REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names clearly written thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

#### PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, before twelve o'clock, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be very distinctly written upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by section 5 of the Merchant Seamen (Payment of Wages and Rating) Act, 1880, it is provided that where a ship is about to arrive, is arriving, or has arrived at the end of her voyage, every person, not being in Her Majesty's Service, or not being duly authorized by law for the purpose, who—

(a) Goes on board the ship without the permission of the master, before the seamen lawfully leave the ship at the end of their engagement, or are discharged (whichever

last happens), or

(b) Being on board the ship, remains there after being warned to leave by the master, or by a police officer, or by any officer of the Board of Trade, or of the Customs,

shall for every such offence be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty pounds, or, at the discretion of the Court to imprisonment for any term not exceeding six months, and the master of the ship or any officer of the Board of Trade may take him into custody, and deliver him up forthwith to a constable, to be taken before a Court or Magistrate capable of taking cognizance of the offence, and dealt with according to law.

And whereas by section 6 of the said Act it is further provided that whenever it is made to

appear to Her Majesty-

(1.) That the Government of any foreign country has provided that unauthorized persons going on board of British ships which are about to arrive or have arrived within its territorial jurisdiction shall be subject to provisions similar to the provisions contained in the last preceding section as applicable to persons going on board British ships at the end of their voyages; and

(2.) That the Government of such foreign country is desirous that the provisions of the said section shall apply to unauthorized persons going on board of ships belonging to

such foreign country within the limits of British territorial jurisdiction:

Her Majesty may by Order in Council declare that the provisions of the said last preceding section shall apply to the ships of such country; and thereupon so long as the Order remains in force those provisions shall apply and have effect as if the ships of such country were British ships arriving, about to arrive, or which had arrived at the end of their voyage.

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the Government of the United States of America has provided as aforesaid, and is desirous that the provisions of the said fifth section shall apply to unauthorized persons going on board of American ships within the limits of

British territorial jurisdiction.

Now therefore Her Majesty by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said recited Act, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to declare that the provisions of the said recited 5th section of the "Merchant Seamen (Payment of Wages and Rating) Act, 1880," shall apply to American ships. The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council:

WHEREAS by the Merchant Shipping Act 1873 (section twenty-nine) it is enacted (among other things) to the effect that where in accordance with the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts Her Majesty exercises jurisdiction within any port out of Her Majesty's dominions it shall be lawful for Her Majesty by Order in Council to declare such port a port of registry, therein referred to as a foreign port of registry, and by the same or any subsequent Order in Council to declare the description of persons who are to be the Registrars of British ships at such foreign port of registry and to make regulations with respect to the registry of British ships thereat.

And whereas in accordance with the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts Her Majesty exercises jurisdiction within the port of Shanghai in China.

And whereas by virtue of the power aforesaid Her Majesty was pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council by the China and Japan Maritime Order in Council 1874 to declare and order (among other things) that the port of Shanghai should be a port of registry and to provide for the appointment of a Registrar there and for other purposes connected therewith:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that it is expedient to amend the said Order in Council with respect to the mode of appointment of the Registrar and in other

respects.

Now therefore Her Majesty by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Merchant Shipping Act 1873 and the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1813 to 1878 or otherwise in Her vested is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council to order and declare and it is hereby ordered and declared as follows:

1. Articles five, seven, and eight (relating to the appointment and the tenure of office of the Registrar) of the China and Japan Maritime Order in

Council 1874 are hereby repealed.
2. The Registrar of British ships at the port of Shanghai as a foreign port of registry shall be such one of Her Majesty's Consular Officers at Shanghai as one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State from time to time appoints by writing signed by him.

3. The following Articles of the China and Japan Maritime Order in Council 1874 are hereby incorporated with this Order and for the purposes of this Order shall be read as part thereof, namely,—Article two (interpretation)
Article three (application of Order) Article Article twenty-five (publication of Order).

