Japan, China, East India Islands, East India, Harbours in Red Sea, Egypt, Fez, Mequinez and Dar-el-Baida in Morocco, and Uruguayana in Brazil.

Vessels with persons on board sick with cholera, and destined for a Norwegian Port, should be directed through the Pilot to the Quarantine Establishment at Christiansand. In other harbours shipmasters will be liable to keep their sick on board, and in the meanwhile to remain in quarantine. The foregoing is for the information and guidance of all concerned, &c., &c.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Rome the following translation of a Decree in respect of quarantine which has been issued by the Government of Italy:—

1883

Ordinance of Maritime Health. No. 9.

THE Ministry of the Interior, with reference to the law of March 20, 1865, cap. C, on public health, and to the Ministerial Instructions of December 26, 1871, with reference also to the Ordinance No. 8 of the 28th ultimo, concerning the treatment in quarantine of vessels arriving from Egypt, official information having been received of the appearance of cholera in Alexandria, considering it therefore necessary to have recourse to exceptional measures of precaution, and to extend these measures to coasts compromised by their neighbourhood to the infected places or suspected on account of the appearance of cases of cholera which are declared sporadic, and also to coasts for which the present measures of quarantine are considered insufficient.—Decrees:—

ART. I. The quarantine imposed on vessels arriving from Egypt will be regulated as follows from to-day's date:—Ten days of observation for vessels with a clean bill of health during a passage of more than ten days. Fifteen days of observation for vessels with a clean bill of health during a passage of less than ten days. Twenty days rigorous quarantine for vessels which may have had even the very slightest suspicion of

illness among the persons on board, or if determined to be in an unsatisfactory sanitary condition, whatever length the passage may have been.

ART. II. The treatment provided by the preceding article will be, until further orders, applied also to ships that may arrive after to-day's date from the harbours of the Regency of Tripoli, of the Islands of Malta and Cyprus, and from the ports beyond the Suez Canal, whatever sort of bill of health they may possess.

ART. III. Vessels arriving from Egypt, the Regency of Tripoli, Cyprus, and the ports beyond the Suez Canal which are obliged to go through a quarantine of observation, may betake themselves in order to undergo it to a harbour provided with a lazaretto, whenever the means of safe anchorage in perfectly isolated spots are lacking in the port in which they arrive.

ART. IV. Vessels obliged to undergo rigorous quarantine should direct their course without further intimation to a harbour with a lazaretto.

ART. V. In the quarantine of observation the sanitary measures of washing and cleansing must be fulfilled as provided by Art. 13 of the Ministerial Instructions of December 26th, 1871, and in rigorous quarantine it is necessary to disembark in the lazaretto the goods susceptible of conveying infection of the first class, and to disinfect them.

ART. VI. The prohibition of the importation of scraps, rags, and old unwashed clothes from Egypt remains unaltered, and from to-day's date is extended also to the ports mentioned in Art. II.

ART. VII. Vessels arriving from the Austro-Illyrian and Dalmatian ports will be subjected, from to-day's date, to a quarantine of observation for five days, and to the execution of the accompanying hygienic measures.

The prefects of the maritime provinces are charged with the execution of this present Ordinance.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the sixth year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth, chapter seventy-eight, it is, amongst other things, enacted, "that it shall and may be lawful for the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, to make such Order as they shall see necessary and expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in any particular case or cases, with respect to any vessel arriving and having any infectious disease or distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious disease or distemper may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection, although such vessel shall not have come from any place from which His Majesty, his heirs and successors, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, may have adjudged and declared it probable that the Plague, or any such infectious disease or distemper may be brought, and also with respect to the persons, goods, wares, and merchandize, and other articles, as aforesaid, on board the same; and in case of any infectious disease or distemper appearing or breaking out in the United Kingdom or the islands aforesaid, to make such Orders and give such direction, in order to cut off all communication between any persons infected with any such disease or distemper, and the rest of His Majesty's subjects, as shall appear to the Lords or others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, to be necessary and expedient for that purpose, and likewise to make such Orders as they shall see fit, for shortening the time of quarantine to be performed by particular vessels or particular persons, goods, wares, merchandize, or any other articles, or for absolutely or conditionally releasing them, or any of them, from quarantine; and all such Orders so made by the Lords or others of the Privy Council, or any two or more of them, as aforesaid, shall be as good, valid, and effectual, to all intents and purposes, as well with respect to the Commander, Master, or other person, having the charge of any vessel, and all other persons on board the same, as with respect to any other persons having any intercourse or communication with them, and to the penalties, forfeitures, and punishments to which they may respectively become liable, as any Order or Orders made by His Majesty, His heirs, and successors, by and with the advice of His or their Privy Council, concerning quarantine, notified by Proclamation or published in the London Gazette."

