REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

as if their father had succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Vaux of Harrowden.

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That whenever it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, with respect to his own diocese, and whenever it shall be represented to him by the Bishop of any diocese, or by the Bishops of any two dioceses, that two or more benefices, or that one or more benefice or benefices, and one or more spiritual sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, in his or their diocese or dioceses, being either in the same parish or contiguous to each other, and of which the aggregate population shall not exceed one thousand five hundred persons, and the aggregate yearly value shall not exceed five hundred pounds, may, with advantage to the interests of religion, be united into one benefice, the said Archbishop of the Province shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully made, and will not be of inconvenient extent, and that the patron or patrons of the said benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages respectively, is or are consenting thereto, such consent being signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons, the said Archbishop shall, six weeks before certifying such inquiry and consent to Her Majesty as herein-after directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement in writing of the facts, and in other cases a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church, or in some public and conspicuous place in each of such benefices, sinecure rectories or vicarages, with notice to any person or persons interested, that he, she, or they, may, within such six weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hand or hands, to the said Archbishop, against such union; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the said Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make and issue an Order or Orders for uniting such benefices, sinecure rectory or rectories, vicarage or vicarages, into one benefice, with cure of souls, for ecclesiastical purposes only."

And whereas the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act, hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a certificate in writing, bearing date the fifth day of March, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words following, that is to say:—

"To the QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend William Basil Lord Bishop of St. Davids having represented unto our predecessor the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Archibald Campbell, late Lord Archbishop of Canterbury that the vicarage or benefice of Llandewi Aberarth in the county of Cardigan and diocese of St. Davids and the perpetual curacy or benefice of Saint Albans Tyglyn in the same county and diocese both situate in the same parish of Llandewi Aberarth of which two benefices the aggregate population does not exceed one thousand five hundred persons might with advantage to the interests of religion be united into one benefice the said late Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such inquiry it appeared to the said late Archbishop and it also appears to us that such union might be usefully made and would not be of inconvenient extent and we certify to Your Majesty in Council that the said Lord Bishop of St. Davids being the patron or person entitled to collate to the said vicarage of Llandewi Aberarth if the same were now vacant and also to the said perpetual curacy of Saint Albans Tyglyn the same being now vacant has signified his consent in writing to the union of the said benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes.

"That on the fifteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, the said late Archbishop caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of the parish church of Llandewi Aberarth and on the principal outer door of the church or chapel of Saint Albans Tyglyn with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within six weeks from the day of affixing such notice show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to the said late Archbishop against such union and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of St. Davids the inquiry into the circumstances of the case the statement of circumstances in reply thereto the consent in writing of the patron and the copies of the representation and notice before-mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop do hereby certify the inquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for uniting the said two benefices into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

"As witness our hand this fifth day of March one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order as it is hereby ordered that the vicarage or benefice of Llandewi Aberarth situate in the county of Cardigan and diocese of St. Davids and the per-

petual curacy or benefice of Saint Albans Tyglyn situate in the same county and diocese shall be united into one benefice with cure of souls for ecclesiastical purposes only.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that, "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more benefices which have been heretofore united or which may be hereafter united under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is amongst other things enacted, "That when two or more benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one benefice, and with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the benefices within his diocese, of which such united benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case; and if on such inquiry it shall appear to him that such union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such benefice or benefices, he shall, six weeks at least before certifying such inquiry to Her Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own diocese, a statement, in writing, of the facts, and in all other cases a copy, in writing, of the aforesaid representation to be affixed on or near the principal outer door of the church or in some public and conspicuous place in each of the benefices forming part of the united benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may within such six weeks show cause, in writing, under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such disunion; and if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the inquiry and consent, when the patron's consent is necessary, to Her Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for Her Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned benefice or benefices from such united benefice, and for declaring the rights of patronage of the several patrons, if there be more than one patron, and such Order shall be registered in the registry of the diocese to which such united benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately if such united benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such union shall be ipso facto dissolved, so far only as regards such benefice or benefices so proposed to be separated from such united benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such last-mentioned benefice or benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct benefice or benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such union had taken place, and the patron or patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or

"nominate thereto respectively, and so from time to time upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no benefices which have been united for more than sixty years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the patron or patrons thereof."