4. This Order may be cited as the Shanghai Shipping Registry Order in Council of 1883 and this Order and the China and Japan Maritime Order in Council 1874 may be cited together as the Shanghai Shipping Council of 1874 and 1883. Registry Orders in

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council. WHEREAS by "The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act, 1855," it was enacted that in any case in which any Lighthouse, buoy, or beacon had been, or should be thereafter erected or placed on or near the coasts of any British Possession by or with the consent of the Legislative Authority of such Possession, Her Majesty might by Order in Council fix such dues in respect thereof, to be paid by the owner or master of every ship which passes the same, or derives benefit therefrom, as Her Majesty might deem reasonable, and might in like manner from time to time increase, diminish, or repeal such dues, and that from the time specified in such Order for the commencement of the dues thereby fixed, increased, or diminished, the same should be leviable throughout Her Majesty's dominions in manner thereinafter men-

And whereas Lighthouses have, by and with the consent of the Legislative Authority of the Colony of Ceylon, been constructed and placed on the Great Basses Rock, and on the Little Basses Rock, in the said Colony, and a light has been exhibited from each of such Lighthouses:

And whereas by an Order in Council dated the 11th day of November, 1869, Her Majesty was pleased to direct that the dues to be paid in respect of ships passing and deriving benefit from the lights exhibited from the said Great Basses Rock and the said Little Basses Rock, as in the said Order in Council appearing, should be one due of one penny halfpenny per ton in respect of both of

the said Lights:

And whereas it is proposed to construct a Lighthouse on the Island of Minicoy between the Maldive and Laccadive Islands, and to exhibit a Light.

And whereas the Legislative Authorities, of India, Ceylon, the Straits Settlements, and Mauritius, have given such consents as are necessary either to the erection of the Lighthouse or to the collection of dues in respect thereof:

And whereas by Section 10 of "The Public Works Loans Act, 1881," the Public Works Loan Commissioners are empowered, in the event of provision being made by Order in Council and otherwise for the levy of Dues in respect of any Lighthouse to be erected on the said Island of Minicoy, to advance a sum or sums not exceeding £20,000, for the purpose of constructing the said Lighthouse:

And whereas by the same section of the said Act provision is made for the application of any dues levied in respect of the said Lighthouse to the fund formed by the dues levied in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses. Lighthouse therein referred to as the Basses Lights Fund, and it is provided that such Fund shall be applicable to the maintenance of the said Great Basses Lighthouse, Little Basses Lighthouse, and Minicoy Lighthouse:

And whereas by the same section of the said Act it is further provided that so long as any money is due to the Public Works Loan Commissioners on account of any Loan under that section, the dues payable in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse, or the Minicoy Lighthouse, shall be altered only with the consent of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury:

And whereas it is expedient that provision should be made for the payment of such of the said dues as may be payable in India, Ceylon, the Straits Settlements, and Mauritius, including the Seychelles Islands, in the currency of the respective countries

in which they are payable:

And whereas the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury have signified their consent to the dues specified in the two Schedules hereto

And whereas the several classes of ships fol-

lowing, that is to say,-

Every ship which in the same voyage by the southward of Ceylon shall cross a line drawn from the southernmost point of Ceylon to the north-westernmost point of the Island of Sumatra, and also a line from the southernmost point of Ceylon to Cape Guardafui on the eastern coast of Africa, and vice versa.

Every ship which in any voyage to or from any place in the Maldive Islands shall cross a line drawn from the southernmost point of Ceylon to the north-westernmost point of Sumatra.

Every ship which in any voyage from any port on the eastern coast of Africa, south of Cape Guardafui, or from any port in Madagascar, Bourbon, Mauritius, or any island adjacent to the same, including the Seychelles and the Chagos Islands, or in any voyage in which such ship shall have rounded the Cape of Good Hope eastward shall cross a line drawn from the southernmost point of Ceylon to the southernmost point of the coast of Tenasserim, and shall, between the 1st day of April and the 30th day of September, both included, arrive at any port situated north of such line.

