REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S DRAWING ROOM AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Ladies who propose to attend Her Majesty's Drawing Room, at Buckingham Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in Attendance, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to The Queen.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Lady who proposes to be presented to The Queen must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Drawing Room, a card with her name written thereon, and with the name of the Lady by whom she is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations, that no presentation can be made at a Drawing Room excepting by a Lady actually attending that Court, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Lady who is to make the presentation, of her intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command, that no presentations shall be made at the Drawing Room, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to The Queen.

It is not expected that Gentlemen will present themselves at the Drawing Room, except in attendance on the Ladies of their families.

Any Gentleman who under these circumstances should desire to be presented to The Queen, will observe the same regulations as are in force for Her Majesty's Levees.

Board of Trade, Whitehall Gardens, March 9, 1883.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Decree of the Belgian Government suppressing,

from the 1st of January of the present year, the optional duties of 10 per cent. ad valorem on scented and toilet waters prepared with alcohol, imported in receptacles holding half-a-litre or less, and of 5 francs per 100 kilos. on skins of sheep or goats tanned with the hair. These articles will, in future, pay the rate specified in the general tariff. The alcoholic limit for wine above which a supplementary duty for the excess of alcohol is levied is definitively reduced from 21 per cent. to 18 per cent.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a notice issued by the Portuguese Government declaring the following ports free from cholera morbus, viz.: the ports of the Island of Jolo, Zamboanga, and Iloilo since the 1st January last, those of Sumatra since the 5th February last, those of Brownsville, Matamoras, Pensacola, and others of the Gulf of Mexico since the 14th February, and those of Djeddah and the Hedjaz since the 5th February last. The port of Dakar is also declared free from yellow fever since 2nd January last.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament made and passed in the session of Parliament holden in the 7th and 8th years of the reign of Her present Majesty intituled "An Act to amend the Law respecting the office of County Coroner," it was, amongst other things enacted, that when and as often as it should seem expedient to the Justices of any county that such county should be divided into two or more districts for the purposes of that Act, or that any alteration should be made of any division theretofore made under that Act, it should be lawful for the said Justices in General or Quarter Sessions assembled to resolve that a petition should be presented to Her Majesty praying that such division or alteration be made and thereupon to adjourn the further consideration of such petition until notice thereof should be given to the Coroner or Coroners of such county as thereafter provided.

And whereas it was by the same Act also enacted that the Clerk of the Peace should give notice of any such resolution to every Coroner for such county and of the time when the petition would be taken by the said Justices into consideration, and the Justices should confer with every such Coroner who should attend the meeting of the Justices for that purpose, touching such petition, having due regard to the size and nature of each proposed district, the number of the inhabitants, the nature of their employments and such other circumstances as should appear to the Justices fit to be considered in carrying into execution the provisions of that Act, and such petition with a description of the several proposed districts and of the boundaries thereof, with the reasons upon which the petition is founded should be certified to Her Majesty under the hands and seals of two or more of the Justices present when such petition should be agreed to, and the Clerk of the Peace for such county should forthwith give or send a true copy of such petition certified under his hand to every Coroner for such county.

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And whereas it was by the same Act also enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, if she should think fit, with the advice of Her Privy Council after taking into consideration any such petition and also any petition which might be presented to Her by any Coroner of the same county concerning any such proposed division or alteration, to order that such county should be divided into such and so many districts for the purposes of that Act as to Her Majesty with the advice aforesaid should seem expedient, and to give a name to each of such districts, and to determine at what place within each district the Court for the election of Coroner for such district should be holden as thereafter provided and every such Order should be published in the London Gazette.

And whereas a petition has been presented to Her Majesty by the Justices for the county of Surrey, which petition sets forth—

"That under the provisions of the Act of Parliament of the 7th and 8th years of Your Majesty's reign, cap. 29, intituled 'An Act to amend the Law respecting the Office of County Coroners,' the county of Surrey (exclusive of the boroughs of Southwark and Guildford, and the Duchy of Lancaster) is divided into two districts for the purposes of holding inquests. That such districts are called the Eastern and the Western, and that the number of inquests held yearly in the Eastern District has averaged 693 and in the Western District 342, and that every five years the number of inquests in both districts is found to have largely increased.

"That the large number of inquests in the Eastern District, at some of which lengthened enquiries are necessary, are found to make it impossible for one Coroner to hold them within a reasonable period, and repeated complaints have been made to us respecting the delays which occur as being detrimental to the health of those living in houses where bodies may be in an advanced state of decomposition and such delays are also most distressing to the relatives and friends of the deceased.

"That the Western District is very extensive, and the want of easy means of communication by railway between different points of this district frequently renders it impracticable to appoint inquests at places remote from each other for the same day: that serious and frequent complaints are made of great delays in holding inquests, both to us and to Your Majesty's Lord High Chancellor, who has twice held formal enquiries respecting such delays.

Isle of Man to Wit.

By the Lieutenant-Governor.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of "The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of any two members of the Council, by an Order, in writing, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals, for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction of any infectious or contagious disease among the cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals in this Isle.

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called the foot-and-mouth disease extensively prevails amongst animals in places beyond this Isle.

And whereas by Order, dated the 20th day of February instant, in order to prevent the introduction of the said disease amongst animals in this Isle, the importation of certain animals was prohibited for twelve days, and it is deemed advisable to extend the time of such prohibition.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do, therefore, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of the powers given by the said Act,

Hereby order:—

That until the 31st day of March next no bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, sheep, or swine shall be imported into this Isle.
