(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 2nd day of May, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—in Southwell, in the county of Nottingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the White Lion Inn up the Town-street of Easthorpe to Lovers-lane on the south, then up Lovers-lane to Potwell Dyke and from thence along Potwell Dyke to the Bridge on the west, from thence along the highway to Pitchford's Corner on the north, and then along the Town-street to the White Lion Inn on the east,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the fourth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