Every ship which having departed between the ist day of October and the 31st day of

March, both included, from any port situated to the northward of such last-mentioned line, and also to the westward of the ninetieth meridian of longitude east from Greenwich, in any voyage to any port on the eastern coast of Africa south of Cape Guardafui, or to any port in Madagascar, Bourbon, Mauritius, or any island adjacent thereto, including the Seychelles and the Chagos Islands, or in any voyage in which such ship shall round the Cape of Good Hope westward, shall cross the latitude of the Great Basses Lighthouse, or the Little Basses Lighthouse, on the eastward side of the said Lighthouse,

will pass the said Great Basses Lighthouse and the said Little Basses Lighthouse, and will derive

benefit therefrom:

And whereas the several classes of ships fol-

lowing, that is to say :-

Every ship which in any voyage shall or may pass between the Laccadive Islands and the Maldive Islands through the channel known as the Nine Degree Channel, north of Minicoy Island, or through that known as the Eight Degree Channel, south of Minicoy Island

will pass the said Minicoy Lighthouse and will derive benefit therefrom.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers vested in Her by the said recited Acts, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to direct that from and after the date of this Order the dues heretofore levied in respect of the Great Basses Lighthouse and the Little Basses Lighthouse under the said Order of the 11th day of November, 1869, shall cease to be levied, and the dues specified in the Schedule marked A. hereunto annexed shall be levied in lieu thereof:-

And that from and after the date of the first exhibition of a light from the said Minicoy Lighthouse, the dues specified in the Schedule marked B. hereunto annexed shall be levied in respect thereo. C. L. Feel.

#### PRESENT.

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the 333rd section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that, subject to the provisions contained in the fifth part of that Act, it shall be lawful for every Pilotage Authority, by Bye-law made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council from time to time, to do within its districts all or any of certain things in that behalf specified in the said section, and to repeal any Bye-law made in exercise of the powers conferred by such section, and to make a new bye-law or bye-laws in lieu thereof:

And whereas the Trustees of Swansea Harbour, being the Pilotage Authority for the Harbour of Swansea, within the meaning of the said recited Act, have in exercise of the powers vested in them by that Act, and by "The Swansea Harbour Act, 1854," from time to time made, and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty, certain Bye-laws and Regulations which were approved by various Orders in Council:

And whereas the said Trustees have made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty certain new Bye-laws and Regulations:

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the proposed new Bye-laws and Regulations are proper and reasonable:

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the powers vested in Her by the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve, and doth hereby approve, and signify Her consent to the Bye-laws set forth in the Schedule hereto; and doth hereby direct that the same Bye-laws shall come into force from and after the date of this

SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Order refers. The Swansea Harbour Trustees in exercise of the powers and authorities vested in them by the Swansea Harbour Act, 1854, and of every other power and authority them thereunto enabling do hereby order and direct as follows, that is to say,

1. That the 17th item of the Orders, Rules, and Regulations for the government and direction of the Pilots of the Port and Harbour of Swansea and for punishing any breach of such orders rules and regulations and for fixing and determining the rates of pilotage to be paid to the Pilots appointed by the Swansea Harbour Trustees under the powers and provisions of the Swansea Harbour Act, 1854, made on the 13th day of August, 1860, and

T the Court at Windsor, the 22nd day of amended on the 10th day of November, 1863, be repealed.

> 2. That so much of the 18th item of the said orders, rules, and regulations as directs Masters of Vessels under 500 tons register requiring Pilots to take their vessels to the Mumbles Roads, or clear of the Green Grounds, to pay rates in addition to the outward pilotage rates be repealed.

> 3. That in lieu of the said 17th, and part of 18th items so repealed as hereinbefore declared, the following item be substituted; namely,

One half of the above rates only to be paid and payable to every pilot navigating or assisting any vessel (not entering Swansea Harbour) within any part of Swansea Bay or within the limits of the pilotage ground hereinafter mentioned.

N.B.—Within the limits of the pilotage ground of the Swansea Pilots, pilotage is compulsory on all vessels inward bound to Swansea except vessels under 100 Tons register in ballast, and subject to the provisions of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854.

4. That the 19th item of the said orders, rules, and regulations be repealed, and that in lieu thereof, the following item be substituted, namely:-

Every pilot required to remain on board a vessel at anchor, whether inward or outward bound, to be paid by the master of such vessel at the rate of 10s. for every day of 24 hours or part of a day of 24 hours that he so remains on board.

