## BERKHAMPTSTEAD ST. PETER FAIRS.

IN pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, hereby notify as follows:

1. By Memorial, dated the 28th day of February, 1883, a representation has been duly made to me by the Justices of the Peace sitting at Berkhamstead St. Peter, in the county of Hertford, in and for the said division, that Statute Fairs have been annually held at Old Michaelmas on the 12th day of October, and on Monday at Shrove Tide, and on Whitsun Monday, within the parish of Berkhamstead St. Peter, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that such Fair should be abolished:

2. On the 12th day of July, 1883, I shall take the aforesaid representation into consideration, and all persons are to intimate, before that day, any objection they may desire to offer to the abolition of the said Fairs. *W. V. Harcourt.*

## FOULNESS FAIR.

WHEREAS a representation has been duly made to me, as Secretary of State for the Home Department, by the Justices of the Peace acting in and for the Petty Sessional Division of Rochford, in the county of Essex, that a Fair has been annually held on the 10th and 11th days of July, in the parish of Foulness, in the said division of the said county, and that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas notice of the said representation and of the time when I should take the same into consideration, has been duly published in pursuance of "The Fairs Act, 1871:"

And whereas on such representation and consideration, it appears to me that it would be for the convenience and advantage of the public that the said Fair should be abolished:

And whereas G. H. Finch, Esq., as lord or owner of the said Fair and the tolls thereof, has consented, in writing, that the said Fair should be abolished:

Now, therefore, I, as the Secretary of State for the Home Department, in exercise of the powers vested in me by "The Fairs Act, 1871," do hereby order that the Fair which has been annually held on the 10th and 11th days of July, in the parish of Foulness, in the said Petty Sessional Division of Rochford, in the county of Essex, shall be abolished as from the date of this Order.

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879; Withdrawal of Highway District from Audit District.

Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District. Wigmore Highway District.

To Alfred William Roberts, District Auditor;—  
To the Highway Board for the Highway District of Wigmore;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the districts in which such Auditors respectively

are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts ;

And whereas the said Alfred William Roberts is a District Auditor duly appointed under the provisions of the Statutes in that behalf, and is acting for the Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District under the authority of an Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 9th day of October, 1879.

And whereas by an Order dated the 5th day of February, 1880, the Local Government Board ordered and prescribed that it should be the duty of the said Alfred William Roberts to audit the Accounts of certain Authorities therein named, whose Districts were only partly situated within the said Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District, including the Highway Board for the Highway District of Wigmore ; and that the Districts of such Authorities should, for the purpose of such audit, be deemed to be within the said Audit District ;

And whereas it is proposed to make other provision for the audit of the Accounts of the said Highway Board for the Highway District of Wigmore.

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall no longer be the duty of the said Alfred William Roberts to audit the Accounts of the said Highway Board for the Highway District of Wigmore, and of their Officers, and that the said Highway District shall cease to be deemed within the said Herefordshire and Monmouthshire Audit District.

ORDER of the Local Government Board under the District Auditors Act, 1879 : Assignment of District and Duties (Supplemental) :—

Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District, Llansilin United School District, Bishop's Castle, Bridgnorth, Conover, Kidderminster, Upton Snodsbury, and Wigmore, Highway Districts, and Redditch Local Government District.

To Richard Dansey Green Price, District Auditor ;—

To the School Board for the United School District of Llansilin ;—

To the Highway Board for each of the Highway Districts of Bishop's Castle, Bridgnorth, Conover, Kidderminster, Upton Snodsbury, and Wigmore ;—

To the Local Board for the Local Government District of Redditch ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by Section 4 of "The District Auditors Act, 1879," it is enacted that the Local Government Board may from time to time assign to District Auditors their Duties, and the Districts in which such Auditors respectively are to act, and may from time to time change wholly or in part such Duties or Districts ;

And whereas by an Order dated the 7th day of May, 1883, the Local Government Board

certified the appointment of the said Richard Dansey Green Price as a District Auditor, and ordered and prescribed that the District in which he should from the 8th day of May, 1883, act as Auditor, and which was thereby assigned to him, should, until the said Board should otherwise prescribe, comprise the area for the time being included in the several Unions named in the Schedule to that Order, and that such District should be termed "The Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District ;"

And whereas it is prescribed by Article 2 of the said Order that it shall be the duty of the said District Auditor to audit the Accounts of the Guardians and the Overseers specified in Nos. (1) and (2) of that Article, as well as the Accounts of the other Authorities (and of their Officers) referred to in Nos. (3) and (4) in the following terms :—

"(3.) The several other Authorities for the time being whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within the said Audit District.

