public and private purposes to and within the following or some of the following parishes, townships, extra-parochial and other places, that is to say: -Leatherhead, Ashtead, Mickleham, Fetcham, Great Bookham, Little Bookham, Stoke D'Abernon, Church Cobham, and Street Cobham, all in the county of Surrey.