#### PRESENT,

The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and thirteen, of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Her Majesty, chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and four, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Her Majesty, chapter one hundred and twenty-four, duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme, bearing date the fifth day of April, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words following, that is to say :

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England in pursuance of the Act of the third and fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and thirteen of the Act of the sixth and seventh years of Your Majesty chapter thirty-seven, of the Act of the nineteenth and twentieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and four, and of the Act of the twenty-third and twenty-fourth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and twenty-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme for constituting a separate district for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the parish of St. John Bedminster in the suburbs of the city of Bristol and in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of St. John Bedminster which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes in the manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the said parish of Saint John Bedminster have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts or of some or one of them, and we have in respect of such hereditaments and I recommending and proposing any other measures

premises agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act to the minister or incumbent of the said proposed district as soon as one shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, and so soon as the said district shall have become a new parish under the provisions of the lastly mentioned Act then of the said new parish and to his successors a grant of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum, and such grant will be made by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.
"And whereas certain well disposed persons

have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds sterling in aid of the endowment of the said proposed district or new parish and of the maintenance of the minister or incumbent thereof for the time being, and we have in respect of such sum agreed and have undertaken to provide and pay by equal halfyearly payments on the first day of May and the first day of November in each and every year to such minister or incombent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore secondly mentioned Act the sum of fifty pounds per annum so long as the said capital sum shall remain in our hands.

" And whereas the said capital sum of one thousand and five hundred pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned to the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Charles John Bishop of the said diocese (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Saint John Bedminster which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of the Holy Nativity Knowle.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Charles John Bishop of the said diocese of Gloucester and Bristol and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from

relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of the Holy Nativity Knowle,

being :-

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the parish of Saint John, Bedminster out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme:

(a.) In such vaults and wholly walled graves as are now existing in the churchyard burials may be allowed on condition that every coffin buried therein be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

(b.) In such reserved grave spaces in the churchyard as have never before been buried in, and, when opened, are free from water, burials may be allowed of so many members of the families to whom they have been allotted, as can be buried at or below the depth of five feet.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give notice of such representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council on the tenth day of July next:

# SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 6 ORDER OF 1883.

A T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 25th day of May, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

> PRESENT: Lord President. Mr. Mundella.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 6 ORDER OF 1883.

Commencement and Duration.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

# Interpretation.

3. In this Order-

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area means an Area for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place means a Place for the time being declared by a Local Authority or by the Privy Council to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

No. 25236.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Exception in favour of Movement from England or Wales into Scotland.

5. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of any Local Authority in England or Wales to a farm or premises in Scotland with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority—

(i.) that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or

suspected of that disease: and

(ii.) that there is not, at the time of the granting of the licence, a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place in the district of the Local Authority out of which the animals are to be moved.

Further Exception in favour of Movement from Northumberland or Cumberland or Berwickupon-Tweed into Scotland.

6. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the county of Northumberland or the county of Cumberland or the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place, to a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the county of Berwick or the county of Dumfries or the county of Roxburgh with a licence of the Local Authority of the county into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority that the animals to be moved—

(i.) either have been bred on the farm or premises from which they are to be moved, or have been pastured or fed thereon for a period of at least one month: and

(ii.) have not within one month immediately before the granting of the licence been exposed in any market; fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales: and

(iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.

Offences.

7. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

At South Hiendley, near Barnsley, in the West Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the foot-path from Hiendley Dam to Hodroyd-lane End on the west, Hodroyd-lane to Hiendleylane End on the north, Hiendley-lane to George Goodworth's House, Upper Hiendley, and thence across certain fields in a direct line to a stream of water at Hiendley Common on the east, and the stream of water at Hiendley Common to Hiendley Dam on the south; (3.) at Thackley, in the township of Idle, in the West Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Shipley and Bramley-road from Collier-lane End to the Great Northern Railway Bridge on the north, the Great Northern Railway from the Railway Bridge to High-street in Idle on the east, High-street and Westfield-lane to Collierlane on the south, and Collier-lane from Westfield to the Shipley-road on the west; (4.) at Eccleshill, in the West Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that

