fert, and Aghadoe; James, Baron Talbot de Malahide; Richard Monckton, Baron Houghton; John Emerich Edward, Baron Acton; Sir George Webbe Dasent; and William Hardy, to be Our Commissioners to make enquiry as to the places in which such papers and manuscripts are deposited, and for any of the purposes set forth in the Original Warrant under Our Sign Manual, dated the second day of April, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine.

And for the purpose of carrying out the said enquiry, We do hereby authorize you to call in the aid and co-operation of all Possessors of Manuscripts and Papers, inviting them to assist you in furthering the object of this Commission, and to give them full assurance that no information is sought except such as relates to public affairs, and that no knowledge or information which may be obtained from their collection shall be promulgated without their full license and consent:

And We do further by these Presents authorize you, with the consent of the owners of such manuscripts, to make abstracts and catalogues of such manuscripts:

And We do hereby direct that you or any three or more of you shall form a quorum, and that you or any three or more of you shall have power to invite the Possessors of such Papers and Records, as you may deem it desirable, to inspect, and to produce them before you.

And Our further will and pleasure is, that you, Our said Commissioners, or any three or more of you, do report to Us from time to time, in writing under your hands and seals, all and every your proceedings under and by virtue of these presents.

And for the better enabling you to execute these presents, We do hereby nominate, constitute, and appoint Our trusty and well beloved John Romilly, Esquire, Barrister-at-Law, to be Secretary to this Our Commission.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the sixteenth day of *June*, one thousand eight-hundred and eighty-three, in the forty-sixth year of Our reign.

THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

THE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):—

Anglesey.—(1.) In the parish of Llangeinwen, in the county of Anglesey, bounded on the north by the high road leading from the Menai Straits near Carreg bareut towards Treana to the point where the said road turns in a southerly direction, on the west and south by the said road leading from the last-mentioned point past Maesyorth to Talyfoel Ferry, and eastwards by the Menai Straits.

(2.) All that farm and lands called Dryll, in the parish of Holyhead, in the county of Anglesey.

Cheshire.—(1.) At Lower Bebington, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Bromboro Pool Bridge along the Pool to Mill Bridge and along the road to Spital-lane Ends, thence down Church-road, along Stanton-lane, crossing the footpath from Heath-road, across Acres-road to Higher Bebington Cemetery, along Town-lane, Woodhey, Beech-road, past the Dog Kennels, to Bebington Railway Station, and across Ellin's-lane to Pool Bridge aforesaid.

(2.) At Coddington, in the county of Chester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Junction of Coddington-road and brook by Coddington-road to Plowley brook, Plowley brook and occupation-road by New House to Coddington brook, and Coddington brook to Junction-road aforesaid.

Derbyshire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Dale Abbey, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, starting from a point on the Ilkeston and Derby-road (the Sandpits), by the right to the Flourish Inn, by the right along the footpath to Stanley brook, thence along the brook course to Baldock Mill, by the right up Cat and Fiddle-lane to the Ilkeston and Derby-road, and by the right along the Ilkeston and Derby-road to the Sandpits aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Hartington, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Crowdicote-road from the Four-lane Ends to Crowdicote Bridge, and the river Dove to the foot-bridge over that river, and the road leading from that point to Sterndale from the west to the north, by the foot-road to Hurdlow-lane, and by the latter to the Old Railway, and then by the Old Railway to the foot-road leading through The Slack from north to east, by The Slack to Crongston-lane, from east to south, and by Crongston-lane to Four-lane-Ends on the Crowdicote-road from south to west.

(3.) So much of the parishes of Middleton, and Wirksworth, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Engine-house on High Peak Railway down to Hopton Wood Wharf, thence to Coal Hills, then across the highway to Dark-lane End, across Dean Hollow, up to the top of Middleton, round by the Duke of Wellington Inn, up Water-lane, on to the occupation-road on Middleton Moor, and thence on to the Engine House on High Peak aforesaid.

Essex.—At Rood Street, in the parish of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Great Eastern Railway and a wood known as Rough Tallies on the south, and thence over the main-road leading from Epping to Ongar taking one field along the side thereof in the occupation of William Simmonds leading towards and including the house, premises, and fields in the occupation of Mrs. Marsh, thence by the road to the Blacksmith's Arms Inn, and including the whole of that part of Epping Forest known as Lower Forest.

Hampshire.—So much of the parishes of North Stoneham, South Stoneham, and Otterbourne, in the county of Southampton, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the west by the Southampton and Winchester turnpike-road from Marlboro' Pond to the Half Way Inn, thence on the north by Fern Hill and by an imaginary line to the river Itchen passing the Keeper's Cottage on Boyatt Wood and Wheelers Villas, on the east by the river Itchen as far down as Croft House, and thence on the south in a direct line passing Croft House and the Cricketers Arms North Stoneham to Marlboro' Pond aforesaid.

