## SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1883.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 22nd day of December, 1882.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

### Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) ORDER OF 1883.

### Commencement and Duration.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

### Interpretation.

3. In this Order—  
Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area means an Area for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place means a Place for the time being declared by a Local Authority or by the Privy Council to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

### Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

### Movement from England or Wales into Scotland.

5. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of any Local Authority in England or Wales to a farm or premises in Scotland with a licence of the Local

Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority—

- (i.) that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease; and
- (ii.) that there is not, at the time of the granting of the licence, a Foot-and-Mouth Disease-Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease-Infected Place in the district of the Local Authority out of which the animals are to be moved.

### Offences.

6. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 267.)—AUSTRALIA—SOUTH COAST.  
SPENCER GULF—GERMEIN BAY.

(1.) *Leading Lights at Port Pirie Entrance.*

THE Government of South Australia has given notice, that on 16th October, 1882, leading lights would be exhibited (from beacons lately erected) for the guidance of vessels entering Port Pirie.

DIRECTIONS.—Approaching the outer bar buoy (chequered)—bring the upper leading light, fixed red, in line with the lower leading light, fixed white, bearing S.E. by E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E. nearly; this leads close past the outer bar buoy moored about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles westward of Mount Ferguson.

Keep the above-mentioned leading lights in line until opening out the first fixed white light at the entrance to the narrows, which light can be passed at the distance of about one-third of a cable, two other fixed white lights to the southward will then become visible. Pass the second light at the distance of about one-third of a cable, and proceed until passing the bar buoys, when a course can be steered for the inner light, which pass at the distance of a quarter of a cable. These three lights should be left on the starboard hand entering.

The mariner—after passing the inner light—must be guided by the buoys marking the narrow channel, and should proceed with caution.

RIVOLI BAY.

(2.) *Signals at Beachport.*

Also, that on and after 5th October, 1882, a black ball will be hoisted during the day, and a fixed white light exhibited at night, at the mast head of the flagstaff adjacent to the Harbour Master Masters' residence at Beachport, northern side of Rivoli Bay, to denote that steam and sailing vessels must not come to the jetty.

MACDONNELL BAY.

(3.) *Cape Northumberland Lighthouse—  
Telegraph Station.*

Also, that on and after 1st October, 1882, all vessels passing Cape Northumberland Lighthouse during the day, and wishing to be reported, will, on showing their numbers, be telegraphed to Adelaide and Port Adelaide free of expense.

## TASMANIA.

(1.) *Hoyle Spit Buoy—Alteration in Position.*

THE Trinity House, London, has given notice, dated 23rd November, 1882, that the following alteration has been made in the position of Hoyle Spit Buoy, Dee River Entrance:—

The buoy has been moved 4 cables N.W. by W. from its former position, and now lies in  $2\frac{1}{2}$  fathoms at low water spring tides, with the following marks, bearings, and distances:—

Grange Hill Monument in line with Helbre Eye Beacon, E.S.E.

Brynllystin House (on the summit of a hill) open westward of Talacre Mansion, S.S.E.  $\frac{1}{4}$  E.

S.W. Hoyle Buoy, N. by E. Northerly, distant  $\frac{5}{16}$ ths of a mile.

Earwig Buoy, S. by E., distant  $1\frac{2}{16}$  miles.

(2.) *West Hoyle Buoy—Intended Alterations.*

Also, dated 30th November, 1882, that it is intended at an early date, to substitute a 13-foot conical buoy for the present West Hoyle Buoy, and to move it  $1\frac{9}{16}$ ths miles N.W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. from its present position, where it will serve as a Fairway Buoy for Chester Bar, and mark the Spit of West Hoyle Sand.

Also, that it is intended to place a buoy of a more distinctive character on Chester Bar.

*Crow Harbour—Fixed Light on Rook Island.*

THE Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice that on 25th November, 1882, a light would be exhibited from a lighthouse erected on the middle of Rook (Rock or Harbour) Island, at the entrance of Crow Harbour:—

*Telegraph Cable between Lipari and Salina Islands.*

THE Italian Government has published the following information concerning a telegraph cable laid between Lipari and Salina Islands:—

The terminus of the cable at Lipari Island is on the north coast, about midway between Acqua Calda and the Grotto delle Mosche; it is thence laid in a N.  $11\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  W. direction for a distance of about 875 yards, then trending towards Salina Island.

The terminus of the cable at Salina Island is on the east coast, about midway between Pozzo d'Agnello and Santa Marina Church; it is thence laid in a S.  $37\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$  E. direction for a distance of about 1,150 yards, then trending S.  $50\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$  E. towards Lipari Island.

Approximate positions of the termini:—

Lipari Island, latitude  $38^{\circ} 31' 10''$  N., longitude  $14^{\circ} 56' 5''$  E.

Salina Island, latitude  $38^{\circ} 33' 15''$  N., longitude  $14^{\circ} 52' 00''$  E.

Mariners are cautioned not to anchor in the vicinity of these submarine cables.

(No. 272.)—CHINA—EAST COAST.

HU-I-TAU BAY.

(1.) *Occulting Light on Dodd Island.*

THE Chinese Government has given notice, that on 18th October, 1882, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse lately erected on Dodd Island, southern side of entrance to Hu-i-tau Bay.

The light is an occulting light, showing alternately for twenty-six seconds, and suddenly eclipsed for four seconds, elevated 147 feet above the sea, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 18 miles. The light shows white seaward between the bearings of S.  $51^\circ$  W. and N.  $62^\circ$  E.; red between N.  $62^\circ$  E. and N.  $74^\circ$  E.; white inshore between N.  $74^\circ$  E. and S.  $31^\circ$  W.; and red from S.  $31^\circ$  W. to S.  $51^\circ$  W. The sectors of red light are intended to warn vessels when they approach the land.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the first order.

The lighthouse consists of a circular tower, constructed of brick with stone dressings, 50 feet high, with a total height from base to vane of 79 feet.

The tower and dwellings are painted white.

Position approximate, lat.  $24^\circ 26' 15''$  N., long.  $118^\circ 29' 10''$  E.

LIAU-TUNG GULF.

(2.) *Buoys at Liau River Entrance.*

Also, dated 11th October, 1882, that Liau (Liao) River Entrance is now marked by the undermentioned buoys:—

Entrance Buoy.—A conical buoy, coloured black, surmounted by a black frustum cage, moored on the western edge of the bar.

Middle Ground Buoy.—A nun buoy, coloured red, surmounted by a black spherical case, moored on the western edge of the middle ground.

Inner Bar Buoy.—A conical buoy, coloured black, surmounted by a black diamond-shaped cage, moored on the south-eastern edge of west bank.