"And whereas it was also enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty in Council on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province with the consent of the patron or patrons of such benefices respectively (such consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such patron or patrons) to assign and attach such portion of the glebe lands, tithes, moduses, rent-charges, or other endowments or emoluments belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such united benefice to each of such benefices respectively as to Her Majesty in Council should seem fit, notwithstanding such proportion of glebe land, tithes, rent-charges, moduses or other endowments or emoluments or any part thereof, might not arise or accrue within the limits of the benefice to which the same should be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or might not have belonged thereto and also to divide and apportion between such benefices all such charges and outgoings as before the disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole united benefice.

And whereas on the 5th day of August 1882 Arthur Charles Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells made a representation to the late Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words following:—

"To the Most Reverend Archibald Campbell Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I Arthur Charles Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells do hereby represent to your Grace that it appears to me that the disunion of the united and consolidated vicarages of Woollavington and Puriton in the county of Somerset and my diocese of Bath and Wells by the separation of the said vicarage of Woollavington from the vicarage of Puriton may be made with advantage to the interests of religion.

"Witness my hand this 5th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

Arthur C. Bath and Wells."

And whereas the late Lord Archbishop enquired into the circumstances of the case and it appeared to him on such enquiry, and it has also appeared to the present Lord Archbishop, that the said union might be usefully dissolved.

And whereas the present Lord Archbishop of Canterbury pursuant to the provisions of the said Act hath duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a Certificate in writing bearing date the 5th day of March 1883 in the words following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White, Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, Primate of all England and Metropolitan do hereby certify to your Majesty in Council.

"That the Honourable and Right Reverend Arthur Charles Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells as Bishop of the diocese within which is situate the united benefice consisting of the vicarages of Woollavington and Puriton in the county of Somerset having represented unto our predecessor Archibald Campbell late Archbishop of Canterbury deceased that the disunion of the said united vicarages by the separation of the said vicarage of Woollavington from the said vicarage of Puriton

might be made with advantage to the interests of religion. The said late Archbishop enquired into the circumstances of the case.

"That on such enquiry it appeared to the said late Archbishop and it also appears to us that such union might be usefully dissolved and we certify to Your Majesty in Council, that the Dean and Canons of the King's Free Chapel of Saint George within the Castle of Windsor being the patrons or persons entitled to present to the said united benefice if the same were now vacant have signified their consent in writing to such proposed disunion and that each of the said vicarages shall retain its original endowments and emoluments and that the charges upon the said vicarage of Woollavington of eleven pounds seven shillings and eleven pence for first fruits and one pound two shillings and nine pence halfpenny for yearly tenths and the sum of ten shillings and four pence halfpenny payable yearly to the Archdeacon of Wells for procurations shall continue to be charged exclusively upon that vicarage and that the charge upon the said vicarage of Puriton of eleven shillings payable to the said Archdeacon of Wells for procurations shall be charged exclusively upon the said vicarage of Puriton, the said vicarage of Puriton not being chargeable with any sum for first fruits or yearly tenths.

"That on the twenty-eighth day of September one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two the said late Archbishop caused a copy in writing of the aforesaid representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the principal outer door of each of the parish churches of the said united benefice with notice to any person or persons interested that he she or they might within six weeks from the day of affixing such notice on to the said church doors show cause in writing under his her or their hand or hands to the said late Archbishop against such disunion and no such cause has been shown.

"The representation of the said Lord Bishop of Bath and Wells the enquiry of the said late Archbishop into the circumstances of the case, the reply thereto the consent in writing of the patrons and the copies of the representation and notice before-mentioned are hereunto annexed.