Herefordshire.—At Weston - under - Penyard, in the county of Hereford, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from Hildersley farm along the Ross and Gloucester-road as far as Ryeford, thence along a highway to Eccleswall, thence along the old Hereford and Gloucester-road as far as Sandford Bridge and down the Rudhall brook as far as Broadmeadow, then along a fence to buildings in the occupation of William Viner Bonner, and thence along an occupation-road to Hildersley farm aforesaid; including all the said roads and all land forming part of a farm a portion of which is included within the said boundaries.

Lancashire.—That portion of the borough of Blackburn, in the county of Lancaster, which lies on the north-westerly side of the road known as Revidge-lane.

Leicestershire.—(1.) So much of the parish of Whitwick, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the Monastery and the road leading to the Colony across the highway and Forest Rock's as far as W. Thirlby Butcher Greenhill, thence to the right along the highway to the brook, thence to the right along the brook as far as Holly Hay Wood, and to the right by the Wood side across the road to the Monastery aforesaid.

(2.) So much of the parish of Husbands Bosworth, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the road leading from Welford Station to Husbands Bosworth, on the east the road leading from Husbands Bosworth to Welford, on the south the boundary of the parish of Husbands Bosworth, and on the west the London and North-Western Railway.

(3.) At Earls Shilton, in the county of Leicester, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Mill-lane on the north and east, the Railway from Elmesthorpe to Leicester on the south, and the bridle-road leading from the Hall to Mill-lane on the west.

Lincolnshire (Holland).—The whole of the Parts of Holland; the petty sessional divisions of Bourn, and Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven; and the whole of the borough of Boston; Lincolnshire.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Short Title.

1. This Order may be cited as THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 7 ORDER OF 1883.

Commencement and Duration.

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

Interpretation.

3. In this Order—

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area means an Area for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place means a Place for the time being declared by a Local Authority or by the Privy Council to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Circle means a Circle for the time being an Infected Circle under The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Circles) Order of 1883.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

Restriction on Movement.

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

Exception in favour of Movement from England or Wales into Scotland.

5. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of any Local Authority in England or Wales to a farm or premises in Scotland with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority—

(i.) that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease: and

(ii.) that there is not, at the time of the granting of the licence, a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place in the district of the Local Authority out of which the animals are to be moved.

Further Exception in favour of Movement from Northumberland or Cumberland or Berwick-upon-Tweed into Scotland.

6. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the county of Northumberland or the county of Cumberland or the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Circle, to a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the county of Berwick or the county of Dumfries or the county of Roxburgh with a licence of the Local Authority of the county into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority that the animals to be moved—

- (i.) either have been bred on the farm or premises from which they are to be moved, or have been pastured or fed thereon for a period of at least one month: and
- (ii.) have not within one month immediately before the granting of the licence been exposed in any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales: and
- (iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.

Further Exception in favour of Movement from the Royal Agricultural Society's Show.

7. Animals exhibited at the Royal Agricultural Society's Show to be held on the Knavesmire, situate partly in the borough of York and partly in the West Riding of the county of York, on the sixteenth and following days of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, may be moved by land out of that Show and then into the district of any Local Authority in Scotland with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that such licence shall only be granted on a Certificate of Health signed by a member of the Royal College of Veterinary Surgeons, and a Certificate of the Secretary of the Show, or of some fit person appointed by him to certify on his behalf, that the animals have been exhibited in the Show.

Offences.

8. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.

A PROCLAMATION.

Isle of Man to Wit.

By the Lieutenant-Governor.

WHEREAS by Section 2 of "The Cattle Diseases Prevention Act, 1865," it is, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of any two members of the Council, by an Order, in writing, to prohibit the importation or introduction into this Isle of cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals, for such period or periods as may be deemed necessary for the purpose of preventing the introduction of any infectious or contagious disease among the cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals in this Isle.

And whereas the infectious disease commonly called the foot-and-mouth disease prevails amongst animals in certain places beyond this Isle.

And whereas by Order, dated this 31st day of May, 1883, in order to prevent the introduction of the said disease amongst animals in this Isle, the importation of certain animals was prohibited until the 15th day of June instant, and it is deemed advisable to extend the time of such prohibition as regards places beyond this Isle, other than those hereinafter mentioned.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do, therefore, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of the powers given by the said Act,

Hereby order:—

That until the 31st day of July next, no bull, cow, ox, heifer, steer, calf, sheep, swine, or goat shall be imported into this Isle from any place beyond this Isle, other than from Scotland, and from Whitehaven and Barrow-in-Furness, in England, and from Belfast, in Ireland.

(Increase of Capital; Amendment of Acts.)

Wirral Railway.

Certificate of the Board of Trade for the Construction of the Railway.

WHEREAS the promoters of the Wirral Railway have contracted to purchase the lands required for the railway and works connected therewith, and have complied with the requirements of the Railways Construction Facilities Act, 1864, and the Railways (Powers and Construction) Acts, 1864, Amendment Act, 1870.

Now therefore the Board of Trade do by this their Certificate in pursuance of the said Acts, and by virtue and in exercise of the powers thereby in them vested, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, certify as follows:—

Short Title.

