THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Rome:

"Decree of Minister of Interior, dated 3rd July, imposes 10 days observation for ships arriving from Egypt which have been more than 10 days at sea; 15 days of observation for those less than 10 days at sea; 20 days rigorous quarantine for suspected ships or for ships coming from Tripoli, Malta, Cyprus, and ports beyond the Suez Canal, whatever may be their bill of health."

Her Majesty's Consul at Genoa reports by telegraph that vessels as above mentioned arriving in his district will have to perform their quarantine at Spezia.
