The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Her Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter fifty-five, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a representation, bearing date the fifteenth day of February, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words following; that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the fifty-ninth year of His Majesty King George the Third, chapter one hundred and thirty-four; of the Act of the second and third years of Your Majesty, chapter forty-nine; of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty, chapter sixty; and of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty, chapter fifty-five, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following representation as to the assignment of a district chapelry to the consecrated church of Saint Luke situate at Southport within the limits of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Southport in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool.

“Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Luke situate at Southport as aforesaid.

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Southport which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Luke situate at Southport as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Luke Southport.’

“And with the like consent of the said John Charles Bishop of the said diocese of Liverpool (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Luke situate at Southport as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

“We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

“The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“The District Chapelry of Saint Luke, Southport, being:—

“All that part of the new parish of the Holy Trinity Southport in the county of Lancaster and in the diocese of Liverpool which is bounded on the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Christ Church Southport in the said county and diocese from the new parish of the Holy Trinity Southport aforesaid at the point where Kensington-road is intersected by Hall-street, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of twenty-two and a half chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hawkhead-street and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with Manchester-road and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-named road for a distance of seven and a quarter chains or thereabouts to the boundary at the junction of the same road with Alexandra-road which boundary divides the said new parish of the Holy Trinity Southport from the new parish of All Saint's Southport in the county and diocese aforesaid. All which said hereinbefore described part of the new parish of the Holy Trinity South-

port aforesaid is bounded upon the remaining sides other than the north-west as aforesaid that is to say upon the north-east and upon the south-west as follows upon the north-east by the said new parish of All Saints Southport and upon the south-west by the new parish of Christ Church Southport aforesaid."

And whereas the said representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Liverpool.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the eighteenth and nineteenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act further to amend the laws concerning the burial of the dead in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, shall or shall not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas Orders in Council have been made directing the discontinuance of burials in the churchyard hereinafter mentioned from the time specified in such Orders; and whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the time for discontinuing burials in the said churchyard be postponed:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the time for the discontinuance of burials in such churchyard be postponed as follows, viz.:

In the churchyard of Edmonton, Middlesex, to the first day of October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

WHEREAS the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, after giving to the Incumbents and the Churchwardens of the parishes hereinafter mentioned ten days' previous notice of his intention to make such representation, has, under the provisions of an Act passed in the session of Parliament held in the sixteenth and seventeenth years of Her Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws concerning the burial

"of the dead in England beyond the limits of the Metropolis, and to amend the Act concerning the burial of the dead in the Metropolis," made a representation stating that, for the protection of the public health, no new burial-ground should be opened in the undermentioned parishes without the previous consent of one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and that burials should be discontinued therein, with the following modifications, viz.:-

NORTH DARLEY.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of North Darley, in the county of Derby; and also in the old part of the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In such wholly walled graves as are now existing in this part of the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in this part of the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz.: widows and widowers, as can be buried at or below that depth.

(c.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in this part of the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred therein, as can be buried at or below that depth.

BEEFORD.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Beeford, in the county of York; and also in the churchyard after the first September, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

MAIDENHEAD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Congregational Chapel, Maidenhead, in the county of Berks; and in the chapelyard, except as follows:

(a.) In such wholly walled graves as are now existing in the chapelyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the chapelyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred therein, as can be buried at or below that depth:

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the chapelyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz.: widows, widowers, parents and children, as can be buried at or below that depth:

STOKE GOLDING.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Stoke Golding, in the county of Leicester; and in the churchyard, after the thirty-first October, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, except as follows:

(a.) In such wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred therein, as can be buried at or below that depth.

RIPTON-ABBOTTS.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Ripton-Abbotts, in the county of Huntingdon; and also in the churchyard, after the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard, as have never before been buried in, and, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted, as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

HOVE.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Hove, in the county of Sussex; and also in the old part of the churchyard, except as follows, viz.:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in this portion of the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in this portion of the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz.: widows, widowers, parents, and children, as can be buried at or below that depth.

And also in the new part of the churchyard, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in this portion of the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such earthen graves now existing in this portion of the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz.: widows, widowers, parents, children, brothers, and sisters, as can be buried at or below that depth.

STILTON.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Stilton, in the county of Huntingdon; and also in the churchyard, after the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard, as have never before been buried in, and, when opened, are free from water,

burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

RAME.—Forthwith and entirely in the parish church of Rame, in the county of Cornwall; and also in the churchyard, after the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, except as follows:—

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred therein, as can be buried at or below that depth.

MILTON.—Forthwith and entirely in Milton Church, in the county of Stafford; and also in the churchyard, after the thirty-first December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, except as follows:

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed, on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such partly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard, provided that the earth above them can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the relations of those already interred as can be buried at or below that depth:

(c.) In such earthen graves now existing in the churchyard, as can be opened to the depth of five feet without exposing coffins or disturbing human remains, burials may be allowed of so many of the following relations of those already interred therein, viz.:—widows and widowers, as can be buried at or below that depth.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the twenty-seventh day of April next:

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette; and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the churches or chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the parishes affected by such representation, one month before the said twenty-seventh day of April.

At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 13th day of March, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. Each of the Areas described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

(1.) An Area comprising the whole of the parish of Horton, in the county of Buckingham.

(2.) An Area comprising the whole of the lands and fields known as the Ivinghoe Bridge farm, in the parish of Ivinghoe, in the county of Buckingham, in the occupation of Edward Williamson.

(3.) An Area comprising so much of the parish of Wing, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the north westward of the road leading from the village of Wing to Linslade and to the eastward of the road leading from the village of Wing aforesaid to Soulbury.

The limits of the following Areas which are declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the twenty-ninth day of January, and the first and ninth days of February, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—(1.) so much of the borough of Blackburn, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road known as Shear Brow, the road leading from Four-lane Ends northward through Pleckgate, the boundary of the borough between the last-mentioned road and the road known as Whalley New-road, the roads known as Whalley Range, Earle-street, and Wemberley-street; (2.) so much of the borough of Blackburn, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Preston New-road, Revidge-lane, the road from Four-lane Ends through Pleckgate to the borough boundary, and the northerly boundary of the borough; and (3.) the township of Little Harwood, in the borough of Blackburn, in the county of Lancaster,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

The following Areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the parishes and townships of Willsthorpe, Sandiacre, Risley, Draycott, and Church Wilne, Breaston, Sawley, and Long Eaton, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the river Trent Bridge at Sawley along that river passing Trent Lock to the junction of the river Erewash, along the Erewash to Sandiacre Bridge, by the left through Sandiacre village, along the Nottingham and Derby-road through Risley passing Hopwell Park Lodge, by the left along Gipsy-lane, along the Draycott-road, over the Canal Bridge, by the right down the occupation-lane at Nooning Ford, by the left along the river Derwent passing Wilne Mill to Derwent mouth, and thence along the river Trent to Trent Bridge at Sawley aforesaid, and (2.) so much of the parish of Alfreton, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, starting from the Chemical Works on the Canal side at Pye Bridge, by the right along the Canal side to Ironville, thence along the Codnor Park-road to Maltby's Corner (Riddings), by the left along Greenhill-lane to Wolverson's Corner, thence by the right along Greenhill-lane to Lea Brook's Corner, thence to the National Schools (Somercotes), thence by the left down Birchwood-lane, and turning to the right along the footpath leading to the Chemical Works aforesaid,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the eighteenth and twenty-second days of January, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