1. This Certificate may be cited as "the Wirral Railway Certificate, 1883," and the railways authorized by this Certificate shall be called the Wirral Railway.

Incorporation of Company.

2. The following persons, namely:—

Earl of Shrewsbury and Talbot, Ingestre Hall, Stafford;

Henry Robertson, M.P., Palé, Corwen;

John Cavendish Orred, Maidwell Hall, Northampton, Lord of the Manor of Tranmere;

James Harrison, Dornden, Tunbridge Wells;

Harold Littledale, Liscard Hall, Cheshire;

Charles Menzies Holland, Bryn-y-Groeg, Wrexham;

Ernest Inman, Upton Manor, Cheshire;

Charles William Harvey, 53, Lord-street, Liverpool;

and all other persons who have already subscribed, or shall hereafter subscribe to the undertaking, and their executors, administrators and assigns respectively, shall be united into a Company for the purpose of making and maintaining the railways hereinafter described, and for those purposes shall be incorporated by the name of the "Wirral Railway Company," and by that name shall be a body corporate with perpetual succession and a common seal, and with power to purchase, take, hold, and dispose of lands and other property for the purposes of this Certificate.

Interpretation.

3. In this Certificate the expression "the Company" means the Wirral Railway Company.

Capital.

4. The capital of the Company shall be £300,000, in 30,000 shares of £10 each.

Amount of Calls.

5. One-fifth of the amount of a share shall be the greatest amount of a call, and two months at least shall be the interval between successive calls, and four-fifths of the amount of a share shall be the utmost aggregate amount of the calls made in any year upon any share.

Borrowing Powers.

6. The Company may from time to time borrow on mortgage any sum not exceeding in the whole £100,000.

Receiver.

7. The mortgagees of the Company may enforce payment of arrears of principal and interest due on their mortgages by the appointment of a receiver, and in order to authorize the appointment of a receiver the amount owing to the mortgagees, by whom the application for a receiver shall be made, shall not be less than £10,000 in the whole.

Priority of Money Borrowed.

8. All moneys borrowed on mortgage from the time when the same shall be advanced, and the interest for the time being due thereon, shall have

priority against the Company and the property of the Company over all other claims on account of any debts incurred or engagements entered into by them; provided always that such priority shall not prejudice or affect the lien of any vendor for the unpaid purchase money of any land taken by the Company for the purposes of the railways.

First Meeting of Company.

9. The first ordinary meeting of the Company shall be held within four months after the publication of this Certificate.

Incorporation of part of Railway Act of 1867.

10. In respect of any shares or stock issued under this Certificate, section 21 of "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863," shall for the purpose of this Certificate be read and have effect as provided with respect to a Special Act by section 27 of "The Railway Companies Act, 1867," and sections 23 to 26 inclusive of the last-mentioned Act with reference to loan capital shall be incorporated with this Certificate, and shall apply as if this Certificate were a Special Act.

Power to issue Debenture Stock.

11. In respect of any part of the money by this Certificate authorized to be raised by mortgage, the Company may create and issue debenture stock subject to the provisions of Part III of "The Companies Clauses Act, 1863," but notwithstanding anything therein contained, the interest of all debenture stock, at any time after this Certificate comes into operation, created and issued by the Company, shall rank *pari passu* with the interest of all mortgages at any time after this Certificate comes into operation; granted by the Company, and shall have priority over all principal money secured by such mortgages.

Number of Directors.

12. Subject as hereinafter provided, the number of Directors shall be seven or more; but it shall be lawful for the Company from time to time to reduce the number, provided that the number be not less than three.

Qualification of Directors.

13. The qualification of a Director shall be the possession, in his own right, of not less than fifty shares.

Quorum.

14. The quorum of a meeting of Directors shall be two.

Directors.

15. The said Earl of Shrewsbury and Talbot, Henry Robertson, John Cavendish Orred, James Harrison, Harold Littledale, Charles Menzies Holland, and Charles William Harvey shall be the first Directors of the Company, and shall continue in office until the first ordinary meeting held after the publication of this Certificate. At that meeting, the shareholders present personally or by proxy may either continue in office the Directors appointed by this Certificate, or any of them, or may elect a new body of Directors, or Directors to supply the place of those not continued in office, the Directors appointed by this Certificate being, if qualified, eligible for re-election. And at the first ordinary meeting to be held in every year after the first ordinary meeting, the shareholders present personally or by proxy shall (subject to the power hereinbefore contained for reducing the number of Directors) elect persons to supply the places of the Directors then retiring from office agreeably to the provisions in "The Companies Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," contained; and the several persons elected at any such meeting, being neither removed nor disqualified, nor having resigned, shall continue to

be Directors until others are elected in their stead in manner provided by the same Act.

Power to construct Railways.

16. Subject to the provisions of this Certificate, the Company may, on the lands contracted to be purchased by them as aforesaid, make and maintain the railways shown on the deposited plans and sections as the same have been amended in the lines, and according to the levels, and within the limits of deviation shown on such plans and sections as amended, and with all proper stations, approaches, sidings, works, and conveniences connected therewith.