And whereas by "The Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1867," it is (among other things) enacted (section fifty-six) as follows:—

"Every ship having on board any person affected with a dangerous or infectious disorder

"shall be deemed to be within the provisions of the Act of the sixth year of King George the Fourth, chapter seventy-eight, intituled 'An Act to repeal the several laws relating to Quarantine and to make other provisions in lieu thereof,' although such ship has not commenced the voyage, or has come from or is bound for some place in the United Kingdom; and nothing in this Act contained shall interfere with or prevent the execution of any orders, regulations, or restrictions to be made by the Lords and others of Her Majesty's Privy Council pursuant to the said Act; and any expenses incurred by any Local Authority in carrying into effect such orders, regulations, or restrictions, shall be deemed to be expenses incurred by them in carrying into effect this Act; and all penalties imposed by the said Act of the sixth year of King George the Fourth, chapter seventy-eight, may be reduced by the Justices or Court having jurisdiction in respect of such penalties, to such sum as the Justices or Court think just."

And whereas the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council by an Order bearing date the twenty-eighth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, did make certain rules, orders, and regulations.

And whereas Cholera is now prevalent in certain parts of Egypt with which this country has communication, and it is expedient that in place of the rules and regulations made by the said Order, other rules and regulations as hereinafter contained should be made.

Now, therefore, the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue of the powers in this behalf by the recited enactments or otherwise in them vested, do hereby rescind all such rules, orders, and regulations in the above-recited Order contained, which apply to Scotland, and, except in so far as they may apply, to any proceedings now pending, and they do hereby order as follows:—

Definitions.

ART. 1. In this Order—

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat;

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs;

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship;

The term "Cholera" includes Choleraic Diarrhoea;

The term "Local Authority" has the same meaning as in the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1867.

The term "Medical Officer of Health" includes any duly qualified Medical Practitioner appointed by a Local Authority to act in the execution of this Order;

For the purposes of this Order,—

Every ship shall be deemed infected with Cholera in which there is or has been during the voyage, or during the stay of such ship in a port in the course of such voyage, any case of Cholera.

I.—Regulations as to Detention by Officers of Customs.

ART. 2. If any Officer of Customs, on the arrival within the limits of any port in Scotland of any ship, ascertain from the master of such ship, or otherwise, or have reason to suspect, that the ship is infected with Cholera, he shall detain such ship, and order the master forthwith to moor or anchor the same in such position as such Officer

of Customs shall direct ; and thereupon the master shall forthwith moor or anchor the ship accordingly.

ART. 3. Whilst such ship shall be so detained, no person shall leave the same.

ART. 4. The Officer of Customs detaining any ship as aforesaid, shall forthwith give notice thereof, and of the cause of such detention, to the Local Authority of the place where the ship shall be so detained.

ART. 5. Such detention by the Officer of Customs shall cease as soon as the ship shall have been duly visited and examined by the Medical Officer of Health ; or, if the ship shall, upon such examination, be found to be infected with Cholera, as soon as the same shall be moored or anchored in pursuance of Art. 10 of this Order.

Provided, that if the examination be not commenced within twelve hours after notice given as aforesaid, the ship shall, on the expiration of the said twelve hours, be released from detention.

II.—Regulations as to Local Authorities.

ART. 6.—Every Local Authority within whose district persons are likely to be landed from any ship coming foreign shall, as speedily as practicable, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place within the jurisdiction or district of the Local Authority where any ship may be moored or anchored, for the purpose of Art. 10 ; and shall make provision for the reception of Cholera patients and persons suffering from illness removed under Arts. 13 and 14.

ART. 7.—The Local Authority, on notice being given to them by an Officer of Customs under this Order, shall forthwith cause the ship in regard to which such notice shall have been given, to be visited and examined by their Medical Officer of Health for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is infected with Cholera.

