Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 2 ORDER OF 1883.

Commencement and Duration.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the twenty-eighth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area means an Area for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place means a Place for the time being declared by a Local Authority or by the Privy Council to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Movement from England or Wales into Scotland.

5. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of any Local Authority in England or Wales to a farm or premises in Scotland with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority—

(i.) that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease; and

(ii.) that there is not, at the time of the granting of the licence, a Foot-and-Mouth Disease

Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place in the district of the Local Authority out of which the animals are to be moved.

Offences.

6. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

1883.—ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH.

No. 1.

The Minister of the Interior in view of the Law of March 20, 1865, Cap. C, having ascertained

officially that the cholera has entirely ceased in the Hedjaz, and that in Hindostan only a few cases still occur in the city of Calcutta, and those not of an epidemic nature, and that the sanitary conditions of Egypt remain entirely satisfactory, decrees :—

ART. 1. The Ordinances Nos. 6, 7, 10, and 11, of September, 1882, are revoked from this date for ships coming from Hindostan, with the exception of the port of Calcutta and its neighbourhood, from the Hedjaz and the Arabian coast of the Red Sea and other Egyptian shores, provided that they have clean bills of health, have had no aggravating circumstances during the voyage, and that it be recognised by medical inspection that the sanitary conditions of the persons on board at the moment of arrival is perfect.

ART. 2. Ships arriving from the port of Calcutta and neighbourhood will be subjected to the terms of Ordinances Nos. 6 and 10 of 2nd September and 24th October, 1882, according to the conditions in which they are found to be on arrival, until further notice.

ART. 3. Until further notice the importation into Italy of rags, unwashed old clothes, &c., from the Hindostan coast, the Arabian ports on the Red Sea and the ports of Egypt.

ART. 4. From this date ships from Malta in good sanitary condition are exempted from medical inspection.

(1.) *Winga Islet—Signals concerning Light-Vessels.*

6. Three balls, placed vertically, on the southern yard arm, near the mast, signifies that the light-vessels of Flint Channel have been obliged to leave their stations on account of ice.

The balls are white, and the cones are white with black horizontal band.

BALTIC ENTRANCE.

SCHLESWIG HOLSTEIN—ECKERNFÖRDE BAY.

(2.) *Intended Leading Lights southward of Eckernförde.*

The German Government has given notice, that it is intended, probably on 1st February, 1883, to exhibit two leading lights southward of Eckernförde, western side of Eckernförde Bay.