The railways authorized by this Certificate are:—

1. A railway (No. 1) wholly within the parish of Wallasey, and county of Chester, commencing at a point 20 yards on the east side of Rowson-street, in the township of Liscard, 60 yards south-west from the centre of the steps of the Convalescent Institution for Women, passing into the township of Wallasey, and terminating there on the west side of Wallasey-road at a point on the boundary of the road 213 yards from the ordnance bench mark, on the north side of the junction of Grove-road with Wallasey-road.
2. A railway (No. 2), commencing at the termination of Railway No. 1, in the township and parish of Wallasey, and county of Chester, and passing thence into the township of Bidston-cum-Ford, in the parish of Bidston, in the same county, and terminating there at a point on the township boundary between that township and the township of Noctorum, 83 yards east from the Brook Fender.
3. A railway (No. 3), commencing at the termination of Railway No. 2, in the township of Noctorum, and parish of Woodchurch, in the county of Chester, and passing thence through the township of Oxton into the township of Tranmere, in the parish of Bebington, and county of Chester, and terminating there at a point 13 yards in a westerly direction from a point 10 yards along the western wall of the garden belonging to William Augustus Richardson, Esq., measured from the north-west corner thereof.
4. A railway (No. 4), wholly within the parish of Bebington, and county of Chester, commencing at the termination of Railway No. 3, and terminating by a junction with the authorized Mersey Railway, in the township of Tranmere, at a point 13 yards east from Argyle-street South, and 110 yards north-east from the eastern corner of the junction of Mollington-street with Argyle-street South.

Provided always, that so much of Railway No. 4, hereinbefore described, as extends for a distance of six chains from the junction of that railway with the Mersey Railway, shall be made in the line and according to the levels shown on the amended plan and section of that portion of Railway No. 4, signed by Henry G. Calcraft, Assistant-Secretary of the Board of Trade, dated 9th December, and deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the county of Chester on 15th December 1882.

Time for Completion.

17. The railways shall be completed within five years from the publication of this Certificate, and on the expiration of that period the powers of this Certificate granted to the Company for executing the railways or otherwise in relation thereto,

shall cease to be exercised except as to so much thereof as shall then be completed.

Certain Agreements made binding.

18. The agreements specified in the schedule to this Certificate entered into by the Promoters shall be and the same are hereby made binding on the Company.

Agreements with other Companies.

19. The Company on the one hand, and the Mersey Railway Company, and the Seacombe, Hoylake, and Deeside Railway Company, or either of them, on the other hand, may from time to time enter into contracts or arrangements with respect to the following purposes, or any of them (that is to say):—

The management, use, working, and maintenance of the railways, or any of them, or of any part or parts thereof respectively.

The supply of any rolling or working stock, and of officers and servants for the conduct of the traffic on the railways.

The payments to be made and the conditions to be performed with respect to the matters aforesaid.

The interchange, accommodation, conveyance, and delivery of traffic coming from or destined for the undertakings of the contracting companies, and the fixing and division between the said companies of the receipts arising from such traffic.

During the continuance of any agreement to be entered into under the provisions of this Certificate for the use of the railways by the Mersey Railway Company and the Seacombe, Hoylake, and Deeside Railway Company, or either of them, the railways of the Company, and of the Mersey Railway Company, and the Seacombe, Hoylake, and Deeside Railway Company, or either of them, shall for the purposes of tolls and charges, be considered as one railway, and in estimating the amount of tolls and charges [in respect of traffic conveyed partly on the railways and partly on the railways of the Mersey Railway Company and the Seacombe, Hoylake, and Deeside Railway Company, or either of them, for a less distance than four miles, tolls and charges may only be charged as for four miles; and in respect of passengers, for every mile, or fraction of a mile, beyond four miles, tolls and charges for one mile only. And in respect of animals and goods, for every quarter of a mile, or fraction of a quarter of a mile, beyond four miles, tolls and charges as for a quarter of a mile only; and no other short distance charge shall be made for the conveyance of passengers, animals, or goods partly on the railways, and partly on the railways of the Mersey Railway Company and the Seacombe, Hoylake, and Deeside Railway Company during the continuance of any such agreement.

For the Protection of the Corporation, and the Owners, Lessees, and Occupiers of Property within the Borough of Birkenhead.

20. In the construction within the borough of Birkenhead of the railways and works by this Certificate authorized, the following provisions shall apply and have effect, unless otherwise agreed between the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of Birkenhead (in this Certificate called "the Corporation") and the Company.

As to Ventilating Shafts.

(1.) Subject to the provisions of this Certificate the Company may from time to time make such ventilating shafts or openings from their railway into any public road or open space, and at such places either within or beyond the limits of deviation shown on the deposited plans, as may be

agreed upon between them and the Corporation, and the Company may erect such balustrades or other works on the surface of the ground as may be so agreed upon for the purposes of or connected with any such openings or shafts: Provided that the Company shall make full compensation to all owners and occupiers of premises injuriously affected by the making of any such shaft or opening.