is to say, by a certain fence from the Manchester, Sheffield, and Lincolnshire Railway in a direct line to the Saltersbrook-road on the east, thence by the said road to the Flonah Inn on the south, the Hazlehead-road from the Flonah Inn to the Railway Bridge on the west, and thence by the Manchester, Sheffield, and Lincolnshire Railway to the fence aforesaid on the north; (12.) at Snowden Hill, Hunshelf, near Sheffield, in the township of Hunshelf, in the West Riding of the county of York, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Hall-lane on the east, the Toff and Salter Hill-lane on the south, the Back-lane from Salter Hill-lane to Pond-lave End on the west, and the Pond-lane to Hall-lane End on the north; (13.) so much of the township of Coniston Cold, in the West Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the east from Under Bridge on the Midland Railway along the eastern boundary wall of Town field to Windy Hill Plantation, on the south from Windy Hill Plantation to Coniston Hall lake, along the north of the said lake to Wheelwright Plantation, on the west from Wheelwright Plantation along the boundary walls of Langland Thorney Dyke and Back Pastures to the Midland Railway, and on the north from Back Pasture fence along the Midland Railway to Under Bridge aforesaid; and (14.) so much of the townships of Mitton, Waddington, and Bashall Eaves, in the West Riding of the county of York, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, commencing on the north at Bashall Moor-road End near Browsholme Plantation, then by the said road to Three-road Ends near Kitchen's, then continuing along the road past Talbot Bridge to Braddup House, on the east by the road to Page Fold and thence to Waddington and Bashall Eaves-road, then by the said road through Waddington village, then by West Bradford-road to Copple Hall brook, and then by the said brook to the river Ribble, on the south by the river Ribble to Mitton Hall Bridge, and on the west from Mitton Bridge on the Whalley and Whitewell-road past Mitton Church, Angrams, and the Red Pump to Bashall Moor-road End aforesaid,-which were declared by Orders of Council to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from footand-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

# THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease under the abovementioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):-

Anglesey.—(1.) In the parish of Llangeinwen, in the county of Anglesey, bounded on the north by the high road leading from the Menai Straits near Carreg barcut towards Treana to the point where the said road turns in a southerly direction, on the west and south by the said road leading from the last-mentioned point past Maesyporth to Talyfoel Ferry, and eastwards by the Menai Straits.

(2.) All that farm and lands called Dryll, in the parish of Holyhead, in the county of

Anglesey.

Berwickshire .- Around the farm of Preston, in the parish of Bunkle, in the county of Berwick declared by the Local Authority to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease), comprising Primrose Hill farm; Cumledge Mill lands; Lintlaw farm; and Easter and Wester Cruicksfield and Marygold farms.

Buckinghamshire.—(1.) At the hamlet of Salden, in the parish of Mursley, in the county of Buckingham, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the public highway leading from Salden through Newton Longville on the north and east, the bridle-road from Salden to Mursley on the south, and Salden Wood on the west.

(2.) So much of the parish of Soulbury, in the county of Buckingham, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway leading from Stewkley through Soulbury to Linslade, the division of the parishes of Linslade and Soulbury to the road leading from Linslade to Stoke Hammond, then the said road as far as the division of the parishes of Soulbury and Stoke Hammond, then the division of the parishes of Soulbury and Stoke Hammond, and then the division of the parishes of Soulbury and Stewkley to the first-mentioned road.

Cheshire.—(1.) At Church Lawton, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Railway Bridge at the junction of Linley-lane and the North Staffordshire Railway, along the said Railway to the Harecastle and Congleton-road, by this road to the Bleeding Wolf Public-house in Hall Green, thence by an occupation-road to John Charles Bowler's farm, by foot-road to Bret's Wood, the boundary of Bret's Wood and the brook dividing the townships of Church Lawton and Odd Rode to Snape-Aqueduct, and thence by Linley-lane to the Railway Bridge aforesaid.

(2.) At Prestbury, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Three-road Ends at Chorley Church, thence along the London and North-Western Railway from Alderley Edge Railway Station to the third Bridge called Three Arch Bridge, thence to and along the fence by Big Pasture field, across Blackshaw-lane, thence along the fence by Pitt field, Little Broad Oak, and Big Broad Oak fields, across Chorley Halllane, thence to and along the fence by Marl field, Broome field, Meadow field, and Barn field to Ryleys-lane, and thence along Ryleyslane to Chorley Church aforesaid.

