Newington (Surrey) Electric Lighting.
(License; Supply of Electric Lighting by the Vestry of the parish of St. Mary, Newington, within the said parish, and Construction of Works for Manufacture and Supply of Electricity; Acquisition of Lands, &c.; Manufacture and Storage of Electricity; Supply of Electricity and Electrical Apparatus; Power to agree with any Company or person in relation to the Supply; Acquisition of Patent Rights, &c.; Capital; Breaking up, and other Interference with Streets, &c.; Levying of Rates and Charges; the Making of Bye-laws, and other Purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Vestry of the parish of St. Mary, Newington, in the county of Surrey (hereinafter called "the Vestry,") have applied to the Board of Trade for a license under "The Electric Lighting Act, 1882," for the following or some of the following powers and purposes, that is to say:

1. To authorize the Vestry to supply, sell, and distribute electricity for all or any purposes, including public and private purposes, as defined by the Electric Lighting Act, and on such terms and conditions, and for such price or respective prices, as are specified in the license, within the following area (which is in this notice referred to as "the Area of Supply,") that is to say: The parish of St. Mary, Newington, in the county of Surrey.

2. To authorize the Vestry to purchase, acquire, hold, and use lands, houses, and other property for the purposes aforesaid, or any of them, and thereon, and on any lands, houses, and other property belonging to them, to erect, maintain, and use works for the production, storage, supply, and distribution of electricity, and from time to time to sell and dispose of such lands, houses, and buildings, and other property and things, or any of them or any part thereof.

3. The works so proposed to be constructed, erected, made, and maintained, are as follows:—

One or more stations and buildings for producing electricity containing engines, electric machines, batteries, apparatus, materials, pipes,

wires, and all other appliances used for or in connection with the purposes of the undertaking; and the Vestry propose to lay down and maintain in the streets and other public places of the parish pipes, wires, mains, boxes, meters, and all other appliances, necessary for the due and safe distribution and control of electricity, and otherwise, for all the purposes of the undertaking.

4. To authorize the Vestry to place, erect, lay down, and maintain mains, pipes, posts, wires, cables, electric lines, conductors, and other means and apparatus for conveying, transmitting, or distributing electricity (in this notice called "electric lines") in, through, under, over, beneath, along, or across, and to cross, open, or break up, divert, alter, stop up, or otherwise interfere with, whether temporarily or permanently, all roads, highways, streets, lanes, alleys, courts, squares, passages, thoroughfares, and footways (other than those not repairable by the Vestry), sewers, drains, gas, water, and other pipes, telegraphic and telephonic and electric posts, wires, and pipes, pneumatic tubes, apparatus, and works of every description within the area of supply.

5. To authorize the Vestry to acquire, exercise, and use, and from time to time to sell and dispose of, patent rights and licenses connected with the production, manufacture, storage, supply, and use of electricity.

6. To enable the Vestry to enter into contracts or agreements with any company or person for or in relation to the supply of electricity within the area of supply, or the erection and laying down of works, plant, machinery, mains, pipes, wires, engines, and apparatus for that purpose.

7. To authorize the Vestry to manufacture, purchase, hire, sell, and let engines, meters, burners, lamps, pipes, and other machinery, apparatus, and appliances for producing, supplying, and using electricity.

8. To authorize the Vestry to levy and recover rents, rates, and charges for and in respect of the electricity supplied by them, and the sale and hire of engines, meters, burners, lamps, pipes, and other machinery, apparatus, and appliances.

9. To authorize the Vestry to borrow money for the purpose of the undertaking, in accordance with the provisions of the Electric Lighting Act, 1882.

10. To empower the Vestry from time to time to make, alter, and rescind regulations and bye-laws for or relating to the use, misuse, or waste of electricity, and the protection of the public from personal injury, or from fire, or otherwise, and the prevention of fire, and to impose and recover penalties for the breach of any such regulations or bye-laws.

11. The names and addresses of the applicants for the license are the Vestry of the parish of St. Mary, Newington, in the county of Surrey, at their Vestry-hall, in the Walworth-road, in the county of Surrey.

A map or plan, showing the boundaries of the proposed area of supply, and the streets and other places in, over, or along which it is proposed to place any electric lines or other works, has been deposited for public inspection with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Surrey, at his office, at the Sessions House, Newington, in the same county, and also at the office of the Board of Trade, Whitehall-gardens, London.

Printed copies of the draft license have been deposited at the office of the Board of Trade as aforesaid, and copies may be obtained at the offices of either of the undersigned on payment of one shilling for each copy; and when the license shall have been granted by the Board of Trade, printed
