

In the High Court of Justice.—Chancery Division.  
Mr. Justice Chitty.

In the Matter of the Companies Acts, 1862 and 1867, and in the Matter of the New Cambrian Mining and Smelting Company Limited.

BY an Order made by Mr. Justice Chitty in the above matter, dated the 23rd day of June, 1883, on the petition of the New Cambrian Mining and Smelting Company Limited, it was ordered that the voluntary winding up of the said Company be continued, but subject to the supervision of the above Honourable Court; and that any of the proceedings under the said voluntary winding up might be adopted as the Judge should think fit; and the creditors, contributories, and Liquidator of the said Company, and all other persons interested, were to be at liberty to apply to the Judge at Chambers as there might be occasion. And it was ordered that the costs of the petitioning Company, and of the shareholders supporting the petition, should be taxed by the Taxing Master, and be paid out of the assets of the Company, and that the time within which the said Order was to be advertised in the London Gazette pursuant to the General Order of the 11th November, 1862, should be enlarged until the 13th July, 1883.—Dated the 9th day of July, 1883.
