

limits of the new parish (formerly a district chapelry) of the Holy Trinity, Gainsborough, in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln.

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint John the Divine situate within the limits of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Gainsborough as aforesaid.

"Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Christopher Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Gainsborough which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint John the Divine situate within the limits of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Gainsborough as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint John the Divine, Gainsborough.'

"And with the like consent of the said Christopher Bishop of the said diocese of Lincoln (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials, should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint John the Divine situate within the limits of the new parish of the Holy Trinity, Gainsborough as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The District Chapelry of Saint John the Divine Gainsborough being:—

"All that part of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Gainsborough in the county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln which is bounded on the north for the most part by an imaginary line commencing upon the county boundary dividing the parish of Bole with Saundby in the county of Nottingham and in the said diocese of Lincoln from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Gainsborough aforesaid at a point in the middle of the River Trent opposite to the western end of Brewery Corner Passage which leads from the river bank into Bridge-street and extending thence that is from the said county boundary eastward to and along the middle of the said Brewery Corner Passage for a distance of eighty-three yards or thereabouts to its junction with Bridge-street aforesaid and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of nine yards or thereabouts to its junction with the roadway called or known as Nottingham-place and extending thence east-

ward along the middle of the said roadway for a distance of one hundred and seven yards or thereabouts to its eastern extremity where it joins a certain occupation-road leading from Bridge-road and extending thence northward along the middle of the said occupation-road for a distance of ten yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed 'G. S. J. D. C. 1882 No. 1' and placed on the eastern side of the same occupation-road at the western end of a certain wall which extends across in a straight line to Trinity-street and extending thence eastward to the said boundary-stone and along the said wall for a distance of one hundred and three yards or thereabouts to its eastern end upon the western side of Trinity-street aforesaid at or near to its junction with Queen-street and extending thence first north-eastward across the said Trinity-street and then eastward along the middle of Queen-street aforesaid for a distance of one hundred and seventy yards or thereabouts to the junction of the last-named street with Sandsfield-lane and extending thence southward along the middle of the last-named lane for a distance of fifty-three yards or thereabouts to a point opposite to a boundary-stone inscribed 'G. St. J. D. C. 1882, No. 2' and placed on the western side of the line of the Manchester Sheffield and Lincolnshire Railway at or near to the northern end of the level crossing by which the last-named lane crosses the said line of railway and extending thence in a direction due eastward and in a straight line for a distance of five hundred and seventy-three yards or thereabouts to a boundary-stone inscribed 'G. St. J. D. C. 1882 No. 3' and placed on the western side of Middlefield-lane at a point distant seven hundred and seventeen yards or thereabouts to the north of its junction with Heapham-road and extending thence that is to say from the last-mentioned boundary-stone first eastward to and then southward along the middle of the said Middlefield-lane for the said distance of seven hundred and seventeen yards or thereabouts to its junction with Heapham-road aforesaid and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of one thousand three hundred and eighty yards or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same road with Upton-road which boundary divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Gainsborough from the parish of Gainsborough in the said county of Lincoln and in the diocese of Lincoln aforesaid all which said hereinbefore described part of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Gainsborough aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than the most part of the north as aforesaid that is to say upon the remaining part of the north upon the east upon the south and upon the west as follows:—upon the remaining part of the north by the parish of Gainsborough aforesaid upon the east by the parish of Corringham in the last-named county and diocese on the south by the parish of Lea in the same county and diocese and upon the west by the parish of Bole with Saundby aforesaid or in other words by the county boundary in the middle of the River Trent aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and
