The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Eling, in the county of Southampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, James Rose's house on the south, Water-lane on the west, Bears-lane and Calmerroad on the north, and the Salisbury-road to James Rose's house aforesaid on the east,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fifteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now Areas Infected with Foot-and-Month Disease under the abovementioned Act (except the lines of railway within those areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those areas, without untrucking):---

Bedfordshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Henlow, in the county of Bedford, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from the cross-roads at Henlow to Arlsey Station on the Great Northern Railway, thence in a southerly direction to the Station at Henlow on the Midland Railway; and all lands lying east of the said Railway Station at Henlow to the cross-roads at Henlow aforesaid.

(2.) At South Creake, in the county of Norfolk, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road leading from Burnham Market to Fakenham on the north and east, the high-road leading from South Creake to Dunton on the west, and a certain cross road known as Grigg's Drove on the south.

(2.) At Braconash, in the county of Norfolk, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road from Norwich to Buckenham on the west, the village of Braconash and Bracon Lodge and grounds on the north, Flordon Long-lane on the east, and Flordon Hall-lane on the south.

(3.) So much of the parish of Fring, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road leading from Docking to Sedgeford ou the north, the high-road leading from Sedgeford to Bircham on the west and south, and the high-road leading from Docking to Bircham on the east.

(4.) So much of the parish of Swardeston, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Swardeston Common on the north, the turnpike-road to New Buckenham on the east, Catbrick-lane on the south, and the stream dividing the parishes of Swardeston and Carlton on the west.

(5.) All such part of the county of Norfolk as lies to the eastward of the high-road from Scole by Long Stratton to the boundary of the county of the city of Norwich at Harford Bridges; and also so much of the said county of Norfolk as lies to the eastward of the boundary line of the county of the city of Norwich and likewise eastward of the high-road from the same boundary (at Shepherds Cottage, Hellesdon) to Aylsham and Cromer.

(6.) So much of the parish of Burnham Westgate, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading to Muckleton farm and Stanhoe Cross on the north and west, the road leading from Stanhoe Cross to Sharnmer Barn and North Creake on the south, and the road leading from Sharnmer Barn known as the Bacon Hill-road to Burnham on the east.

(7.) So much of the parishes of Kettlestone, Fulmodeston, Stibbard, and Little Ryburgh, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road from Fakenham to Stibbard on the south, the road from Stibbard to Barney on the east, the cross-road from Fulmodeston Common to Kettlestone on the north, and the road from Kettlestone to Ryburgh on the west.

(8.) So much of the parish of Runton, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Sherringham to Cromer on the north, the road leading from Holt to Cromer on the south, Davy Hill and the road leading from Felbrigg to Runton on the east, and Runton Woods and the road leading from Gresham to West Runton on the west.

(9.) So much of the township of Swaffham, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Hilboroughroad as far as the boundary of Carol House farm in the occupation of George Jacobs extends, thence along the boundary fence of the said farm as far as the plantation, thence in a straight line across George Jacobs's land to the back private-road as far as Pickenham Northroad, and thence across to the Hilborough-road aforesaid.

- Northamptonshire.—So much of the parishes of Braybrook, and Arthingworth, in the county of Northampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Braybrook to Oxendon in the parish of Braybrook on the north and west, the road leading from Braybrook to Arthingworth in the parish of Braybrook on the east, and the southern boundary of the farm in the occupation of Thomas Yormans in the parish of Arthingworth on the south.
- Nottinghamshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Ruddington, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Ruddington to Wilford on the west, the highway leading to Edwalton Bar on the east, the houndary fence of Bradmore and Ruddington on the north, and the foot-way leading from Ruddington to Bradmore on the south.

(2.) So much of the parish of Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the borough of Nottingham from the Iron Gates on the Trent side to Colwick Gate House on the west, from Colwick Gate House by Colwick-road to the Garden House on the north, from the Garden House by the Garden House-lane to the river Trent on the east, and by the river Trent to the Iron Gates aforesaid on the south.

