**N**OTICE is hereby given, that His Royal Highness The Prince of Wales will, by command of The Queen, hold a Levee at St. James's Palace, on behalf of Her Majesty, on Monday, the 23rd of April next, at two o'clock.

It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

N.B. The Knights of the several Orders are to appear in their Collars, it being a Collar-day.

#### REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

*By Her Majesty's Command,*

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-eighth and thirty-ninth years of Her Majesty's reign intituled "The Militia (Voluntary Enlistment) Act, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five" it is amongst other things enacted that, save as therein otherwise provided, the Militia shall be trained and exercised for not less than twenty-one days, and not more than twenty-eight days, in every year, at such times and at such places in every part of the United Kingdom as Her Majesty may appoint, and also that Her Majesty may from time to time, with the advice of Her Privy Council, order that the period of training and exercise in any year of all or any part of the Militia be extended, but so that the whole period of training and exercise be not more than fifty-six days.

And whereas it is expedient that the training of the 5th Brigade, Scottish Division Royal Artillery [formerly the Forfar and Kincardine Artillery Militia] and the 3rd Brigade, Northern Division Royal Artillery [formerly the Northumberland Artillery Militia] and also that of the Royal Anglesey Engineer Militia, the Hampshire (Submarine Miners) Engineer Militia, and Royal Monmouthshire Engineer Militia, should be extended beyond the period of twenty-eight days, for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three:

Now therefore, Her Majesty, with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to order and direct that the period of training and exercise of the before-specified Regiments and Brigades of Militia shall, for the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, be extended under the provisions of the before-recited Act, from twenty-eight days to the number of days in each case hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

5th Brigade, Scottish Division, Royal Artillery, thirty-four (34) days.

3rd Brigade, Northern Division, Royal Artillery, thirty-four (34) days.

Royal Anglesey Engineer Militia, forty-two (42) days.

Hampshire (Submarine Miners) Engineer Militia, fifty-six (56) days.

Royal Monmouthshire Engineer Militia, forty-one (41) days.

**A**T the Court at *Windsor*, the 19th day of *March*, 1883.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1857," it is enacted that the Conservators of the River Thames shall have power and authority from time to time to make Bye-laws for the regulation, management, and improvement of the River Thames and the navigation thereof, in the manner thereby provided, and to impose penalties not exceeding five pounds for the breach or non-performance of such Bye-laws :

And whereas by the forty-seventh section of the said Act it is enacted that no such Bye-laws shall be in force until the same have been sent to the Lord Chief Justice of the Court of Queen's Bench, the Lord Chief Justice of the Court of Common Pleas, and the Lord Chief Baron of the Court of Exchequer, and shall have been approved by one of them.

And whereas by the thirty-first section of "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1864," it is enacted that from and after the thirty-first day of December, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, section forty-seven of "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1857," shall be repealed, and that Bye-laws made after the commencement of such repeal under the authority of either of the said recited Acts shall not have any force unless and until they are allowed by Order of Her Majesty in Council :

And whereas by the forty-first section of "The Thames Navigation Act, 1866," it is enacted that, from the passing of the said Act, the Conservators of the River Thames shall have the same or the like powers and authorities over and with respect to the Thames and Isis from Staines to Cricklade, as they have by virtue of the Thames Conservancy Acts, 1857 and 1864, over and with respect to the Thames below Staines :

And whereas by the forty-second section of the same Act it is enacted, that the provisions of the said Conservancy Acts of 1857 and 1864 respecting Bye-laws shall extend and apply to Bye-laws for the purposes of the Upper Navigation Acts, or the said "Thames Navigation Act, 1866 :

And whereas by the twelfth section of "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1867," it is enacted that, the said Conservators shall have full power and authority to make such rules, regulations, and Bye-laws as to them may seem necessary for the purpose of regulating the passage of steamers and other vessels and boats on the River Thames on the occasion of any regatta, boat race, public procession, or ship launch, or any other occasion when large crowds may assemble thereon :

And whereas the said Conservators have, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the said recited Acts, made and submitted for the allowance of Her Majesty in Council certain rules and Bye-laws for regulating boat-races in the River Thames above and below Staines, which have been allowed by Orders in Council dated respectively the 11th day of November, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine, and the seventeenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-five :

And whereas it has been deemed expedient by the said Conservators to repeal the said last-mentioned Bye-laws, and to make a new Bye-law in lieu thereof, in the manner set forth in the schedule hereunto annexed :

And whereas the said new Bye-law has been duly published in accordance with the said recited Acts; and it has been made to appear to Her

Majesty that the said new Bye-law is reasonable and proper.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by "The Thames Conservancy Act, 1864," and of every other power enabling Her in that behalf, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to allow the said new Bye-law.

