(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

A^T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 14th day of November, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—the whole of the borough of Burton-upon-Trent,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with footand-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of November, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

An Area comprising so much of the parish of Sporle, in the county of Norfolk, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Sporle and Palgrave-road on the east, the Swaffham and Castleacre-road on the west, and the boundary fence of the farm in the occupation of Mrs. Wells on the north and south.

SCHEDULE.

(1.) An Area comprising so much of the parish of West Haddon, in the county of Northampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from West Haddon to Crick on the north, the road leading from West Haddon to Watford on the south, certain fields on the extreme boundary of the parish of West Haddon in a straight line from the Watford-road to the Crick-road on the west, and the town or parish of West Haddon on the enst.

(2.) An Area comprising so much of the parish of Holcot, in the county of Northampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Holcot to Hannington on the north, the Northampton and Kettering-road on the east, certain land in the occupation of C. Goody on the south, and the road leading from Moulton to Holcot on the west.
