**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 24th day of January, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Lilborne, in the county of Northampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the boundary of the parish of Swinford on the north, the road leading from Lilborne to Yelvertoft on the south, the boundary of the parish of Clay Coton on the east, and the extreme boundary of the farm in the occupation of J. C. Cattle on the west,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fourth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) at Grendon, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Orton brook from the Bridge in the Grendon and Warton-lane to the Green-lane, thence the Green-lane to the Orton and Warton-road, thence the Orton and Warton-road to the Grendon and Warton-lane, and thence the Grendon and Warton-lane to the Bridge over the Orton brook afore-said, and (2.) at Grendon, near Athers-one, in the county of Warwick, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Walling Street-road from Grendon-road corner to where it meets Whillington-lane at the top of Archers Hill, Whillington-lane to the London and North-Western Railway, the London and North-Western Railway to the Bridge over Grendon-road, and Grendon-road to Watling Street-road aforesaid,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the twenty-third and twenty-eighth days of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order,

cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.