"(4.) Such of the said other Authorities whose Accounts are or may be by law subject to be so audited, and whose Districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being partly situated within the said Audit District, as We may by Order under Seal hereafter prescribe."

And whereas the School Board for the said United School District of Llansilin, and the Highway Board for each of the said Highway Districts of Bishop's Castle, Bridgnorth, Conover, Kidderminster, Upton Snodsbury, and Wigmore, and the Local Board for the said Local Government District of Redditch, are respectively Authorities whose Accounts are subject to be audited by a District Auditor, and the District of each of the said Authorities is partly situated within the said Audit District :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order and Prescribe that it shall, until we otherwise Prescribe, be the duty of the said Richard Dansey Green Price to audit the Accounts of the said School Board and of each of the said Highway Boards, and of the said Local Board, and of their Officers, in conformity with the provisions contained in Article 3 of the above cited Order ; and that for the purpose of such Audit the District of the said School Board and of each of the said Highway Boards and of the said Local Board shall be deemed to be within the said Shropshire and Worcestershire Audit District.

**SPECIAL REGULATIONS** (Supplementary to the General Regulations issued 8th April, 1872, and amended by subsequent notices in the London Gazette), respecting Open Competitive Examinations for the Situation of Junior Assistant in the Royal Observatory at the Cape of Good Hope.

**N.B.**—These Regulations are liable to alteration for future Examinations.

1. The limits of age for this situation are 17 and 20. Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of the Examination.

2. Candidates will be required to show what preliminary training or technical education they have undergone to qualify themselves for a situation of this nature. They must produce to the Civil Service Commissioners a certificate from the Astronomer Royal, or from the head of a recognized Observatory, that they have had the preliminary training and possess the technical knowledge necessary to qualify them for making observations. Evidence on this point must be sent in at such times as the Civil Service Commissioners may appoint. If it should prove *prima facie* satisfactory, the Candidate will be admitted to Examination, subject, in the case of his being successful in the competition, to such further enquiry and the production of such further evidence as may be necessary.

3. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz. :—

1. Handwriting and Orthography.
2. Arithmetic (including Vulgar and Decimal Fractions).
3. Calculations of instrumental corrections, and numerical reductions of observations.

4. Candidates failing in any of the above-named subjects will not be eligible.

5. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such times and in such manner as the Commissioners may appoint.

6. A fee will be required from each Candidate attending the Examination, according to the scale laid down, under the Order in Council of 22nd March, 1879, by notice in the London Gazette of 29th April, 1881.

**BYE-LAWS** made by the Wallasey Local Board, acting as the Local Authority of the said District, with respect to the Tramways within the said district, under the powers conferred upon them by "The Tramways Act, 1870":—

**PRELIMINARY.**

*Application of Bye-laws.*

1. The Bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of any Tramway Company using any tramway within the district of Wallasey, and to the drivers and conductors of such carriages, and to all places with respect to which the Local Board have power under the Tramways Act, 1870, to make Bye-laws and Regulations.

*Conductor.*

2. The expression "Conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Wallasey Tramways Company, and having charge of a carriage.

*Speed of Carriages.*

3. No carriage shall be driven at a less rate than five miles nor more than eight miles in the hour upon the average.

*Distance from other Carriages.*

4. No carriage shall be driven so as to follow a preceding carriage at a less distance than 30 yards along any portion of a line of tramway, except at junction points or sidings.

*Stopping for Passengers.*

5. Every driver or conductor of a carriage shall stop the same, except on a gradient steeper than 1 in 40, when required so to do by any passenger desirous of leaving the carriage or by any person desirous of travelling by the carriage, and for whom there is room and to whose admission no reasonable objection is made.

*Penalties.*

6. Any driver or conductor of a carriage, or other person who offends against any of the foregoing bye-laws shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence; and in the case of the continuance of such offence to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which such offence continues.

*Copy of Bye-laws.*

7. The conductor of each carriage shall carry with him a copy of these bye-laws, and shall, on request of any passenger, produce the same to, and shall permit the same to be perused by, such passenger; and the Company shall affix and keep affixed in their offices and waiting-rooms within the said district a printed copy of the same for the use of the public.

*Enforcing Bye-laws.*

8. The conductor of each carriage shall, to the best of his ability, enforce and prevent the breach of these bye-laws.
