THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following Telegram from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Rome:—

"Decree of Minister of Interior, dated 3rd July, imposes 10 days observation for ships arriving from Egypt which have been more than 10 days at sea; 15 days of observation for those less than 10 days at sea; 20 days rigorous quarantine for suspected ships or for ships coming from Tripoli, Malta, Cyprus, and ports beyond the Suez Canal, whatever may be their bill of health."

Her Majesty's Consul at Genoa reports by telegraph that vessels as above mentioned arriving in his district will have to perform their quarantine at Spezia.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs information to the effect that the Government of Austria and Hungary has imposed ten days quarantine of observation on ordinary vessels coming from Lower Egypt, and five days on steamers which have a certified doctor and have had no suspicious case during the voyage.

Vessels with a certified doctor and having had no suspicious circumstance will be allowed to count the period of their voyage as part of the period of observation.

Vessels from other ports of Egypt will be subject to rigorous medical examination.

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 7th day of July, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) so much of the parish of Hartington, in the county of

Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, Crowdicote-road from the Four-lane Ends to Crowdicote Bridge, and the river Dove to the foot-bridge over that river, and the road leading from that point to Sterndale from the west to the north, by the foot-road to Hurdlow-lane, and by the latter to the Old Railway, and then by the Old Railway to the foot-road leading through The Slack from north to east, by The Slack to Crongston-lane from east to south, and by Crongston-lane to Four-lane Ends on the Crowdicote-road from south to west, and (2.) so much of the parishes of Middleton, and Wirksworth, in the county of Derby, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the Engine-house on High Peak Railway down to Hopton Wood Wharf, thence to Coal Hills, then across the highway to Dark-lane End, across Dean Hollow, up to the top of Middleton, round by the Duke of Wellington Inn, up Water-lane, on to the occupation-road on Middleton Moor, and thence on to the Engine House on High Peak aforesaid,—which were declared by Orders of Council dated respectively the thirtieth day of March, and the thirteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

ARTICLE III.—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk, under the authority of this Order, a salary at the rate of Sixty Pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as the Local Government Board may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of "The Apportionment Act, 1870," and shall be paid quarterly, at the usual Feast Days in the year, namely, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, Lady Day, and Midsummer Day.

ARTICLE V.—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish.