(3.) So much of the parishes of Redmile, Barkestone, Bottesford, and Granby, in the counties of Leicester, and Nottirgham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Granby to Elton on the north, the read from Elton to Bottesford on the east, the accommodation-road from Bottesford to Barkestone on the south, and the road from Barkestone to Granby on the west.

Barkestone to Granby on the west. (4.) So much of the parish of Holme-Pierrepont, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, along the Canal from Colgrave Place to Bassingfield, thence along the south side of Holme Grange-lane to Holme Grange, thence along Holme-road to Pepper Houses, and thence along the west side of Cotgrave-road to Cotgrave Place aforesaid.

(5.) So much of the parish of Granby, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the east side of the London and North-Western Railway from Barnston-station to Red Barn Bridge, thence along the north side of Mr. Wilkinson's field to Sears's Lodge, thence along the Granbyroad as far as Whipling Bridge and on the east side of Mr. Butt's Long field to the south-east corner of Mr. Butt's field known as Stepperys, thence along the south fence to Barnston-road, and along the north side of that road to Barnston-station aforesaid.

(6.) So much of the parish of Sherwood, in the borough of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, a certain grass field in the occupation of Richard Armitage on the north, a certain house and garden in the occupation of Mr. Rudd on the east, a certain house and garden at present unoccupied on the south, and a certain house lately in the occupation of Arthur Wells deceased on the west.

(7.) So much of the parish of Sneinton, in the borough of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, certain cottage-gardens on the north, certain land in the occupation of Messrs. Birkin and Scoofield on the east, certain household property on the south, and certain land belonging to Earl Manvers on the west.

(8.) So much of the parish of South Muskham, in the county of Nottingham, and adjoining parishes, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Bathley-lane leading from the Great North-road near the Lord Nelson Inn to Bathley on or towards the north, Hop-Yardlane leading from Bathley to Caunton-road near Debdale Hill on or towards the west, and Caunton-road leading from Debdale Hill to the Great North-road on or towards the south.

(9.) So much of the parish of Holme-Pierrepont, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Adbolton to Gamston, thence along the road to Bassingfield and along the footpath to Shepherd Houses, thence along the road to Holme Low-road, and thence along the south side of Holme Low-road to Adbolton aforesaid.

(10.) So much of the parishes of Clifton, and Barton, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Clifton to the Thrumpton highway on the eat, the highway leading from Barton Lodge to the river Trent on the west, the river Trent from Barton Boat to Clifton Church on the north, and the highway leading from Clifton Green to Barton Lodge on the south.

(11.) At Holme-Pierrepont, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Holme Grange, thence along Holme Grange-lane to Bassingfield, thence along the road through Bassingfield and along the footpath to Thornton's Holt, thence along a footpath above Thornton's Holt, thence along a footpath above Thornton's Holt by Gee's Hovel and along to the end of Holme Low-road in Rateliffe-on-Trent, and thence along the south side of Holme Low-road to Holme Grange aforesaid.

(12.) So much of the parishes of Wysall, and Costock, in the courty of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Wysall, along the Willoughby-road to the boundary Bridge on the east, along the Wysall boundary brook to Thorpe Bridge and from thence along a certain bridle-road to Rempston-road on the south, along Rempston-road to Farrow's farm, from thence along the boundary fence of Oldershaw's farm to Costock-road, and thence along Carver's boundary fence to Highfield farm on the west, along the Wysall boundary fence to Harrison's farm, thence along a certain occupation - lane to Bunny-road, and along the vicarage field fence to Keyworth - road, and along that road to Baldock's farm on the north, and from Baldock's farm along Walker's boundary fence to the Willoughby-road aforesaid.

(13.) So much of the parishes of Ratcliffeon-Trent, Carlton, and Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stoke Dyke from Colwick Good's Yard to the Great Northern Railway near Ratcliffe Bridge on the east, the Great Northern Railway to Colwick-station on the south-west, and the Great Northern Railway Godling line to Stoke Dyke in Colwick Good's Yard aforesaid on the north-east.

