

KNIGHT'S HILL, Lower Norwood.	Six Carriages. Commencing opposite the Jews' Hospital, and extending along the West side of Knight's Hill, opposite the Lower Norwood Railway Station.
LONDON ROAD, Streatham Hill.	Eight Carriages. Situate upon the East side of London Road, near Mr. Treadwell's premises, and nearly opposite Streatham Hill Railway Station; horses' heads southward.
LOUGHBORO' ROAD, Brixton.	Eight Carriages. In the centre of Loughboro' Road, commencing at Railway Bridge, Loughboro' Junction, and extending towards Millbrook Road; horses' heads southward.
FRANKFORT TERRACE, Harrow Road.	Ten Carriages. In Frankfort Terrace, Harrow Road, to commence near the lamp at West end of water trough, and extend westwards along the kerb as far as necessary; horses' heads facing eastwards.

#### TWELVE STANDINGS CANCELLED.

NOTHUMBERLAND AVENUE ...	Eighteen Carriages. In the centre of Northumberland Avenue, parish of Saint Martin-in-the-Fields, commencing six yards South of entrance to the Grand Hotel, keeping clear of all crossings; horses' heads northwards.
KING STREET, Greenwich.	Five Carriages. Situate in King Street, in the parish of Greenwich, in the county of Kent.
TRAFALGAR ROAD, Greenwich.	Three Carriages. Situate at Trafalgar Road, in the parish of Greenwich (East), in the county of Kent.
CHURCH STREET, Greenwich.	Four Carriages. Situate at Church Street (near the Mitre Public House), Greenwich, Kent.
CHRISTOPHER WALK, Greenwich.	Four Carriages. Situate at Christopher Walk, in the parish of Greenwich, in the county of Kent.
LEE ROAD, Lee Green.	Six Carriages. On the west side of Lee Road, Lee Green, in the county of Kent.
BOUNDARY ROAD, Abbey Road.	Three Carriages. Commencing at Lamp Post nearest to Boundary Road extending along kerb on east side of Abbey Road, keeping clear of water post; horses' heads towards Boundary Road.
CHURCH LANE, Kensington.	Three Carriages. In Church Lane, Kensington, on the East Side, to commence at No. 2, Bedford-terrace, Silver-street, and extend along the kerb-stone northward as far as necessary for three hackney carriages to stand.
CLARENCE STREET, Kingston.	Four Carriages. Commencing at the boundary of the Crown and Thistle Public House, and extending along Clarence-street, Kingston, a sufficient distance for four carriages.
LONDON ROAD, Streatham Hill.	Two Carriages. Situate upon the West side of the London Road, near Mr. Treadwell's premises and nearly opposite Streatham Hill Railway Station.
KNIGHTS HILL, Lower Norwood.	Three Carriages. Commencing opposite the Jews' Hospital, and extending along the west side of Knights' Hill, opposite the Lower Norwood Railway Station.
CARLTON TERRACE, Harrow Road.	Six Carriages. In Carlton Terrace, Harrow Road, to commence forty feet from Harrow Road, and extend along the Terrace in a line with the pavement opposite the Prince of Wales Public House to within six feet of the kerb-stone to Woodruff Nursery.