Company to pay for Interference with Gas or Water Mains.

(2.) Whenever by the appropriation or destruction of property by this Certificate authorized, any gas or water mains or pipes laid for the supply of such property (except pipes inside such property) shall be rendered unnecessary, the Company shall pay to the Corporation the cost of laying an equivalent length of gas or water main or pipe, and the cost of the works required for the discontinuance of such gas or water mains or pipes rendered unnecessary to such amount as shall be estimated by the Gas Engineer or Water Engineer of the Corporation, and the gas and water mains and pipes so rendered unnecessary shall be the property of the Company.

As to Construction of Tunnel or Covered Way.

(3.) The tunnel or covered way of the railways authorized by this Certificate shall be of such strength and durability as is proper and sufficient for the effectual support of any street or roadway under which it passes, and shall be constructed with retaining walls at each side of the authorized railways sufficient to secure all buildings adjoining or near the railways from any damage or any loss of stability, and the Company shall, at their own expense, and to the satisfaction of the Corporation, for ever hereafter maintain the said tunnel or covered way and works.

Consent of Corporation necessary to Deviations to greater extent than authorized by Certificate.

(4.) Notwithstanding anything in this Certificate the Company shall not deviate from the lines or levels as shown on the deposited plans and sections as amended (except to the extent and in manner expressly authorized by this Certificate) without the consent in writing of the Corporation, which consent the Corporation are hereby empowered from time to time to give, subject to such provisions and conditions as they may think fit.

For Preventing Noise and Vibration.

(5.) The rails of the authorized railways shall be laid, bedded, and maintained, and from time to time renewed, in such manner as shall be best suited for rendering the working of the railway as free from noise and vibration as possible, and to the reasonable satisfaction of the Engineer to the Corporation.

Peat or Tan to be placed below Ballast.

(6.) Below the ballast there shall be a layer throughout of at least six inches in thickness, of peat or tan, or of such other substance as shall be reasonably satisfactory to the Engineer of the Corporation.

Space to be left in front of Stations.

(7.) Where any station, any part of which shall be constructed above the surface of lands acquired or to be acquired under the authority of this Certificate, adjoins a street, such station shall be so arranged that a space of not less than 10 feet in width shall be left between the present line of the street and the station for the whole length thereof for the purposes of the traffic to and from such station, which space shall be dedicated to the public and become part of the respective street's

accordingly, and shall be paved, flagged, and channelled at the expense of the Company to the satisfaction of the Corporation.

Stations not to Interfere with Streets and Public Places.

(8.) The Company shall not construct any part of any station or any approach thereto, or works connected with or for the purposes of a station upon or over any street, passage, or public place, or so as to interfere with the use of such street, passage, or public place without the consent of the Corporation under the hand of the Town Clerk.

Designs, &c., of certain Ventilating Shafts to be approved by Corporation.

(9.) The design and materials of the elevation, including the roof of any building or ventilating shaft erected or rebuilt by the Company, fronting to or adjoining any street, shall be subject to the approval of the Corporation.

As to Interference with Argyle-street South.

(10.) The Company shall not divert, alter, or interfere with Argyle-street South, except as hereinafter mentioned, and the Company shall in execution of the works authorized, carry the said street by a bridge over the railway, of such form, material and construction, and with such screens and parapets, both as regards the said bridge and its immediate approaches, as shall be in all respects satisfactory to the Corporation, and so that the said street shall be reconstructed without alteration of level or gradient and of the full existing width (including footpaths), and the Company shall pave or flag to the satisfaction of the Corporation so much of the footways of Argyle-street South as abut upon premises acquired by them; and shall repave and reinstate so much of the carriage way as shall be temporarily interfered with by the Company in the construction of the authorized works.

As to Interference with other Streets.

(11.) The Company shall not divert, alter, or interfere with Temple-road, Snutch-lane, Woodchurch-road, or Storeton-road, except as in this Certificate expressly mentioned; and the Company shall, in the execution of the works authorized, carry the said streets and road respectively over the railway by bridges of such form, material, and construction and with such screens and parapets, both as regards the said bridges respectively and their immediate respective approaches, as shall be in all respects satisfactory to the Corporation, and so that the said streets and roads respectively shall be reconstructed without alteration of level or gradient, and of the full existing widths thereof respectively (including footpaths), and the Company shall reinstate the footways and reinstate so much of the carriage ways in the said streets and roads respectively as shall be temporarily interfered with by the Company in the construction of the authorized works.

As to Holm-lane.

(12.) The Company shall carry Holm-lane over the railway at the level shown on the deposited plans and sections by means of a bridge over the railway of such form, material, and construction, and with such screens and parapets, both as regards the said bridge and its immediate approaches, as shall be in all respects satisfactory to the Corporation, and so that the said bridge and its approaches shall give a clear width of roadway (including footpaths) of 36 feet in width at the least, and the Company shall reform and reinstate so much of the carriage way and footways as shall be temporarily interfered with or altered by the Company in the construction of the authorized works.