(14.) So much of the parishes of Ratcliffeon-Trent, Carlton, and Colwick, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Stoke Dyke and boundary fence from Colwick Good's Yard to the river Trent on the east, from the end of Stoke boundary fence by the river Trent to the south corner of George Neale's field on the south, from thence by a straight line across to Colwick Passenger Station on the west, and from thence by the Great Northern Gedling line to the Stoke Dyke on the north.

(15.) So much of the parish of Hickling, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Robert Collishaw's house in Hickling village along a footpath to Lambs Barn, from Lambs Barn along a bridle-road to Kinoulton-road, along the south side of Kinoulton-road to the Neville Arms, thence along the west side of the highway to Robert Collishaw's house in Hickling village aforesaid.

(16.) So much of the parish of Arnold, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, an occupation-road leading from Arnold to Woodborough on the east, thence along a foot-road to the Calverton-road on the north, and along Club Garden-lane to Spout-lane on the west, and along Spout-lane to the occupation-road aforesaid on the south; the said roads and lanes being included in the Area.

(17.) At Rufford, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road from Rufford Kennels to Eakring on the south, Little Layfields farm in the occupation of Mr. White including the highway from Wellow to Eakring on the east, the foot-road from Wellow to Bilsthorpe on the west, and certain lands in the occupation of Messrs. Bennett and Pottinger of Wellow on the north.

(18.) So much of the parish of Clifton, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Wilford to Barton on the south, the occupation - road at the top of Mr. Allen's field leading from the Barton highway to the river Trent on the west, the river Trent to the end of Clifton Grove on the north, and from the end of Clifton Grove along Mr. Spencer's Brick-yard field fence to the Barton highway on the east.

(19.) So much of the parishes of Mansfield Woodhouse, and Warsop, and of the township of Clipstone, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Worksop-road from the road leading to Westfield House to New Mill-lane on the west, New Mill-lane from Worksop-road to the Flood Dykes on the south, Flood Dyke-road from New Mill-lane to New Buildings on the east, and a straight line from New Buildings to Westfield House and thence along the road from Westfield House to Worksop-road on the north.

(20.) So much of the parish of Barton, in the county of Nottingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Barton Boat to Barton Lodge (including the highways) on the east, thence along the Thrumpton highway to Green's Gangway on the south, thence along Green's Gangway to the river Trent on the west, and thence along the river Trent to Barton Boat aforesaid on the north.

(21.) At Wellow, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the high-road leading from Newark to Worksop on the south, a lane leading from the said high-road to Jordan Castle farm on the west, the fence of Wellow Park on the north, and the private-road leading from Laxton to Ompton on the east.

(22.) At Carlton, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the upper village of Carlton on the north, Wigthorpe-lane on the south, Forestlane (leading from Carlton to the Blythe-road) on the cast, and the Carlton and Worksop-road on the west.

- Roxburghshire.—So much of the parishes of Kclso, ard Ednam, in the county of Roxburgh, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Policies and Parks of Broomlands and Hendersyde Park on the south, the lands of Hendersyde farm and Cliftonhill farm on the east, the turnpike-road from Sydenham farm to the south-east corner of the Kelso Race Course, and the Servitude-road, thence to the junction of the Abbot's Seat-road with the Broomloan on the north, and the arable lands of West Broomlands on the west.

So much of the parish of Grindall, in the East Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from North Burton to Boynton on the east and south, and a quickwood fence dividing a grass field and tillage fields on the north and west sides in the same occupation and known by the name of the Back Garth.

THE following is a translation of the Quarantine Rules adopted by the Egyptian Board of Health (or arrivals from Arabian ports of the Red Sea during the pilgrimage season, and which were referred to in the notice from this Department of the 28th ultimo (published in the Gazette of the 31st ultimo), as having been received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs.

No copy of the model card of residence for pilgrims, mentioned in these rules, has been received.

Translation.

EGYPTIAN MARITIME AND QUARANTINE BOARD OF HEALTH.

REGULATIONS relative to arrivals from Arabian ports of the Red Sea during the Pilgrimageseason of 1882-3.