ART. 8.—The Medical Officer of Health if he have reason to believe that any ship within the jurisdiction or district of the Local Authority, whether examined by the Officer of Customs or not, is infected with Cholera shall, or if she have come from a place infected with Cholera, may, visit and examine such ship, for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is so infected ; and the Master of such ship shall permit the same to be so visited and examined.

ART. 9.—If the Medical Officer of Health on making such examination as aforesaid (whether under Art 7 or 8), shall be of opinion that the ship is infected, he shall give a certificate in duplicate in the following Form, or to the like effect, and shall deliver one copy to the Master and retain the other or transmit it to the Local Authority.

ART. 10.—The master of every ship so certified to be infected with Cholera shall thereupon moor or anchor her at the place fixed for that purpose under Art. 6, and she shall remain there until the requirements of this Order have been duly fulfilled.

ART. 11.—No person shall leave any such ship until the examination hereinafter mentioned shall have been made,

ART. 12.—The Medical Officer of Health shall, as soon as possible after any such ship has been certified to be infected with Cholera, examine all persons on board of the same, and all persons who shall not be certified by him, as hereafter mentioned, shall be permitted to land immediately on their giving their names and the places of their destination.

ART. 13.—Every person certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from Cholera, shall be dealt with under any regulations that may have been made by the Local Authority under Section 55 of the Public Health (Scotland) Act, 1867 ; or, where no such regulations shall have been made, shall be removed, if the condition of the patient admit of it, to some hospital or place previously appointed for that purpose by the said Authority ; and no person so removed shall leave such hospital or place until the Medical Officer of Health shall have certified that such person is free from the said disease.

If any person suffering from Cholera cannot be removed, the ship shall remain subject, for the purposes of this Order, to the control of the Medical Officer of Health ; and the infected person shall not be removed from or leave the ship, except with the consent in writing of the Medical Officer of Health.

ART. 14.—Any person certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from any illness which such Officer suspects may prove to be Cholera, may either be detained on board the ship for any period not exceeding two days, or be taken to some hospital or other place previously appointed by the Local Authority, and detained there for a like period, in order that it may be ascertained whether the illness is or is not Cholera.

Any such person who, while so detained, shall be certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from Cholera, shall be dealt with as provided by Article 13 of this Order.

ART. 15.—The Medical Officer of Health shall in the case of every ship certified to be infected, give directions, and take such steps as may appear to him to be necessary, for preventing the spread of infection, and the Master of the said ship shall forthwith carry into execution such directions as shall be so given to him.

ART. 16.—In the event of any death from Cholera taking place on board of such ship while so detained, the Master shall as directed by the Local Authority or the Medical Officer of Health either cause the dead body to be taken out to sea, and committed to the deep, properly loaded to prevent its rising, or shall deliver it into the charge of the said Authority for interment, and the Authority shall thereupon have the same interred.

ART. 17.—The Master shall cause any articles that may have been soiled with Cholera discharges to be destroyed, and the clothing and bedding and other articles of personal use likely to retain infection which have been used by any person who may have suffered from Cholera on board such ship, or who, having left such ship, shall have suffered from Cholera during the stay of such ship in any Port, to be disinfected or (if necessary) destroyed ; and if the Master shall have neglected to do so before the ship arrives in Port, he shall forthwith, or upon the direction of the Local Authority, or the Medical Officer of Health, cause the same to be disinfected or destroyed, as the case may require ; and if the said Master neglect to comply with such direction within a reasonable time, the Authority shall cause the same to be carried into execution.

ART. 18.—The Master shall cause the ship to

be disinfected, and every article therein, other than those last described, which may probably be infected with Cholera, to be disinfected or destroyed, according to the directions of the Medical Officer of Health.

Cholera Regulations.—Port of London.

To the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London ;—

To all Officers of Customs ;—

To the Medical Officer of Health of the said Port Sanitary Authority ;—

To all Masters of Ships ;

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order bearing date the 17th day of July, 1873, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of the disease ;

And whereas We have, by an Order of this date, rescinded the said Order, except in so far as it may apply to any proceedings now pending ;

And whereas Cholera is now prevalent in certain parts of Egypt with which this country has communication, and, it is expedient that, in place of the rules and regulations made by the said Order, other rules and regulations as herein-after contained should be made with regard to the Port of London :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, do, by this Our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 52 of the Sanitary Act, 1866, and Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following rules and regulations, and declare that they shall be enforced and executed by the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of London :—

Definitions.

ART. 1.—In this Order—

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat ;

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs ;

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship;

The term "Cholera" includes Choleraic Diarrhoea;

The term "Sanitary Authority" means the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London;

The term "Medical Officer of Health" includes any duly qualified Medical Practitioner appointed by the Sanitary Authority to act in the execution of this Order;

For the purposes of this Order every ship shall be deemed infected with Cholera in which there is or has been during the voyage, or during the stay of such ship in a port in the course of such voyage, any case of Cholera.

I.—Regulations as to Detention by Officers of Customs.

ART. 2.—If any Officer of Customs, on the arrival of any ship in the Port of London, ascertain from the Master of such ship or otherwise, or have reason to suspect, that the ship is infected with Cholera, he shall detain such ship, and order the Master forthwith to moor or anchor the same in such position as such Officer of Customs shall direct; and thereupon the Master shall forthwith moor or anchor the ship accordingly.

ART. 3.—Whilst such ship shall be so detained, no person shall leave the same.

ART. 4.—The Officer of Customs detaining any ship as aforesaid shall forthwith give notice thereof, and of the cause of such detention, to the Sanitary Authority.

ART. 5.—Such detention by the Officer of Customs shall cease as soon as the ship shall have been duly visited and examined by the Medical Officer of Health; or, if the ship shall, upon such examination, be found to be infected with Cholera, as soon as the same shall be moored or anchored in pursuance of Art. 10 of this Order.

Provided, that if the examination be not commenced within twelve hours after notice given as aforesaid, the ship shall, on the expiration of the said twelve hours, be released from detention.

II.—Regulations as to Sanitary Authorities.

ART. 6.—The Sanitary Authority shall, as speedily as practicable, with the approval of the Chief Officer of Customs of the port, fix some place within the jurisdiction of the Sanitary Authority where any ship may be moored, or anchored, for the purpose of Art. 10; and shall make provision for the reception of Cholera patients and persons suffering from illness removed under Arts. 13 and 14.

ART. 7.—The Sanitary Authority, on notice being given to them by an Officer of Customs, under this Order, shall forthwith cause the ship in regard to which such notice shall have been given, to be visited and examined by the Medical Officer of Health for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is infected with Cholera.

ART. 8.—The Medical Officer of Health, if he have reason to believe that any ship within the jurisdiction of the Sanitary Authority, whether examined by the Officer of Customs or not, is infected with Cholera, shall, or if she have come from a place infected with Cholera, may, visit and examine such ship, for the purpose of ascertaining whether she is so infected; and the Master of such ship shall permit the same to be so visited and examined.

ART. 9.—If the Medical Officer of Health on making such examination as aforesaid (whether under Art. 7 or 8), shall be of opinion that the ship is infected, he shall give a certificate in dupli-

cate in the following Form, or to the like effect, and shall deliver one copy to the Master and retain the other or transmit it to the Sanitary Authority.

ART. 10.—The master of every ship so certified to be infected with Cholera shall thereupon moor or anchor her at the place fixed for that purpose under Art. 6, and she shall remain there until the requirements of this Order have been duly fulfilled.

ART. 11.—No person shall leave any such ship until the examination hereinafter mentioned shall have been made.

ART. 12.—The Medical Officer of Health shall, as soon as possible after any such ship has been certified to be infected with Cholera, examine all persons on board of the same, and all persons who shall not be certified by him, as hereafter mentioned, shall be permitted to land immediately on their giving their names and the places of their destinations.

ART. 13.—Every person certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from Cholera, shall be dealt with under any regulations that may have been made by the Sanitary Authority under Section 29 of the Sanitary Act, 1866; or, where no such regulations shall have been made, shall be removed, if the condition of the patient admit of it, to some hospital or place previously appointed for that purpose by the said Authority; and no person so removed shall leave such hospital or place until the Medical Officer of Health shall have certified that such person is free from the said disease.

If any person suffering from Cholera cannot be removed, the ship shall remain subject, for the purposes of this Order, to the control of the Medical Officer of Health; and the infected person shall not be removed from or leave the ship, except with the consent in writing of the Medical Officer of Health.

ART. 14.—Any person certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from any illness which such Officer suspects may prove to be Cholera, may either be detained on board the ship for any period not exceeding two days, or taken to some hospital or other place previously appointed by the Sanitary Authority, and detained there for a like period, in order that it may be ascertained whether the illness is or is not Cholera.