*As to Obstruction of Traffic in Streets, &c.,
interfered with.*

(13.) The Company shall not without the consent of the Corporation under the hand of the Town Clerk (which consent the Corporation are hereby empowered to give, subject to such provisions and conditions as the Corporation may deem expedient) temporarily close any street, road, passage, or public place, or construct any works, or perform any operations which may obstruct or in any way interfere with the traffic along or through such street, road, passage, or public place.

*Temporary Bridge or Roadway to be provided
where necessary during Construction of Railway.*

(14.) In the event of the Company requiring for the purpose of constructing the authorized railways, or any part thereof (subject to the restrictions in this Certificate provided) to open, or in any manner interfere with any portion of the surface of the footway or carriage-way of any street, passage, or public place, then, and in such case, the Company shall to the satisfaction of the Corporation provide a temporary bridge or roadway equal in width to the part or parts of the roadway and footway of such street, passage, or public place so opened or interfered with, and such temporary bridge or roadway shall be constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the Corporation until the said street, passage, or public place, and the footways thereof respectively have been restored to a good and proper state for the safety and convenience of the public.

*Access to Property and Accommodation for Traffic
to be preserved.*

(15.) Wherever any street, passage, or public place shall, with the consent of the Corporation, be temporarily interfered with, diverted, or stopped up or obstructed by the Company in the execution of the authorized railways then in addition to the specific requirements in this Certificate contained proper accommodation for access to property and any additional accommodation for traffic that may be required shall be previously provided to the satisfaction of the Corporation, and shall thereafter, during such diversion, stoppage, or obstruction be maintained, fenced, watched, and lighted by the Company to the satisfaction of the Corporation, at the expense of the Company.

Prohibiting Obstruction from Cartage of Spoil, &c.

(16.) The Company shall not, during the construction of the authorized railways, cart or take any rubbish, spoil, or debris, or cart any bricks or materials through or along any street so as to cause an obstruction, except between the hours of seven o'clock in the evening and seven o'clock in the morning.

*Position of Ventilating Shafts and Openings in
Public Streets and Places to be approved by
Corporation.*

(17.) The Company shall not without the consent of the Corporation, under the hand of the Town Clerk, construct in any street or public place any ventilating shaft or any other shaft eye opening or work into the said tunnel or covered way, but shall construct every such shaft eye opening or work at such places only either within or beyond the limits of deviation shown on the deposited plans as shall be approved by the Corporation and in every respect in accordance with the plans to be approved by them.

*Notice to Corporation and Superintendence of
Borough Engineer.*

(18.) Before commencing the construction of any shaft eye opening or work with such consent

as aforesaid in any street, passage, or public place, the Company shall give to the Corporation seven days' notice in writing; and the works affecting such street, passage, or public place shall be done by the Company, under the superintendence of the Borough Engineer to the satisfaction of the Corporation.

*Shafts and Openings in Streets, &c., to be removed
when required by Corporation.*

(19.) The Company shall, as and when required by the Corporation in writing under the hand of the Town Clerk, remove any shaft eye opening or other work which may, with the consent of the Corporation, have been constructed in any street, passage, or public place, and well and sufficiently to the satisfaction of the Corporation, restore the surface of such street, passage, or public place, and maintain in efficient repair the said surface so restored for the period of twelve months to the like satisfaction.

As to Interference with Sewers, &c.

(20.) Whenever it may be necessary to intercept or interfere with any existing sewer or drain, the Company shall, before intercepting or interfering therewith, construct according to a plan to be approved by the Corporation another sewer or drain in lieu of and of equal capacity with the sewer or drain so proposed to be intercepted or interfered with, and such sewer or drain or substituted sewer or drain shall be connected by and at the expense of the Company with such convenient sewer or drain as shall be approved by the Corporation.

*Expense of Increased Length and Necessary
Alterations of Sewers, &c., to be paid by Company.*

(21.) If by reason of the construction of the authorized railway any additional sewers or drains, or any increased length or alteration of sewers or drains, or any man-holes, air-holes, or other works or conveniences connected therewith shall become necessary, the same shall be constructed by and at the expense of the Company, of such capacity, according to such plans, and in such manner as shall be approved by the Corporation.

Injury to Sewers to be made good.

(22.) If, by reason of the construction of the authorized railway, any sewers belonging to the Corporation crossed by the authorized railway shall be structurally injured or injuriously affected, or in case any sewer collapses by reason of the execution of the works or working of the authorized railway, the Company shall at once repair and make good such sewer to the satisfaction of the Corporation.

*Sewers where crossed by Railway to be kept in
repair by Company.*

(23.) The Company shall, after the construction of the authorized railway and works, keep in good repair all sewers where the line or any part of the railway crosses the same, so far as such repairs are rendered necessary, by the construction or working of the railway.

*Gunpowder or other Explosives not to be used
without consent.*

(24.) Except as by this Certificate otherwise expressly provided the Company shall not use gunpowder, or any other explosive substance, in the construction of the authorized works.