SCHEDULE referred to in the above Order.

1. Bye-law No. 6 of the Bye-laws made by the Conservators of the River Thames on the 14th day of June 1869 and allowed by Her Majesty in Council on the 11th day of November following, and Bye-law No. 6 of the Bye-laws made by the said Conservators and allowed by Her Majesty in Council on the 17th day of March 1875 shall after the following Bye-law shall have been allowed by Her Majesty in Council be and the same are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following Bye-law shall take effect.

2. Any vessel being on the River Thames between Cricklade in the county of Wilts and Yantlet Creek in the county of Kent, on the occasion of any boat-race, regatta, public procession or launch of any vessel or on any other occasion when large crowds assemble thereon shall not pass thereon so as to obstruct impede or interfere with the boat-race regatta procession or launch or endanger the safety of persons assembling on the River or prevent the maintenance of order thereon and the Master of every such vessel on any such occasion as aforesaid shall observe the directions of the officer of the Conservators engaged in superintending the execution of this Bye-law and if any such Master fails in any respect to comply with the requirements of this Bye-law or does anything in contravention thereof he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against this Bye-law and shall for every such offence be liable to a penalty of not exceeding £5.

3. This Bye-law may be cited as the "Bye-law for regulating Boat Races on the River Thames."

SCHEDULE.

(1.) An Area comprising so much of the parish of Chesham, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the eastward of the public-road leading from the town of Chesham to the town of Great Berkhamstead and passing through the hamlet of Ashley Green in the parish of Chesham aforesaid.

(2.) An Area comprising so much of the parish of Burnham (including the hamlet of Cippenham), in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the southward of the main road called the Bath-road.

## (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The limits of the following Area which is declared by Order of Council dated the sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—such part of the parish of Whittlesey, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, as is comprised within an imaginary boundary line commencing at the Gate on the westernmost boundary of that portion of the north bank of the river Nene occupied by John Burdock, thence in a northwardly direction along the westernmost boundary of the farm known as Bank farm occupied by Frederick Watson to the north-westernmost point of such farm, thence eastwardly to the south-west point of Tea Kettle Hall farm occupied by John Hopper, thence northwardly along the westernmost boundary of such last-mentioned farm to Thorney Dike, thence eastwardly along such Dike to a point in such Dike opposite Hurry's or Askew's Cottages, thence southwardly along a private-road of the farm occupied by George Hopper on the north bank, thence along such bank in a westwardly direction to the first-named point including the Driftway and road on the north bank aforesaid,—are hereby extended so as to include the Area described in the Schedule to this Order, and the Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-second day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

An Area comprising such part of the parishes of Whittlesey, and Thorney, in the Liberty of the Isle of Ely, as is comprised within an imaginary boundary line commencing at the Gate on the westernmost boundary of that portion of the north bank of the river Nene occupied by John Burdock, thence in a northwardly direction along the westernmost boundary of the farm known as Bank farm occupied by Frederick Watson to the north-westernmost point of such farm, thence eastwardly to the south-west point of Tea Kettle Hall farm occupied by John Hopper, thence northwardly along the westernmost boundary of such last-mentioned farm to Thorney Dike, thence eastwardly along such Dike to a point in such Dike opposite Hurry's or Askew's Cottages, thence northwardly along Great Knarr Fen Drove to a point therein where it is intersected by Dairy Drove, thence eastwardly along such last-named Drove to Gold Dike, thence southwardly along such Dike to a point in the north bank of the river Nene aforesaid at or near the Cross Guns Public-house, thence along the said bank in a westwardly direction to the first-named point ; including the Driftway and road on the bank aforesaid but excluding Great Knarr Fen and Dairy Drove aforesaid.

1. The Area described in the Schedule to this Order is hereby declared to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

*Short Title.*

1. This Order may be cited as **THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 4 ORDER OF 1883.**

*Commencement and Duration.*

2. This Order shall, except as otherwise expressed, commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three ; and, except as otherwise expressed, shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

*Interpretation.*

3. In this Order—

**Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area** means an Area for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

**Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place** means a Place for the time being declared by a Local Authority or by the Privy Council to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

*Restriction on Movement.*

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

*Exception in favour of Movement from England or Wales into Scotland.*

5. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of any Local Authority in England or Wales to a farm or premises in Scotland with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority—

- (i.) that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease : and
- (ii.) that there is not, at the time of the granting of the licence, a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place in the district of the Local Authority out of which the animals are to be moved.

