This reef was reported by the schooner "Beaver" in the year 1864, to be in lat. $32^{\circ} 6' S.$, long. $114^{\circ} 37' E.$, and subsequently reported by the schooner "Gift" in 1869 (about 11 miles west of that position), to break heavily, and to extend about half a mile in a north and south direction, with depths of 15 to 18 fathoms at the distance of a quarter mile from the southern end.

During this further examination by the "Meda," extending over a period of eleven days, soundings with no bottom at 360 fathoms and no bottom at 300 fathoms were obtained at the positions given, and no bottom at 850 fathoms about midway between.

This unsuccessful search, combined with similar results from four examinations previously made in the "Meda," the whole covering the area included between lat. 32° S. and 32° 20' S., and long. 114° E. and 115° E., is considered to establish the non-existence of the reported Beaver Reef—it has therefore been removed from the Admiralty Charts.
