same upon such lands, and the fee simple and inheritance thereof, and to grant and convey to the Company any lands required for the construction of the intended railway or any part thereof, or any stations, sidings, roads, approaches, works, or conveniences connected therewith, either without payment or other consideration, or for such considerations, pecuniary or otherwise, and upon such terms and conditions as have been or may be agreed upon between any such person and the Company, and to sanction and confirm any agreements which may have been or may be made between any such person and the Company, or any person or persons on their behalf respectively with respect to any of the matters aforesaid.

To enable the Company to levy tolls, rates, and duties upon or in respect of the intended railway and works, and to confer exemptions from the payment of such tolls, rates, and

duties, respectively.
