AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 31st day of October, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The limits of the following Areas which are declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the twenty-fourth and twenty-seventh days of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—(1.) at Potter Heigham, in the county of Norfolk, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Yarmouth and North Norfolk Railway on the south and west, the Hundred Stream, and Heigham Sounds on the east, and Hickling-road, Catfield Dyke, and the road leading from Catfield Staithe to Catfield

Station on the north, and (2.) so much of the parish of Martham as lies to the northward of the Yarmouth and North Norfolk Railway, and the whole of the parishes of East Somerton, and West Somerton, in the county of Norfolk,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the First Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The Area described in the Second Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the second day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.