*Damage from use of Explosives to be made good
by Company.*

(25.) The Company may, with the consent of the Corporation, under the hand of the Town Clerk, use gunpowder, or some other explosive substance, in the construction of these works, and the Corporation are hereby empowered from time

to time to give the required consent, revocable on notice, and subject to such conditions as they may see fit, and the Company shall be liable to any damages, costs, or expenses which the Corporation, or any person or Company may sustain or be put to in consequence of the use thereof, whether the Company, or their contractors, agents, or servants, are guilty of negligence or not, such damage to be recovered by action in any Court of competent jurisdiction.

As to Buildings severed by Company.

(26.) In any case where any house or other building intended to remain standing shall be severed by the Company, the Company shall, to the satisfaction of the Corporation, build up or repair such house or building so as to prevent any unsightly appearance.

Certain Lands of Company to be fenced off from Streets and Roads.

(27.) Where by reason of the construction of the authorized railways it becomes in the opinion of the Corporation, necessary or desirable that any lands of the Company shall be fenced off from any street or road fronting, adjoining, or abutting thereon, the Company shall enclose such lands with walls or suitable fencing, such walls or fencing to be built or constructed of such height as the Corporation shall require, and in all other respects to the satisfaction of the Corporation.

Provisions of Railways Clauses Act, 1845, to apply to Gas and Water Mains of Corporation.

(28.) The provisions of "The Railways Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," contained in sections 18 to 23 inclusive, shall apply to the gas and water mains and pipes of the Corporation, and wherever in those sections the words "Company" or "Society" are used, the same shall, for all the purposes of this Certificate, be held to extend to and include the Corporation.

For securing Continuance of Supply of Gas and Water.

(29.) Wherever the gas or water mains or pipes of the Corporation shall be severed or interfered with by the works authorized by this Certificate, and wherever it is necessary for maintaining the supply of gas or water, to lay additional gas or water mains or pipes, such additional gas and water mains or pipes shall, previous to the severance or interference, be laid by the Corporation at the expense of the Company.

Increased length of Mains to be laid by Corporation at expense of Company.

(30.) If by reason of the construction of the authorized railways any increased length of gas or water mains or pipes shall become necessary, the same shall be laid down by the Corporation at the expense of the Company, according to such plan and in such manner as shall be approved by the Corporation.

Construction or Alteration of certain Sewers and Pipes to be considered Works incidental to Railway.

(31.) For the purposes of this Certificate, any sewer, drain, gas or water main or service pipe, tube or pipe, the construction or alteration of which arises from the making of the said railways, shall be considered works connected with the construction of the railways authorized as aforesaid.

Compensation for Injury from Construction or Working of Railway.

(32.) If the owner, lessee, or occupier of any building of which no part shall be taken shall sustain any damage or injury from the construction or working of the authorized railways, such

owner, lessee, or occupier shall be entitled to compensation in respect thereof, and the amount thereof shall in case of difference be ascertained and determined in the manner provided by "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," for the settling of cases of disputed compensation.

Company to acquire Easements only in or under Streets, &c.

(33.) The Company shall not take any part of the lands shown on the deposited plans or described in the deposited books of reference, as public roads, streets, passages, or public places; but they may acquire and take under the powers and subject to the provisions of this Certificate a perpetual easement for the purpose of making, maintaining, and repairing and using the said railways in tunnel or covered way under such public roads, streets, passages, and places.

Open Cutting west of Borough-road to be screened.

(34.) In case the Company construct their railways and station or works in open cutting to the west of Borough-road, parallel with Argyle-street South, they shall erect and maintain between the said railways and works and Argyle-street South a sufficient wall or walls and screens to the reasonable satisfaction of the Corporation.

Local Rates to be made good during construction of Railway.

(35.) The Company shall from time to time pay to the Corporation all sanitary and other municipal rates, leviable by or payable to the Corporation upon the respective assessments of any lands or property shown upon the deposited plans or a proportion of such rates respectively from the time such lands or property shall be acquired by the Company until the railways and works are completed and assessed to such rates, and the amount of such rates payable by the Company shall be computed according to the assessments of such lands or property in force at the time of the acquisition thereof by the Company, notwithstanding that the buildings thereon or forming part thereof may have afterwards been taken down.

Widening of Woodchurch-road.

(36.) The Company shall give up sufficient land on the south side of Woodchurch-road to widen that road from Storeton-road to Snutch-lane to a uniform width of 45 feet.

Railway to be screened between Woodchurch-road and Storeton-road.

(37.) The railway where it is constructed between Woodchurch road and Storeton-road shall be sufficiently screened by vertical and horizontal screens to the satisfaction of the Corporation.

Bridges and Viaducts over Railway to have Parapets and Screens on each side.

(28.) The Company shall construct and maintain on each side and for the full length of every bridge or viaduct, carrying any street over the railway and works, a substantial parapet or close screen not less (except with the consent of the Corporation) than eight feet in height above the level of the footway on such bridge or viaduct, and shall construct a fence or close screen of the same height in continuation of the parapets, to the extent of 75 yards on either side thereof, or to the nearest buildings in the streets, or to such less distance as the Corporation may approve.