(3.) At Lower Bebington, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Bromboro Pool Bridge along the Pool to Mill Bridge and along the road to Spital-lane Ends, thence down Church-road, along Stanton-lane, crossing the footpath from Heath-road, across Acres-road to Higher Bebington Cemetery, along Town-lane, Woodhey, Beech-road, past the Dog Kennels, to Bebington Railway Station, and across Ellin's-lane to Fool Bridge aforesaid.

(4.) At Coddington, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is is to say, the Junction of Coddington-road and brook by Coddington road to Plowley brook, Plowley brook and occupation-road by New House to Coddington brook, and Coddington brook to Junction-road aforesaid.

Derbyshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Dale Abbey, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, starting from a point on the Ilkeston and Derby-road (the Sandpits), by the right to the Flourish Inn, by the right along the footpath to Stanley brook, thence along the brook course to Baldock Mill, by the right up Cat and Fiddle-lane to the Ilkeston and Derby-road, and by the right along the Ilkeston and Derby-road to the Sandpits aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Hartington, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Crowdicote-road from the Four-lane Ends to Crowdicote Bridge, and the river Dove to the footbridge over that river, and the road leading from that point to Sterndale from the west to the north, by the foot-road to Hurdlow-lane, and by the latter to the Old Railway, and then by the Old Railway to the foot-road leading through The Slack from north to east, by The Slack to Crongston-lane, from east to south, and by Crongston-lane to Four-lane Ends on the Crowdicote-road from south to west.

(3.) So much of the parishes of Middleton, and Wirksworth, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Engine-house on High Peak Railway down to Hopton Wood Wharf, thence to Coal Hills, then across the highway to Darklanc End, across Dean Hollow, up to the top of Middleton, round by the Duke of Wellington Inn, up Water-lane, on to the occupation-road on Middleton Moor, and thence on to the Engine House on High Peak aforesaid.

(4.) So much of the parish of Duffield, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Dorwent from the Railway Bridge at Castle Orchard to a point opposite the boundary fence between Duffield and Allestree at Birleyhill, thence to a point at Birley Grange farm, and in a straight line to Three-lane Ends at Cumberhill, and thence by a public footpath by the New Inn Duffield to the Railway Bridge at Castle Orchard aforesaid.

Porsetshire.—So much of the parishes of Kinson, Holdenhurst, Bournemouth, and other adjacent parishes, in the counties of Dorset and Southampton, as lies within the following boundaries. that is to say, the river Stour from Longham Bridge in the county of Dorset to near Throop Farm and Muscliff, then taking the road passing Holdenhurst and the Cross-road to Christchurch direct through Bournemouth by the East Railway Station to the Pembroke Hotel, and thence direct to Constitution Hill by the Woodman Tavern to Sea View Public-house, and from thence passing the Shoulder of Mutton and Bear Cross Inns to, and terminating at, Longham Bridge aforesaid.

Hampshire.—(1.) So much of the parishes of Kinson, Holdenhurst, Bournemouth, and other adjacent parishes, in the counties of Dorset and Southampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Stour from Longham Bridge in the county of Dorset to near Throop Farm and Muscliff, then taking the road passing Holdenhurst and the Cross-road to Christchurch direct through Bournemouth by the East Railway Station to the Pembroke Hotel, and thence direct to Constitution Hill by the Woodman Tavern to Sea View Publichouse, and from thence passing the Shoulder of Mutton and Bear Cross Inns to, and terminating at, Longham Bridge aforesaid.

(2.) At Old Shirley, in the county of Southampton, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by the Redbridge and Baddesley-road leading from Wimpson Corner to Aldermoor farm in the parish of Nursling, on the west by Wimpsonsquare Mousehole Factory to Regents Park Gate, on the south by Park-street. Shirley through High-street to the bottom of Anglesearoad Shirley, and on the east by Anglesea-road and the Winchester-road Shirley as far as

Hoares Hill.

