at a point 20 yards or thereabouts, measuring in a westerly direction from the centre of the south face of the culvert called Carr Bridge, carrying that road over the fleet or main drain, and terminating by a junction with the Hull and Selby Line of the North Eastern Railway, at a point 50 yards or thereabouts, measuring in a westerly direction along that railway from the Hessle

junction signal-box.
Railway No. 7, wholly situate in the parish of
Hessle and East Riding of the county of York and the borough and county of the town of Kingston-upon-Hull, or one of them, commencing by a junction with the intended Railway No. 4, at a point 40 yards or thereabouts, measuring due south from the centre of the south face of the culvert called New Clough, carrying the Hull and Selby Line of the North Eastern Railway over the drain called or known as the New Drain, and terminating by a junction with the said Hull and Selby Line, at a point 150 yards or thereabouts, measuring along that railway in a westerly direction from the

said Hessle Junction signal-box. Railway No. 8, wholly situate in the intermixed parishes of Saint Mary and Saint Peter, Barton-upon-Humber, in the parts of Lindsey, in the county of Lincoln, commencing by a junction with the intended Railway No. 1, at a point on the fence forming the eastern boundary of a field be-longing or reputed to belong to James Grassby, and in his occupation, such field being situate on the northern side of the Ings-road, opposite and to the east of the junction of the Four Ings-road with the said Ings-road, such point being 88 yards or thereabouts, measuring along that fence in a northerly direction from the southern end of that fence at the Ings-road, and terminating by a junction with the Barton-upon-Humber branch of the Manchester, Sheffield, and Lincolnshire Railway, at the ter-