PART I.

ARRIVALS WITH FOUL BILLS IN RESPECT OF CHOLERA.

ART. 1. Every ship arriving from a port of the Hedjaz, or from any other port of the Arabian coast of the Red Sea, with a foul bill of health on account of cholera, and having on board pilgrims or the like destined for Suez or any Mediterranean port, must go to El-Wisch in order to undergo the regulation quarantine.

There passengers, baggage, and susceptible merchandise will be disembarked, and these, as well as effects in use, and the ship will be disinfected.

Ships, after disinfection, will, in case of need, be authorised to go to the port of Gabban, and to stay there until the expiration of their quarantine.

ART. 2. The duration of quarantine for the pilgrims referred to in the preceding article shall be for fifteen full days, to be counted from the day of the last known case of cholera in the quarantine section of El-Wisch, provided that the sections afford sufficient guarantees as to isolation.

When once the quarantine has been undergone the pilgrims will be sent to Tor, where they must undergo a further quarantine for five days, accompanied by disinfection of effects and very susceptible merchandise (1st category), as well as of the vessel. Finally, foreign pilgrims must embark on the ship which brought them to Tor, and pass the canal in quarantine, after undergoing an interrogatory and a favourable medical visit at Suez.

The rules of the sections shall be observed there as at El-Wisch.

If a choleraic case should occur in one of the sections, the pilgrims in that section shall undergo a quarantine of fifteen days.

Egyptian pilgrims, after leaving Tor, must land at Moses' Wells to undergo a quarantine of observation for three days and a medical visit, before being admitted to free pratique.

The ships which carry these pilgrims will be of the Red Sea, subjected to the same measures as the latter, account of plague.

without being permitted to leave them in order to undertake new voyages.

If during the voyage from Tor to Suez any of these ships should have a suspicious case on board, the ship will be sent back to Tor.

ART. 3. The agents of navigation companies and masters are informed that only Egyptian pilgrims will, after finishing their quarantine at the lazarets of El-Wisch and Tor, be authorised to finally leave the ship at Mozes' Wells with a view of going to their homes.

Only those pilgrins who are bearers of a card of residence issued by an Egyptian authority, and in conformity with the model hereto annexed, will be recognised as Egyptians or residents in Egypt. Specimens of this card will be deposited with the consular and sanitary authorities at Djeddah and Yambo, where agents and masters of ships can examine them.

Pilgrims who are not Egyptians, such as Turks, Russians, Persians, Tunisians, Algerians, Moors, &c., cannot, after leaving El-Wisch and Tor, be landed at an Egyptian port.

In consequence navigation agents and masters are informed that the trans-shipment of pilgrims who are foreigners to Egypt, whether at Tor, Suez, Port Said, or Alexandria is forbidden.

Ships which have on board prilgrims belonging to the nationalities specified in the toregoing paragraph will share the conditions imposed on such pilgrims, and will not be received in any Egyptian port of the Mediterranean.

ART. 4. Ships with foul bills of health on account of cholera, coming from the Hedjaz or any other port of the Arabian coast of the Red Sea, without having embarked pilgrims or the like, and not having had any suspicious case on board during their voyage, are authorised to undergo the ten days' quarantine at Tor. There the effects, susceptible merchandize of both categories, and the ship will be disinfected. Such vessels may then pass the Canal in quarantine if they are destined for a Mediterranean port not in Egypt. If their destination is in Egypt, they must undergo three days' quarantine of observation at Moses' Wells, and they will not be admitted to free pratique except after a favourable medical visit.

It is understood that if these ships have had suspicious cases during their voyage the quarantine to be undergone by them at Tor will be for fifteen days.

In any instance where a suspicious case may show itself on board during the voyage between Tor and Suez, the ship will be sent back to Tor there to undergo the quarantine referred to in the preceding paragraph.

Caravans composed of Egyptian pilgrims must, before entering Egypt, undergo a rigorous quarantine of fifteen days at El-Wisch. They will then be sent to Moses' Wells, there to undergo a quarantine of observation of five days, after which they will not be admitted to free pratique except after a favourable medical visit and disinfection of effects.