- (3.) So much of the parishes of North Stoneham, South Stoneham, and Otterbourne, in the county of Southampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the west by the Southampton and Winchester turnpikeroad from Marlboro' Pond to the Half Way Inn, thence on the north by Fern Hill and by an imaginary line to the river Itchen passing the Keeper's Cottage on Boyatt Wood and Wheelers Villas, on the east by the river Itchen as far down as Croft House, and thence on the south in a direct line passing Croft House and the Cricketers Arms North Stoneham to Marlboro' Pond aforesaid.
- Hertfordshire.—At Rickmansworth, in the county of Hertford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Chorley Wood Common, Chesham-road, and Swillet-lane.
- Huntingdonshire.—So much of the parish of Orton Waterville, in the county of Huntingdon, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the London and North-Western Railway on the north, the Peterborough and Oundle-road on the south, the road to Orton Railway Station on the west, and Orton Longville parish boundary on the east.
- Kent.—At Tunstall, in the county of Kent, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Siller Field on the north and west, and Ruins-road leading from Sittingbourne to Bexon on the east and south.
- Lancashire.—(1.) At Cliviger, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Calder on the south commencing at its source, thence along the river side to the foot of the Scout Rocks, thence in a westerly direction along the side of the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway to Honey Holmelane, along Honey Holmelane to the Todmorden and Burnley highway at Bull's Head, thence to the north by the Higher Bank wall fence, and to the east by the Higher Helliplatt wall fence to the river Calder, and thence to the south along its side to its source.

- · (2.) So much of the parish of Ightenhill Park, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the south by Padiham-road commencing at Tim Bobbin Inn, thence by a public footpath into Gannow-lane, thence to the west along Gannow-lane, Lowerhouse-lane, and Kitheroelane to Padiham-road, and to the north along Gawthorpe Hall carriage drive to the river Calder, thence to the east along the side of the river Calder to Park-lane, and to the south along Park-lane to the Tim Bobbin Inn aforesaid.
- (3.) So much of the parish of North Meols, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the road leading from Banks to Preston, Boundary Bridge, Martin Mere, and the West Lancashire Railway.
- (4.) So much of the township of Fulwood, in the county of Lancaster, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Ring fence from the Cadley brook Bridge in Fulwood Hall-lane along Fulwood Hall-lane, Watlingroad, Shawe Green-lane to Cadley brook, and along the said brook to Fulwood Hall-lane Bridge.
- (5.) At Haughton, in the county of Lancaster, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the river Tame on the east and south, Stockport-road on the north, and Haughton Dale on the west.
- (6.) That portion of the borough of Blackburn, in the county of Lancaster, which lies on the north-westerly side of the road known as Revidge-lane.
- Leicestershire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Whitwick, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the Monastery and the road leading to the Colony across the highway and Forest Rock's as far as W. Thirlby Butcher Greenhill, thence to the right along the highway to the brook, thence to the right along the brook as far as Holly Hay Wood, and to the right by the Wood side across the road to the Monastery aforesaid.
  - (2.) So much of the parish of Husbands Bosworth, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the road leading from Welford Station to Husbands Bosworth, on the east the road leading from Husbands Bosworth to Welford, on the south the boundary of the parish of Husbands Bosworth, and on the west the London and North-Western Railway.

(3.) At Earls Shilton, in the county of Leicester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Mill-lane on the north and east, the Railway from Elmesthorpe to Leicester on the south, and the bridle-road leading from the Hall to Mill-lane on the west.

- (4.) At Ashby Magna, in the county of Leicester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the road leading from Willoughby Waterless to Gilmor ton, on the south the road leading from Ashby Magna to Little Peatling, on the east the road leading from Gilmorton to Willoughby Waterless, and on the west the road leading from Ashby Magna to Willoughby Waterless.
- Lincolnshire (Holland).—(1.) So much of the parishes of Moulton, Spalding, and Weston, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Spalding and Holbeach main-road

from the Bridge over Moulton Mere drain to Park House, Home Park, on the south, thence the Sea's End-road down to Moulton river next John H. Diggle's farm-house and along such river up to a bridle-road on the bank near Thomas Markham's farm-house on the cast, thence along such bridle-road on the bank to the Lord's drain near Clayton Flint's farm-house in Spalding Marsh on the north, and thence along such Lord's drain to St. Lambert's farm-house, and thence the Moulton Mere drain to the Bridge aforesaid on the Spalding and Holbeach mainroad on the west; exclusive of all boundary-roads but inclusive of all intersecting-roads.

