WE, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and eleven, sections five and eleven, do hereby, subject as hereinafter mentioned, grant to the Incumbent of the vicarage of Saint Paul, Tottenham, in the county of Middlesex, and in the diocese of London, and to his successors, Incumbents of the same vicarage, one yearly sum or stipend of twenty-two pounds, such yearly sum or stipend to be payable out of the common fund under our control, and to be calculated as from the first day of May, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, and to be receivable in equal half-yearly portions, on the first day of May and on the first day of November in each and every year: And we do also hereby grant and appropriate out of our said common fund to the said vicarage of Saint Paul, Tottenham, one capital sum of five hundred and ninety-six pounds nineteen shillings and ten pence, such capital sum to be applied by us in discharging the amount payable to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne for the augmentation and maintenance of the Poor Clergy, under three subsisting mortgages of the said vicarage, which were effected by certain deeds, bearing date respectively the sixteenth February, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the eighth July, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the fifteenth November, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-nine, for the several purposes of (1) building a parsonage house for the said vicarage (2) of erecting a boundary wall for the protection of such house, and (3) of purchasing a piece of land adjacent to the said parsonage house: Provided always, that if at any time lands, tithes, or other hereditaments sufficient, in our opinion, to produce the said yearly sum or stipend of twenty-two pounds, or any part thereof, shall be annexed by us to the said vicarage, in substitution for such yearly sum or stipend, or for such part thereof, our liability for the payment of such yearly sum or stipend, or of such part thereof, as the case may be, shall thereupon and thereafter cease and determine.