Dimensions and Stability of Bridges and Viaducts carrying Streets, &c, over Railway.

(39.) Except as in this Certificate provided, every bridge, viaduct, or covered way intended to carry streets or roads over the railway shall be constructed by the Company of sufficient strength

and to the satisfaction of the Corporation, and each bridge shall be of the full width between its parapets of the street or road which it is intended to continue and carry over the railway, including the footpaths and areas thereof, and shall have proper provisions to the like satisfaction for carrying the water and gas mains so as to admit of ready access.

Corporation may lay down and repair Sewers and Pipes on Land of the Company under superintendence.

(40.) The Corporation shall at all times have power to lay down, alter, repair, or maintain in a reasonable manner, on or under any lands acquired or to be acquired by the Company, any sewer, drain, main, or pipe, whether for sewerage, drainage, water, or gas; but in the exercise of such powers the Corporation shall act under the superintendence of the Engineer of the Company, and shall interfere as little as possible with the railways and works of the Company.

Bridges crossing Streets or Roads to be lighted.

(41.) The Company shall immediately on the completion of the said bridges, crossing, streets, or roads, or any of them, erect at their own cost and charge a lamp in the centre of each of the said bridges, and such lamps shall thereafter be kept in repair and lighted nightly by and at the expense of the Company during the same time as the public lamps in the borough are lighted.

Bridges over Railway for New Streets.

(42.) The Company shall, if and when they are required by the Corporation, construct and for ever maintain to the satisfaction of the Corporation, a bridge or bridges of sufficient strength over the said railways and works, so as to continue or connect any street or streets which may hereafter be laid out and made, and the parapets of such bridge or bridges shall be of sufficient height and shall form an effectual screen or screens. Provided always that if the Company consider any such bridges to be unnecessary for the accommodation of the public, the Board of Trade, on an appeal to them, shall determine whether such bridge or bridges shall be made or not.

Railway to be Screened within certain distance of Streets.

(43.) The Company shall construct a close screen not less than eight feet in height (except with the consent of the Corporation) along the boundary of the railway where it runs within 75 yards of any road or street, and shall close fence the land of the Company whether or not required for railway purposes where the same shall abut upon any street.

Parapets, Fences, and Screens not to be used for Advertising.

(44.) All parapets, fences, and screens of bridges made by the Company shall be constructed in such reasonably strong and ornamental manner as the Corporation shall approve of, and shall not be used for the posting of bills or other advertising purposes.

Passenger Station between Woodchurch-road and Borough-road.

(45.) The Company shall, upon the completion of the railway, construct, and for ever maintain a Passenger Railway Station with all proper and convenient access and approaches thereto, upon the land or some part thereof, situated between Woodchurch-road and Borough-road, west of Kingsland-road.

As to emission of Smoke from Engines.

(46.) The engines to be used on the railways

shall be constructed and worked so as to consume, as far as practicable, their own smoke.

Dimensions of certain Bridges.

(47.) In constructing the railways and works authorized the Company shall carry the railway over Borough-road and Kingsland-road, by means of bridges of one clear span, giving a headway in the case of the bridge over Borough-road of 17ft. 6in., and in the case of the bridge over Kingsland-road of 15ft. 6in. from the surface of the roads thereunder to the underside of the girders of the said bridges respectively, for the full width of the respective roads and footways thereunder, and the bridges and the approaches thereto respectively shall be of an ornamental character, and shall be well and sufficiently screened and protected, and shall be constructed and maintained in all respects to the satisfaction of the Corporation, and shall be water-tight.

As to line or face of Abutments of certain Bridges.

(48.) The face of the abutments of the bridges over Borough-road and Kingsland-road respectively shall be erected in the line of frontage on each side of the said roads respectively.

Providing for Alteration of certain Sewers.

(49.) The Company shall lower to such level and shall reconstruct the Temple-road sewer with the necessary man-holes and ventilators in such manner, of such capacity and materials, and with such gradient as shall be satisfactory to the Corporation, and the Company shall carry the sewer in Woodchurch-road under their railway, and shall connect the same with the reconstructed sewer in Temple-road and the existing sewer in Woodchurch-road.

Works to be constructed to the satisfaction of Corporation.

(50.) The works shall be constructed in all respects to the satisfaction of the Corporation.

As to compensation for Land fronting Argyle-street.

(51.) In case the Company shall desire to take and purchase the land within the limits of deviation shown on the deposited plans belonging to the Corporation fronting Argyle-street South, then, unless the purchase money or compensation in respect thereof shall be agreed upon by the Corporation and the Company, the same shall be ascertained and determined in the manner provided by "The Lands Clauses Consolidation Act, 1845," for settling cases of disputed compensation.

Costs of Certificate.

21. All costs, charges, and expenses of and incident to the preparing for obtaining and granting of this Certificate or otherwise in relation thereto shall be paid by the Company.
