And whereas on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fairs should be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fairs which have been annually held in the parish of Barkway on the 20th and 21st days of July (unless and except the 20th July fell on a Sunday, in which case the Fair was held on the two next following days), and in the hamlet of Nuthampstead, in the said parish, on the Thursday next before the 24th June, and three following days, respectively, within the said division of the said county, shall be abolished as from the date of this Order.