"And we do hereby certify the enquiry and consent aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for separating the said vicarage of Woollavington from the said vicarage of Puriton and for declaring that each of the said vicarages shall retain its original endowments and emoluments and that the charges upon the said vicarage of Woollavington of eleven pounds seven shillings and eleven pence for first fruits and one pound two shillings and nine pence halfpenny for yearly tenths and the sum of ten shillings and four pence halfpenny payable yearly to the Archdeacon of Wells for procurations shall continue to be charged exclusively upon that vicarage and that the charge upon the said vicarage of Puriton of eleven shillings payable yearly to the said Archdeacon of Wells for procurations shall be charged exclusively upon the said vicarage of Puriton the said vicarage of Puriton not being chargeable for any sum for first fruits or yearly tenths.

"As witness our hand this fifth day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three. "Edw. Cantuar."

Now therefore Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said united benefice consisting of the vicarage of Woolla-

vington and the vicarage of Puriton shall be dis-united by separating the said vicarage of Woollavington from the said vicarage of Puriton.

And Her Majesty in Council by and with the advice of Her said Council is pleased, on the recommendation of the said Lord Archbishop with the consent of the patrons of the said benefices, to assign and attach to the said vicarages of Woollavington and Puriton respectively such endowments and emoluments as belonged originally to those benefices. And Her Majesty is also pleased to direct that the charges upon the said vicarage of Woollavington of £11 7s. 11d. for first fruits and £1 2s. 9½d. for yearly tenths and the sum of £0 10s. 4½d. payable yearly to the Archdeacon of Wells for procurations shall continue to be charged exclusively upon that vicarage and that the charge upon the said vicarage of Puriton of £0 11s. 0d. payable yearly to the said Archdeacon of Wells for procurations shall be charged exclusively upon the said vicarage of Puriton; the said vicarage of Puriton not being chargeable for any sum for first fruits or yearly tenths.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 28th day of March, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Harby, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Harby to Stathern on the north, the road leading from Stathern to Eastwell on the east, the road leading from Eastwell to Goatby turn on the south, and the road leading from Goatby turn to Harby on the west,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twentieth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-ninth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

hundred rated householders, and that the whole number of wards shall not exceed eight, and the Metropolitan Board shall apportion among the several wards the number of vestrymen to be elected for such parish, and shall, in assigning the number of vestrymen to each ward, have regard, as far as in their judgment is practicable, as well to the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in each ward, as to the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and the number of vestrymen assigned to each ward shall be a number divisible by three."

And whereas the parish of Streatham is within the limits of the "Metropolis," as defined by the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and is one of the parishes in Part 1 of Schedule B of that Act, and at the passing of the same Act the parish was not divided into wards, and the Vestry of the parish of Streatham having now applied to us, the Metropolitan Board of Works, to divide the said parish into wards, pursuant to the provisions of the said 41st section of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862. And whereas it appears from the last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament, that the said parish contains three thousand two hundred and fifteen rated householders, and that the

number of inhabited houses in the parish is returned at four thousand one hundred and seventy-one, and the rateable annual value of property at one hundred and eighty-five thousand four hundred and thirty pounds. Now, the Metropolitan Board of Works, having considered the said application, and having ascertained from the said last account taken of the population by the authority of Parliament as contained in the Census Return for the year 1881, that the number of rated householders for the parish of Streatham is three thousand two hundred and fifteen, and having taken into consideration the number of persons rated to the relief of the poor in the same parish, and the aggregate amount of the sums at which all such persons are rated, and all the circumstances connected with such application, doth hereby order that the said parish of Streatham be divided into three wards, to be distinguished by the names and numbers mentioned in the first column of the undermentioned Schedule, and that the extent, limits, and boundary lines of such wards shall be those described in the second column of the said Schedule, and that the number of vestrymen to be elected for each of the said wards shall be the number mentioned in the third column of the said Schedule.

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts

in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts;

And whereas by an Order dated the 9th day of October, 1879, the Local Government Board certified the appointment of the said Joseph Holt Skinner as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should in future act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until the said Board should otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and that such District should be termed "The North Yorkshire Audit District";

- “(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within the said Audit District.
- “(4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.”

And whereas by an Order dated the 1st day of March, 1880, the Local Government Board directed that it should be the duty of the said Joseph Holt Skinner to audit the Accounts of the Highway Boards, and of their Officers, mentioned in such Order;

And whereas the South Stockton Local Board is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District of the said Local Board is partly situated within the said Audit District:
