IT is hereby notified that Earl Granville, K.G., Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has received from the British Vice-Consul at Santo Domingo, a translation of a Law, by which the Dominican Government declares the establishment of a Free Port at San Lorenzo, at the south of Samaná Bay. A copy of the Law in question is subjoined:—

LAW ESTABLISHING A FREE PORT AT SAN LORENZO, IN SAMANÁ BAY.

THE National Congress :

In the name of the Republic :

Whereas the Dominican Republic is called by its geographical position to derive great advantages and profits from the impulse which the opening of the Isthmus of Panamá has to afford to trade and to the shipping ;

Whereas from the 'commercial intercourse between Europe and the isthmus has to derive the urgency of a free port purposely intended as a calling port, and for the establishment of warehouses ;

Whereas one of the principal means to give an impulsion to the progress of the Republic is to establish a place where shipping, commerce, and industry can be fully extended, and that the establishment of a free port and of a commercial city has to result in benefit of the national wealth ;

Whereas the harbour of San Lorenzo, at the south of Samaná Bay, is a most advantageous port on account of its situation, easy access, the depth of its waters, and being at shelter of all winds, and the surrounding land forming a large and rich plain suitable to agriculture, is adequate for a Settlement ;

Whereas the Congress had sanctioned, on the 11th October, 1880, a Law issued on the 15th January of the same year by the Provisional Government, by which Law the harbour selected by the Company of the Isthmus of Panamá in the Republic would be declared a free port :

After reading over three times the following, has issued the present Law :—

CHAPTER I.—*Port and City of San Lorenzo.*

ARTICLE 1. The harbour situated in San Lorenzo Bay, at the south of Samaná Bay, is opened to the import and export trade, and is declared to be a free port.

ART. 2. Full powers are conferred for the establishment on the littoral of San Lorenzo Bay of a city to bear the same name, and to have as a port

the same which by these presents is declared a free port.

ART. 3. The city shall be divided in two by means of a strong iron railing, or by a wall, viz., the free part and the commercial part. The former is intended to contain the port, wharves, public offices, warehouses, and other establishments required by the free port. The latter is specially intended to be the seat of trade with the interior, and shall be the compulsory intermedium of all transactions between the interior and the free port.

CHAPTER II.—*The Shipping.*

ART. 4. All vessels arriving or calling at the free port, loaded or in ballast, or with the object to discharge or to load goods or produces, or to undergo repairs, or for any other purpose, shall be free of any sort of dues.

ART. 5. Vessels shall be allowed to tranship goods from one to another, or by means of boats, lighters, or small crafts, without having to make any declaration, or to perform any formality whatever.

CHAPTER III.—*Importation, Warehousing, and Exportation.*

ART. 6. All goods, prohibited or not prohibited, proceeding from whatever point, and imported into the free port of San Lorenzo, shall be liable to a sole duty of $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on the amount of invoice, yet, on being taken out from the free part to the commercial, or on being transported by land to any other place of the Republic, such goods shall pay the duties in conformity to the Tariffs and Laws in force.

Prohibited articles shall be submitted to the special Laws of the Republic thereon, and such articles which may be of an inflammable or explosive nature shall be deposited in arsenals purposely built for that effect in order to prevent all accidents.

Coals are free of the duty of $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

ART. 7. All goods bound from the free port of San Lorenzo to any other port of the Republic shall pay at their port of destination the corresponding duties, in conformity to the Customs Laws.

ART. 8. Goods deposited for transit as per bill of lading shall be free of the duty of $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on the value of the invoice when they are shipped for their destination, as stated in the aforesaid bill of lading.

It is to be well understood that goods bound to the free port shall not be allowed to be declared in transit.

ART. 9. The term affixed for the above-referred transit shall not exceed thirty days, not counting the day of their arrival and that of their departure. Should the term affixed for the deposit of goods in transit exceed the term, such goods shall be liable to the duty of $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on the invoice, as mentioned in Article 6.

ART. 10. All products proceeding from the interior, and imported by land into the free port, shall pay at the custom-houses of the Republic the export dues to which they are liable in conformity to the laws.

ART. 11. All products shipped at the ports of the Republic and bound to the free port of San Lorenzo shall pay at the aforesaid ports their export dues in accordance to the Tariffs and Laws in force.

CHAPTER IV.—*Regulations of the Port, and Formalities.*

ART. 12. Public offices required for the administration of the free port for the re-collection of dues on the goods and products shipped or exported shall be established by the Executive Power.