Caravans composed of foreign pilgrims on their way home by land will be subjected to the same measures as caravans of Egyptians, and must be accompanied by sanitary guards as far as the limits of the desert.

PART II.

ABRIVALS WITH FOUL BILLS IN RESPECT OF PLAGUE.

ART. 5. The provisions contained in the preceding Articles 1, 2, 3, and 4 are applicable to ships arriving from the Hedjaz, or any other port of the Red Sea, with foul bills of health on account of plague.

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PART III.

ARRIVALS WITH CLEAN BILLS.

ART. 6. (1.) Throughout the whole season of the return of pilgrims, ships coming from the Hedjaz, or any other port of the Arabian coast of the Red Sca, with clean bills of health and having pilgrims on board, must go to Tor, there to undergo an observation of 45 hours after complete disembarkation of pilgrims.

(2.) The pilgrims only will be disembarked at the quarantine camp.

(3.) After having undergone this observation of 48 hours, the ships will be admitted to free pratique at Suez, if the medical visit is favourable.

(4.) Nevertheless only pilgrims who are Egyptian or resident in Egypt, and bearing a card of residence, will be allowed to land at Suez.

(5.) With respect to other pilgrims of foreign nationality the regulation set forth in paragraph 3 of Article 3 will be followed.

(6.) The trans-shipment of pilgrims is strictly forbidden at all Egyptian ports.

(7.) Ships coming from the Hedjaz, or a port of the Arabian coast of the Red Sea, with clean bills of health, not having on board pilgrims or the like, and not having had any suspicious case during the voyage, will be admitted to free pratique at Suez after a favourable medical visit.

ART. 7. Ships leaving the Hedjaz with clean bills of health, and having on board pilgrims whose destination is a port of the African coast of the Red Sea, are authorized to go to Souakim, there to undergo the 48 hours' observation, accompanied by disembarkation of passengers at the quarantine camp.

ART. 8. Caravans and pilgrims coming by land will be subjected to an observation of 48 hours at Mcses' Wells and to a medical visit.

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS.

Sanitary officers of the Hedjaz are requested to give a copy of these regulations to every master on his arrival, and to endorse upon the bill of health that this has been done.

All previous provisions which are contrary to the present regulations are and remain revoked.

(No. 230.)-Spain-North-West Coast.

Precautions necessary in passing Cape Finisterre. THE Committee of Lloyd's having drawn attention, through the Board of Trade, to the large number of vessels that during the last few years have been wrecked or otherwise lost in the neighbourhood of Cape Finisterre, it is deemed desirable in the interests of seamen to re-publish the following information bearing on the navigation of that part of the coast of Spain.

The sailing directions for the west coasts of France, Spain and Portugal, 3rd edition, 1881, published by the Admiralty, state at page 4 (as was also stated in the editions of 1867 and 1873).

"The easterly current from the North Atlantic strikes the land near Cape Ortegal in Spain, and then appears to divide into two branches; the northern (Rennell current) flowing eastward along the coast of Spain, then north along the west coast of France. The southern branch turns gradually to the south-east and southward along the coast of Portugal until having passed Cape St. Vincent, when it runs eastward to the Strait of Gibraltar. It must not however be presumed that the current along the west coast of Spain and Portugal always sets to the southward, for during westerly winds it sets strong towards the land, and immediately after the continuance of southerly gales or strong breezes the current will probably be found setting to the northward."

"The mariner will perceive that caution is necessary in crossing the Bay of Biscay, and that due allowance should be made both for the outset and indraft, but especially the latter, when standing to the southward during thick weather for a position westward of Cape Finisterre."

It is also stated in the same sailing directions at page 224-" The coast between Capes Ortegal and Finisterre is dangerous to approach at night, especially in the winter season, or in thick and foggy weather, which is frequent here, for not only does a powerful current at times set towards the land from the north-west, but the streams of flood and ebb often draw vessels out of their computed position."

