It is The Queen's pleasure that Presentations to His Royal Highness at the Levee shall be considered as equivalent to Presentations to Her Majesty.

REGULATIONS

TO BE OBSERVED AT THE QUEEN'S LEVEE TO BE HELD BY HIS ROYAL HIGHNESS THE PRINCE OF WALES, ON BEHALF OF HER MAJESTY, AT ST. JAMES'S PALACE.

By Her Majesty's Command,

The Noblemen and Gentlemen who propose to attend Her Majesty's Levee, at St. James's Palace, are requested to bring with them two large cards, with their names *clearly written* thereon, one to be left with The Queen's Page in attendance in the Corridor, and the other to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, who will announce the name to His Royal Highness.

PRESENTATIONS.

Any Nobleman or Gentleman who proposes to be presented, must leave at the Lord Chamberlain's Office, St. James's Palace, *before twelve o'clock*, two clear days before the Levee, a card with his name written thereon, and with the name of the Nobleman or Gentleman by whom he is to be presented. In order to carry out the existing regulations that no presentation can be made at a Levee excepting by a person actually attending that Levee, it is also necessary that an intimation from the Nobleman or Gentleman who is to make the presentation, of his intention to be present, should accompany the presentation card above referred to, which will be submitted to The Queen for Her Majesty's approbation. It is Her Majesty's command that no presentations shall be made at the Levee, except in accordance with the above regulations.

It is particularly requested, that in every case the names be *very distinctly written* upon the cards to be delivered to the Lord Chamberlain, in order that there may be no difficulty in announcing them to His Royal Highness.

The State Apartments will be open for the reception of Company coming to Court at half-past one o'clock.

THE following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, having been transmitted by John Campbell, Earl of Aberdeen, to the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the Queen, which Address Her Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:—

May it please your Majesty,

WE, Your Majesty's most loyal and most obedient subjects, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland now convened in General Assembly, have received with the liveliest satisfaction the assurances contained in Your Majesty's gracious letter to the General Assembly of Your Majesty's continued regard for the Church of Scotland, Your interest in her welfare, and Your sympathy with the labours of her Ministers.

In such assurances, confirmed by the many Acts by which Your Majesty's attachment to our beloved Church is manifested, we find ground of lively gratitude to God and a stimulus to renewed exertions in His service. We venture to express the hope that, under an ever deepening sense of our responsibilities and an ever increasing anxiety to discharge them aright, we may, to some extent at least, fulfil Your Majesty's prayer that we may advance the cause of religion and promote the happiness and prosperity of Your Majesty's people in Scotland.

Nothing could be more agreeable to us than that Your Majesty should have again seen meet to appoint the Right Honourable John Campbell, Earl of Aberdeen, to represent Your Majesty's Royal Person in our General Assembly. Our esteem for the character of that Nobleman, and the experience which we have had in previous years of his marked kindness and courtesy to all Members of the General Assembly, make his appointment peculiarly pleasing to us.

We have received with feelings of lively gratitude Your Majesty's munificent gift of two thousand pounds to be employed in the promotion of religion in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland. We shall make every effort to apply this sum in such a manner as may best promote the object which Your Majesty has so warmly at heart.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE NEW FOREST (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1883.

Commencement and Duration.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the tenth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the tenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day; and shall operate notwith-

standing anything in any Order of Council of former or even date.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

The New Forest means the New Forest within the perambulation of the New Forest, in the county of Southampton.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area means an Area for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place means a Place for the time being declared by a Local Authority or by the Privy Council to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Circle means a Circle for the time being an Infected Circle under The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Circles) Order of 1883.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

Movement into or through the New Forest.

4. No animal shall be moved into, out of, or through the New Forest except as expressly authorized by this Order.

5. Animals may be moved into or out of the New Forest from a farm or premises not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Circle—

(A.) With a certificate of a Veterinary Inspector of the Local Authority of the district comprising the farm or premises, certifying that he has examined the animals to be moved, and that, to the best of his knowledge and belief, those animals—

- (i.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease; and
- (ii.) have not been exposed to the infection of foot-and-mouth disease; and
- (iii.) have been on the farm or premises not less than twenty-eight days immediately before the giving of the certificate; or

(B.) With a New Forest Movement Licence such as is given in the Schedule to this Order to be granted by a Verderer of the New Forest, or by a person appointed by the Verderers to grant such Licences under this Order, on a certificate of a person qualified to be a Veterinary Inspector certifying that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not to the best of his knowledge and belief, been exposed to the infection of foot-and-mouth disease, which Licence may be renewed from time to time on a like fresh certificate.

6. Animals if not affected with foot-and-mouth disease may be moved through the New Forest by railway, without untrucking.

Offences.

7. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