ART. 13. Invoices and receipts, duly certified by the Government's Agent, and wherein are to be stated the quantity of packages, the class and quality, the number, marks, weight, and measure of the goods shipped at the free port of San Lorenzo, and bound to other ports of the Republic, shall be delivered, in order that such goods may pay their duties at the ports of destination.

ART. 14. The Customs Collectors shall equally dispatch, under receipt and certified invoice, the products proceeding from the ports of the Republic, or from the interior, and imported in the free port. It shall be further certified that such products have paid the export dues.

ART. 15. Goods proceeding from San Lorenzo shall be examined by the Customs Officers, and should such goods not be in conformity to the invoice, either in the quantity, substitution of one class by another, or any other want of formality, or any fraud, the defaulters shall incur penalties as stated in the Navigation Laws.

ART. 16. The introduction or extraction of products and goods performed in a clandestine manner, with the object to avoid the payment of dues, shall be punished in conformity to the Navigation Laws.

CHAPTER V.

ART. 17. The Executive Power shall determine the proceedings to be followed for the re-collection of the $1\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. for deposit of the dues on the products imported at the free port, of the dues on the goods exported therefrom, and shall in the same manner regulate all proceedings concerning the intercourse between the free port and other ports and the Customs.

ART. 18. The Government shall establish repairing docks, wharves, public offices, warehouses, and all the works needed in order to render the Port of San Lorenzo suitable for the object intended by the present Law.

ART. 19. As soon as the port and free part of San Lorenzo shall be in condition to be used as a free port, the present Law, after a previous declaration given by Government shall be in due force.

ART. 20. In order to give full security to the free trade and to industry at the free port, the Executive Power shall in due time declare the neutrality of the said port in case of war between two or more nations, and in accordance to the international laws.

ART. 21. The present Law annuls the Law of Congress of the 11th October, 1880, in reference

to the port to be selected in the Republic by the Company of the opening of the Isthmus of Panamá, as also any other Law, Decree, or Resolution contrary to the present Law.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 4th day of July, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area (namely),—so much of the parish of Husbands Bosworth, in the county of Leicester, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north the road leading from Welford Station to Husbands Bosworth, on the east the road leading from Husbands Bosworth to Welford, on the south the boundary of the parish of Husbands Bosworth, and on the west the London and North-Western Railway,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-first day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Rio de Janeiro, reporting an alteration in the Brazilian tariff on kerseymeres, cassinettes, and broad cloths. The following is a statement of the tariff classification substituted for Articles 556 and 578 of the existing Brazilian Tariff:—

NOTE.—Kerseymeres, cassinettes, and cloths, weighing 450 grammes or less per square meter, including the selvages, when composed of pure wool or mixed with any other material, and weighing 400 grammes or less when of wool and cotton equally mixed, shall be comprised in the second of the above categories. All stuffs exceeding the aforesaid weights shall be classified in the first category.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following Telegrams from the Governors of Gibraltar and Malta and the High Commissioner of Cyprus respectively:—

"Gibraltar, 3rd July.—Three weeks' quarantine against Egypt."

"Malta, 3rd July.—Arrivals, Egypt and Ottoman Ports, Red Sea, twenty-one days' quarantine after disinfection. Passengers not allowed to land. Vessels with cholera not admitted."

"Nicosia, 2nd July.—Ten days' quarantine for arrivals from Egypt. Susceptible goods repelled. No persons will be allowed to land after tomorrow except those who have Cyprus domiciles, or who come on Government business."

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Havre, reporting that vessels from Egypt, including those which come through the Suez Canal, will, on arrival at Havre or other ports of the Lower Seine, be treated as if they had foul bills of health, and will not be admitted until they have undergone medical inspection and, if necessary, quarantine.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs information to the effect that the Ottoman Board of Health have subjected arrivals from Cyprus to the same quarantine (i.e., 10 to 15 days) as vessels from Egypt, pending information being received at Constantinople as to the measures of quarantine taken by Cyprus against Egypt.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Telegram from Her Majesty's Minister at Athens, reporting that vessels arriving from Egypt, including those from Port Said, are subjected to 11 days' quarantine in Greece. Vessels which come through the Suez Canal will be allowed to touch only at Corfu, Delos, and Salamis.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs copies of Italian Ordinances of Maritime Health, which provide that vessels arriving in Italy from Egypt with clean bills of health shall be subject to five days' quarantine of observation with certain sanitary precautions, and that vessels on board which there have been suspicious cases of illness during the passage shall be subject to ten days' strict quarantine, together with measures of cleansing and disinfection. The importation from Egypt of scraps, rags, and old clothes continues strictly prohibited.