As some of the recorded wrecks in the neighbourhood of Cape Finisterre may have arisen from the effects of the indraft, or set towards the land, as above described; the attention mariners is again drawn to the necessity of caution and of a vigilant look-out when approaching the parallel of the Cape.

Mariners are also cautioned when approaching Cape Finisterre, especially in vessels from ports of the United Kingdom, to lose no favourable opportunity of ascertaining the errors of the navigating compass :- one of the unsuspected causes of vessels being found, in thick weather, in dangerous proximity to the land, being doubtless due to the disregard of these necessary observations.

According to a statement furnished by Lloyd's, the following are the losses in the neighbourhood of Cape Finisterre, from the year 1877 (inclusive) to July, 1882, namely :- Wrecks, 15 ; Losses by Collision, 7; Foundered, 8; Abandoned, 6.]

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 231.)—AFRICA.—NORTH-EAST COAST. Precautions Necessary in Rounding Cape Guard-

ofui (Ras Asir) from the Southward. THE Committee of Lloyd's having drawn attention, through the Board of Trade, to the large number of wrecks which of late years have taken place in the neighbourhood of Cape Guardafui; it has been considered desirable to re-publish, for the guidance of mariners, the following information bearing on the navigation of that locality.

It is to be observed that the wrecks in the neighbourhood of Cape Guardafui have occurred chiefly during the period of the south-west monsoon (April to September). In this season the weather, when approaching the African Coast, is stormy and accompanied by a heavy sea; the currents are strong, and the land is generally obscured by a thick haze.

Vessels bound from the eastward through the Gulf of Aden, during the south-west monsoon, approach Cape Guardafui from the southward: as the route usually adopted lies between that cape and the Island of Sokotra. In inculcating due caution for vessels using this route, the directions, published by the Admiralty in the "Gulf of Aden Pilot," second edition, 1882, state at page 10 (as is also stated in the African Pilot, part 3, 3rd edition, 1878.)

" As many large and valuable vessels have from time to time been wrecked with loss of life on the coast southward of Cape Guardafui (Ras Asír), when bound round this headland from the southeastward ; seamen should use the utmost caution not only in making the land, but also in verifying the vessel's position by soundings, more especially at night or during the south-west monsoon, when the weather is hazy."

"As soundings extend from 10 to 12 miles from the coast, the deep-sea lead should frequently be used, and the vessel's course altered to N. by E. or N. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E., or if necessary more to the eastward, immediately soundings are struck, or the land sighted in dark or hazy weather. By steering to the northward as above, and by not standing into less than 35 fathoms water, the vessel's safety will be ensured, and as the water rapidly deepens northward of the parallel of the cape, the 100 fathoms line of soundings being only $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles from it, there will be difficulty as to the time when the course should be again altered to W.N.W. During day a gradual change will be probably be seen in the colour of water from blue to dark green. Attention should also be paid to the alteration in the direction of the swell caused by the promontory of Ras Hafún." [Ras Hafún is about 80 miles south of Cape Guardafui.]

At page 13 it is stated :--- "Caution is requisite in making the land north of Ras Hafún in the night. The water gets smoother, and the swell alters its direction to the eastward of south, when the meridian of that cape is passed."

And at page 42 (as also in the 1st edition, 1863) :---"Care is necessary in making the cape (Guardafui) for the Gulf of Aden, during the south-west monsoon; the current setting up the eoast strong to the northward and close round the cape to the westward; but at a short distance (off shore) the current continues its course to the northward and eastward, whereby a vessel unless close in with the land, would be set out of her course and probably lose her passage;" or, in other words be set eastwards towards Sokotra.

The valuable guidance afforded in the directions for approaching Cape Guardafui from the southward, above-quoted, and the precautions to be observed—derived, as those directions are, from experience extending over many years—cannot be too earnestly recommended to seamen.

[From the end of the year 1876 to July, 1882, there were, according to a statement furnished by Lloyd's, 7 vessels wrecked, and 3 vessels stranded in the neighbourhood of Cape Guardafui.]
