

And whereas it is prescribed by Article 2 of the said Order that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Guardians and the Overseers specified in Nos. (1) and (2) of that Article, as well as the Accounts of the other Authorities (and of their Officers) referred to in Nos. (3) and (4) in the following terms:—

- “(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within the said Audit District.
- “(4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe.”

And whereas by an Order dated the 1st day of March, 1880, the Local Government Board directed that it should be the duty of the said Joseph Holt Skinner to audit the Accounts of the Highway Boards, and of their Officers, mentioned in such Order;

And whereas the South Stockton Local Board is an Authority whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District of the said Local Board is partly situated within the said Audit District:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until We otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Joseph Holt Skinner to audit the Accounts of the said Local Board, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article 3 of the first above cited Order; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District of the said Local Board shall be deemed to be within the said North Yorkshire Audit District.

TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. The rates of postage and additional sum for registration now chargeable and payable by the authority of the Treasury Warrant of the 13th day of December, 1882, or the schedules thereunder written on reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to Norway, to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of such last-mentioned Warrant of the 13th day of December, 1882, and all regulations and conditions as to the posting, forwarding, conveyance, and delivery of reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance

by post now in force and applicable thereto shall extend and apply to all reply post cards conveyed or delivered for conveyance by post from or to Sweden to or from any other country or place affected by the provisions of such last-mentioned Warrant of the 13th day of December, 1882, in the same way as if Sweden had been named in such last-mentioned Warrant of the 13th day of December, 1882, or the schedules thereunder written.

2. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of April, 1883.