*Further Exception in favour of Movement from Northumberland or Cumberland or Berwick-upon-Tweed into Scotland.*

6.—(a.) Animals may be moved by land from

a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the county of Northumberland or the county of Cumberland or the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, to a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the county of Berwick or the county of Roxburgh with a licence of the Local Authority of the county into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose) : Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority that the animals to be moved—

- (i.) either have been bred on the farm or premises from which they are to be moved, or have been pastured or fed thereon for a period of at least one month : and
  - (ii.) have not within one month immediately before the granting of the licence been exposed in any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales : and
  - (iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.
- (b.) This Article shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the ninth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three ; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

*Offences.*

7. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

*Short Title.*

1. This Order may be cited as **THE INFECTED DISTRICTS MARKETS AND FAIRS ORDER OF 1883.**

*Commencement.*

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

*Extent.*

3. This Order does not extend to—
- (i.) Foreign animals wharves; and
  - (ii.) Areas for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease (for which Areas provision is made, as regards public and private sales, by The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, and The Foot-and-Mouth Disease No. 2 Order of 1881, Amendment); and
  - (iii.) Areas for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be Areas infected with swine-fever (for which Areas provision is made, as regards public and private sales, by The Swine-Fever Order of 1882); and
  - (iv.) The Metropolis (provision being made for the Metropolis, as regards public and private sales, by The Metropolis (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) No. 2 Order of 1881, and The Metropolis (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) No. 2 Order of 1881, Amendment No. 3).

*Interpretation.*

## 4. In this Order—

Animals means cattle (that is, bulls, cows, oxen, heifers, and calves), and sheep, and swine.

Fat animals means animals intended for slaughter.

Store animals means animals other than fat animals.

Public sale includes a market or fair, and any sale, whether conducted by auction or not, which is open to the public, whether on payment of entrance-money or other payment or not, whether it is held in a public place or not, and whether animals of different owners are exposed thereat or not; and includes also an exhibition.

Private sale means any sale other than a public sale.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area means an Area for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place means a Place for the time being declared by a Local Authority or by the Privy Council to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Expose means expose for sale or in any manner put up or offer for sale, or exhibit at an exhibition.

Farm or premises includes two or more adjoining farms or premises in the same occupation.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

*Public and Private Sales.*

5. No public or private sale of an animal or animals, fat or store, shall be held in the District of any Local Authority in England or Wales or Scotland in which there is a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place except as expressly authorized by this Order.

*Public or Private Sales of Fat or Store Animals by Licence of Local Authority.*

6.—(a.) A public or private sale of animals, fat or store, may be held with a licence of the Local Authority.

(b.) A licence of a Local Authority for a public or private sale of fat or store animals under this Article shall be signed by the clerk of the Local Authority, by special direction of the Local Authority, and shall give notice of the conditions (if any) which the Local Authority may deem it expedient to impose as the conditions on which the licence

is granted, and shall be granted to the person entitled to hold the sale (as owner of a market, or as an auctioneer, or otherwise), and shall specify the place where the sale is to be held, and may authorize the holding of periodical sales on stated days for a time limited, not exceeding one month, but may be renewed from time to time, and shall be published in such manner as the Local Authority consider best fitted to insure publicity for the same.

(c.) If the Privy Council are of opinion, with respect to any licence of a Local Authority for a public or private sale of fat or store animals under this Article, that the holding of the public or private sale thereby licensed is inexpedient, or that the licence is objectionable in any particular, and direct the revocation thereof, the same shall thereupon cease to operate.

*Public or Private Sales of Fat or Store Animals without Licence of Local Authority.*

7. A public or private sale of an animal or animals, fat or store, may be held without a licence of the Local Authority, in any case where the sale is held in accordance with the following conditions (namely):

(i.) That the sale is held on a farm or premises not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place:

(ii.) That no animal on the farm or premises is affected with foot-and-mouth disease:

(iii.) That the animal or each animal exposed at the sale has been on the farm or premises not less than fourteen clear days immediately before the day on which the sale is held.

*Sales by Licence of Privy Council.*

8. Without prejudice to the foregoing provisions and in addition thereto, a public or private sale of an animal or animals, fat or store, may be held in any circumstances, with a licence of the Privy Council.

*Offences.*

9. If a public or private sale of an animal or animals, fat or store, is held in contravention of this Order or of the conditions of a licence of a Local Authority or of the Privy Council thereunder, the person or company holding the sale, and the occupier of the place or farm or premises where the sale is held, and the owner or consignee of each animal exposed thereat, and the person exposing the same thereat, and the auctioneer, if any, or other person conducting the sale, and the person, if any, taking entrance-money or other payment for admission thereto, and the purchaser thereof of any animal, such last-mentioned person or such purchaser knowing the sale to be held in contravention as aforesaid, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