Any such person who, while so detained, shall be certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from Cholera, shall be dealt with as provided by Article 13 of this Order.

ART. 15.—The Medical Officer of Health shall in the case of every ship certified to be infected, give directions, and take such steps as may appear to him to be necessary, for preventing the spread of infection, and the Master of the said ship shall forthwith carry into execution such directions as shall be so given to him.

ART. 16.—In the event of any death from Cholera taking place on board of such ship while so detained, the Master shall, as directed by the Sanitary Authority or the Medical Officer of Health, either cause the dead body to be taken out

to sea, and committed to the deep, properly loaded to prevent its rising, or shall deliver it into the charge of the said Authority for interment; and the Authority shall thereupon have the same interred.

ART. 17.—The Master shall cause any articles that may have been soiled with Cholera discharges to be destroyed, and the clothing and bedding and other articles of personal use likely to retain infection which have been used by any person who may have suffered from Cholera on board such ship, or who, having left such ship, shall have suffered from Cholera during the stay of such ship in any Port, to be disinfected or (if necessary) destroyed; and if the Master shall have neglected to do so before the ship arrives in port, he shall forthwith or upon the direction of the Sanitary Authority, or the Medical Officer of Health, cause the same to be disinfected or destroyed, as the case may require; and if the said Master neglect to comply with such direction within a reasonable time, the Authority shall cause the same to be carried into execution.

ART. 18.—The Master shall cause the ship to be disinfected, and every article therein, other than those last described, which may probably be infected with Cholera, to be disinfected or destroyed, according to the directions of the Medical Officer of Health.

ART. 12.—The Medical Officer of Health shall, as soon as possible after any such ship has been certified to be infected with Cholera, examine all persons on board of the same, and all persons who shall not be certified by him, as hereafter mentioned, shall be permitted to land immediately on their giving their names and the places of their destination.

ART. 13.—Every person certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from Cholera, shall be dealt with under any regulations that may have been made by the Sanitary Authority under Section 125 of the Public Health Act, 1875; or, where no such regulations shall have been made, shall be removed, if the condition of the patient admit of it, to some hospital or place previously appointed for that purpose by the said Authority; and no person so removed shall leave such hospital or place until the Medical Officer of Health shall have certified that such person is free from the said disease.

If any person suffering from Cholera cannot be removed, the ship shall remain subject, for the purposes of this Order, to the control of the Medical Officer of Health; and the infected person shall not be removed from or leave the ship, except with the consent in writing of the Medical Officer of Health.

ART. 14.—Any person certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from any illness which such Officer suspects may prove to be Cholera, may either be detained on board the ship for any period not exceeding two days, or be taken to some hospital or other place previously appointed by the Sanitary Authority, and detained there, for a like period, in order that it may be ascertained whether the illness is or is not Cholera.

Any such person who, while so detained, shall be certified by the Medical Officer of Health to be suffering from Cholera, shall be dealt with as provided by Article 13 of this Order.

ART. 15.—The Medical Officer of Health shall in the case of every ship certified to be infected, give directions, and take such steps as may appear to him to be necessary, for preventing the spread of infection, and the Master of the said ship shall forthwith carry into execution such directions as shall be so given to him.

ART. 16.—In the event of any death from Cholera taking place on board of such ship while so detained, the Master shall, as directed by the Sanitary Authority or the Medical Officer of Health, either cause the dead body to be taken out to sea, and committed to the deep, properly loaded to prevent its rising, or shall deliver it into the charge of the said Authority for interment; and the Authority shall thereupon have the same interred.

ART. 17.—The Master shall cause any articles that may have been soiled with Cholera discharges to be destroyed, and the clothing and bedding and other articles of personal use likely to retain infection which have been used by any person who may have suffered from Cholera on board such ship, or who, having left such ship, shall have suffered from Cholera during the stay of such ship in any Port, to be disinfected or (if necessary) destroyed; and if the Master shall have neglected to do so before the ship arrives in port, he shall forthwith, or upon the direction of the Sanitary Authority, or the Medical Officer of Health, cause the same to be disinfected or destroyed, as the case may require; and if the said Master neglect to comply with such direction within a reasonable time, the Authority shall cause the same to be carried into execution.

ART. 18.—The Master shall cause the ship to be disinfected, and every article therein, other than those last described, which may probably be infected with Cholera, to be disinfected or destroyed, according to the directions of the Medical Officer of Health.
