8. To empower the Company to place electric lines, as defined in this notice, in, through, under, over, or along, and either above or beneath the surface of the streets and other places following (that is to say):

All or any of the streets, roads and other places named in the description of the area of supply hereinbefore contained, and also all streets, lanes, alleys, courts, squares, passages, thoroughfares and footways included within the area of supply as hereinbefore defined.

9. The applicants propose to take powers by this Order to break up the following streets which are not repairable by a local authority (that is to say):

Harewood - place ; South Molton - passage ; Grosvenor Market ; Mason's-yard ; Barlow-mews ; Chapel-mews ; Streets-court.

10. To authorise the Company to levy and recover rates, rents, and charges for and in respect of the electricity supplied by them and in respect of the sale and hire of machinery, plant, apparatus and instruments, and to confer, vary, or alter exemptions from the payment of such rates, rents, and charges, and to confer, vary, and extinguish other rights and privileges.

11. To empower the Company from time to time to make, alter, and rescind regulations and bye-laws for or relating to the use, misuse, or waste of electricity, or electric lines or apparatus connected therewith, and to impose and recover penalties for the breach of such regulations or bye-laws, and to authorise the Company, their officers, servants, and workmen to enter upon lands, buildings, and other premises, and to examine any machinery, plant, apparatus, or instruments supplied by the Company or used in connection with their lines or works, and to execute such works and to do such things as shall be necessary for the regulation or prevention of such use, misuse, or waste, and to impose and recover penalties for the tampering or fraudulently interfering with any such machines and things aforesaid.

12. To confer upon the Company all the powers and privileges, exemptions and rights given or proposed to be given to undertakers by "The Electric Lighting Act, 1882," and to authorise and enable them to exercise and enjoy the same throughout the said area of supply.

On or before the 30th day of November instant a map or plan showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply, and the streets and places in, over, or along which it is proposed to place any electric lines or other works, together with a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, will be deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Middlesex, at his office at the Sessions House, Clerkenwell-green, in that county, and with the Clerk of the Vestry of St. Marylebone, at his office at the Court House, Marylebone-lane ; with the Clerk of the Vestry of St. George, Hanover Square, at his office at the Board Room, Mount-street, Grosvenor-square, and also at the office of the Board of Trade, Whitehall-gardens, London, and also at the Parliament Office of the House of Lords, and at the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons.

On or before the 21st day of December next printed copies of the draft Provisional Order will be deposited at the office of the Board of Trade as aforesaid, and on and after that day copies may be obtained at the offices of either of the undersigned and at the office of Mr. Frank Saunders, at 13, Princes-street, Cavendish-square, London, W., on payment of one shilling

(Provisions for the Establishment of a Colonial Register, and for the Registration and Transfer of Shares therein; Alteration and Amendment of Memorandum of Association; Amendment and Extension of Powers, notwithstanding the Acts 25 and 26 Vict., cap. 89, and 30 and 31 Vict., cap. 131.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that an application is intended to be made by the Credit Foncier of Mauritius, Limited, to Parliament in the next session, for leave to bring in a Bill to confer the powers and effect the purposes following or some of them (that is to say):

To authorise and provide for the establishment by the Credit Foncier of Mauritius, Limited, of a Colonial Register of Members in the Island of Mauritius and its dependencies, and for the registration therein of the name of any person who is, or who shall agree to become a member of the Company, and for the entry therein of the transfer of the share or shares or interest held in the Company by any member or his personal representative, notwithstanding the Acts 25 and 26 Vict., cap. 89, and 30 and 31 Vict., cap. 131.

To alter and amend the Memorandum of Association of the Company so far as may be necessary to carry out the objects aforesaid.

To vary or extinguish all rights, powers, and privileges relating in any way to the Company, or conferred by the said Acts or either of them, or the Memorandum of Association, which might impede or interfere with the objects of the Bill, and to confer all such rights, powers, and privileges as may be necessary or expedient for carrying the said objects into effect.

Printed copies of the proposed Bill will be deposited in the Private Bill Office in the House of Commons, on or before the 21st day of December next.
