Weston-super-Mare Electric Lighting.

(Application to Board of Trade, under Electric Lighting Act, 1882, for Provisional Order authorising the Local Board of Weston-super-Mare, in the county of Somerset, to supply electricity within the area under their jurisdiction, to purchase lands, construct works, and to levy and receive rates and charges, and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to the Board of Trade by the Local Board of Weston-super-Mare, in the county of Somerset (being the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary district of Weston-super-Mare, and hereinafter referred to as the Local Authority), for a Provisional Order, under the provisions of the Electric Lighting Act, 1882, for the following or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To authorise the Local Authority within the whole or any part of the area under their jurisdiction, from time to time to supply electricity for all or any of the public and private purposes specified in section 3 of the said Act, and to empower the Local Authority to provide such supply at such times and on such terms and conditions as the Order may prescribe.

2. To empower the Local Authority for or in connection with the purposes of such supply to use any lands belonging to or held on lease by them, and to purchase by agreement and take on lease any lands they may require or consider necessary, and to erect, make, and maintain workshops, engine-houses, store-houses, or other buildings for producing, storing, supplying, and distributing electricity, and to manufacture, buy, hire, use, supply and let engines, dynamos, meters, accumulators, electric-machines, wires, tubes, pipes, machinery, apparatus, works, matters, or things of whatever description required to produce, store, supply, and distribute electricity, or to carry into complete and full effect any of the objects and purposes of the proposed Provisional Order.

3. To authorise the Local Authority to demand, take, and recover rates, rents, and charges for a supply of electricity, and to confer exemptions from payment thereof.

4. The following is a general description of the proposed area of supply (that is to say):

The Urban Sanitary District of Weston-super-Mare, being the area under the jurisdiction of the Local Authority.

5. The names of the streets and other places in, over, or along which it is proposed to place any electric lines or other works for the purposes of the Provisional Order, are the whole of the streets and places repairable by the Local Authority within the area of supply.

And notice is hereby further given, that:—

(a) On or before the 30th day of November instant, a copy of this notice as published in the London Gazette, and a published map of the district, on a scale of not less than one inch to a mile, showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply, and the streets and other places in, over, or along which it is proposed to place any electric lines or other works, will be deposited with the Board of Trade, and also, for public inspection, with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Somerset, at his office at Wells, and with the Clerk to the Local Board of Weston-super-Mare, at his office at the Town Hall, Weston-super-Mare; and that

(b) The draft of the proposed Provisional Order will be deposited at the Board of Trade on or before the 21st day of December next, and printed copies of the draft Provisional Order when applied for, and of the Provisional Order when made, can be obtained (at the price of one shilling for each copy) at the respective offices of the undersigned; and that

(c) Every local or other public authority, company, or person desirous of making any representation to the Board of Trade, or of bringing before them any objection respecting the intended application, may do so by letter, addressed to the Board of Trade, marked on the outside of the cover enclosing it, "Electric Lighting Act," within two months from the date of the newspaper containing the first publication of this notice, viz., on or before the 25th day of January next.

Newborough Drainage.

(Incorporation of Commissioners; Powers to Purchase Lands, to make, alter, and repeal Bye-Laws, and impose Penalties, and to Borrow Money; other Powers; Amendment or Repeal of Acts.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by or on behalf of the Newborough Drainage Commissioners (hereinafter called "the Commissioners") acting under and by virtue of the local and personal Act 52 Geo. 3, cap. 143, intituled "An Act for draining, enclosing, and improving the lauds called Borough Fen Common, and the Four Hundred Acre Common, in the county of Northampton, and for forming the same into a parish, to be called Newborough, and for building and endowing a church for such parish," and the local and personal Act 59 Geo. 3, cap. 77, intituled "An Act to amend and enlarge the powers of an Act of His present Majesty, for draining, enclosing, and improving the lands called Borough Fen Common and the Four Hundred Acre Common, in the county of Northampton, and for forming the same into a parish, to be called Newborough, and for building and endowing a church for such parish," for leave to bring in a Bill for the following, or some of the following among other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To make and constitute the Commissioners a body corporate, having perpetual succession and a common seal, and with power to purchase, take, hold, and dispose of lands and other property, and to transfer to and vest in such body corporate all lands, houses, buildings, works, and other property, real and personal, and all
