a foreign animals wharf:

All that space in the port and burgh of Glasgow, being part of the wharf and depôt of the Trustees of the Clyde Navigation, known as the Yorkhill Wharf, and situate on the south-east side of the Ferry-road, bounded by a line commencing at a point on the south-east side of the said Ferry-road where the same is intersected by the water-edge of the said Wharf; thence passing in a south-easterly direction for a distance of three hundred and seventy-seven feet six inches or thereabouts along the coping which forms the water-edge of the said Wharf; thence running north-east along a line at right angles to the said coping for a distance of fifty-four feet nine inches or thereabouts, bounded by a wooden fence; thence passing in a south-easterly direction along a line at right angles to the last described boundary and parallel with the said coping for a distance of one hundred and thirty-eight feet five inches or thereabouts; thence running north-east along a line at right angles to the last described boundary for a distance of one hundred and twenty feet or thereabouts to a point on the south-west side of the Pointhouse-road; thence passing in a north-westerly direction for a distance of four hundred and fifty-one feet two inches or thereabouts along the south-west boundary of the said Pointhouse-road to a point where it meets the south-east boundary of the said Ferry-road; thence south-west along the south-east boundary of the said Ferry-road for a distance of one hundred and eighty-six feet six inches or thereabouts to the point of departure first described; and all which space is coloured pink on the plan thereof deposited for the purposes of this Order at the Privy Council Office, a copy of which is deposited at the office of the Town Clerk of the burgh of Glasgow.
