South Hayling Bridge.

(Alterations in Approach Road No. 2 during Progress of Bill in Parliament.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that during the progress through the House of Lords of the Bill introduced into Parliament in the present session under the above name or short title (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill"), the following alterations have been made in the Approach Road No. 2, proposed to be authorized by the Bill, namely:—