(2.) At Crowland Common, in the parish of Crowland, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Crowland Common-road from South Drove drain to Renowe's Drove on the west, thence Renowe's Drove to its end and the division line between Mr. William Law's farm, Mr. Cook's, Mr. Byworth's, and Mr. Smith's farms up to and including Mr. William Law's Gearing farmstead on the south, thence the Dyke dividing Mr. William Law's and Mr. Robert Smith's farms up to the South Drove drain on the east and thence the South Drove drain to Crowland Common-road aforesaid on the north; Crowland Common-road and Renowe's Drove being included in the Area.

(3.) At Whaplode Fen, in the parish of Whaplode, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Jerkins Bank from Henry White's (the Shepherd's) house to the Drove against William Hilliam's farm-house on the north, thence such Drove to the South Holland drain on the east, thence the South Holland drain up to Flag-lane on the south, and thence Flag-lane to Jerkins Bank near Henry White's house aforesaid on the west; inclusive of all intersecting-roads and Flag-lane but exclusive of all other boundary-roads.

(4.) At Wyberton, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the gravel-road from Wyberton School passing Wyberton Church to its junction with the highway against John Cooke's (junior) farm-house on the north and east, thence such highway passing John Short's farm-house to Odd-forth's-road on the south, and thence Odd-forth's-road to Wyberton School aforesaid on the west; inclusive of all intersecting and boundary-roads except Odd-forth's-road.

(5.) So much of the parish of Kirton, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Kirton Church to the Wind-Mill Public-house in Kirton End on the east, thence the highway to Kirton Mears and passing Deancote Hall up to the Boston and Spalding highway on the north and west, and thence the Boston and Spalding highway to Kirton Church on the south; including all intersecting-roads and the boundary-roads on the north and west but excluding the boundary-roads on the south and east.

(6.) At Whaplode St. Catherines, in the parish of Whaplode, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Little South Holland drain from St. Catherines Bridge to Four Turns Bridge on the south, thence Whaplode Bank to Hurdle Tree Bank to Mill Gate-road on the north, and

thence Mill Gate-road to St. Catherines Bridge aforesaid on the east; including all intersectingroads and the boundary-roads on the north and east but excluding all other boundary-roads.

(7.) So much of the parishes of Kirton-in-Holland, Wigtoft, and Sutterton, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from the Wind-Mill Public-house at Kirton End to the Bridge which spans the Five Town's drain on the north, thence the said Five Town's drain to the highway at Fishmore End in Wigtoft on the west, thence the highway from Fishmore End aforesaid to the Spalding and Boston-road (late turnpike) up to the highway leading to Deancote Hall on the south, thence the highway passing Deancote Hall to the Wind-Mill Public-house aforesaid on the east; including all intersecting-roads and the boundary-road on the east but excluding all other boundary-roads.

(8.) In Semperingham Fen in the parish of Semperingham, in the Parts of Kesteven, and Gosberton Fen, in the parish of Gosberton, and Surfleet Fen, in the parish of Surfleet, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Gosberton and Billingborough highway from Atkinson's Bridge that crosses the Hammond Beck drain to the South Forty Foot river on the north, thence the South Forty Foot river to Ducket's (the Ferryman's) house on the west, thence the public footpath into and along Surfleet Drove to Surfleet Fen Bridge that crosses the Hammond Beck drain on the south, and thence the Hammond Beck drain to Atkinson's Bridge aforesaid on the east; exclusive of all boundary-roads but inclusive of all intersecting-roads.

(9.) At Bicker, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Donington and Swineshead highway from Hosham's-lane to the public footpath in Green Coats field on the south, thence the public footpath into the highway in Bicker village to and along the parish drain up to Dark-lane on the west, and thence Dark-lane and Hosham's-lane to the Donington and Swineshead highway aforesaid on the north and east; including all intersecting roads and boundary-roads except the Spalding and Boston turnpike-road.

Lincolnshire (Kesteven).—(1.) At East Allington, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the roads leading from Allington to Sedgebrook, Marston-lane, and Great Gonerly-lane or highway.

(2.)
