(SWINE-FEVER.)

**A**T the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 17th day of July, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely), — so much of the hamlet of Weedon, in the parish of Hardwick, in the county of Buckingham, as lies to the east or north-east of the main-road leading from Aylesbury to Buckingham, except the lands, yards, and outbuildings in the said hamlet as are in the occupation of Edward John Clift, — which was declared by Order of Council dated the twenty-third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be an Area infected with swine-fever, is hereby declared to be free from swine-fever, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with swine-fever.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the eighteenth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

## THE CONTAGIOUS DISEASES (ANIMALS) ACT, 1878.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

**T**HE following Areas are now *Areas Infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease* under the above-mentioned Act (except the lines of railway within those Areas as far as those lines are used or required for the transit of animals through those Areas, without untrucking):—

**Argyleshire.**—The united parishes of Kilmore and Kilbride, in the county of Argyle.

**Berkshire.**—At Shellingford, in the county of Berks, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, from the corner of the Brick-Kiln-yard in the occupation of Henry Thomas Godfrey where it touches the Wantage main-road along the fence to the north-west corner of the Cricket Ground, thence along the fence at the west side of the Cricket Ground to the Faringdon Railway, thence along the said Railway to the Bridge over the Fernham-road, from thence along the road through Shelling-

ford village to Shellingford Lodge on the Wantage main-road, thence across the Wantage main-road and along the Hatford-road to the footpath on the left of the said road leading towards Wadley, thence along the said footpath through the Wadley Fair Ground to the bottom of the Folly Hill, and from thence in a straight line to the point first described.

**Essex.**—At Rood Street, in the parish of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Great Eastern Railway and a wood known as Rough Tallies on the south, and thence over the main-road leading from Epping to Ongar taking three fields along the side thereof in the occupation of William Simmonds adjoining the said road, thence by an Old Green-lane to the road from Weald Church, continuing along that road towards and unto the main-road from Harlow to Epping, thence to Thornwood Gate, and including the whole of that part of Epping Forest known as Lower Forest.

**GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board altering General Accounts Order: Appointment of Stocktaker.**

Salford Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Salford Union, in the County of Lancaster;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed (among others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Salford Union, it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts, as regards the stock remaining in store:

And whereas by an Order of the Local Government Board, dated the 1st day of August, 1882, similar requirements are made with respect to certain Accounts prescribed by that Order for the Infirmary of the said Union:

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse and Infirmary belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties hereinafter set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:

**ARTICLE I.**—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Salford Union may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as hereinafter set forth.

**ARTICLE II.**—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations as to the appointment of Officers, in force in the said Union for the time being.

**ARTICLE III.**—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as the Local Government Board shall from time to time direct or approve.

**ARTICLE IV.**—Every person appointed under this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians subject to the consent of the Local Government Board, or be removed by the Local Government Board, or be proved to be insane by evidence which that Board shall deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to the Local Government Board of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.

Provided nevertheless, that the Guardians may, if they think fit, with the assent of the Local Government Board, appoint a person or persons, to discharge the duties hereby prescribed for the Stocktaker, for a limited period only.

**ARTICLE V.**—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and at the Infirmary, and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time

when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stock of clothing at the Workhouse and at the Infirmary, and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

**ARTICLE VI.**—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V., the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

quantities of stock remaining in store.

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

**ARTICLE VII.**—The Master of the Workhouse and the Steward of the Infirmary shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V., submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

**ARTICLE VIII.**—The Master of the Workhouse and the Steward of the Infirmary shall lay each of the said Books of Account before the Guardians, at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

**ARTICLE IX.**—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Orders, dated the fourteenth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven, and the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two.

WE, whose names are hereunder written, having been sworn this eleventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, before the Queen's Remembrancer, at Goldsmiths' Hall, in the city of London, have made the Assays and Trials of Her Majesty's Gold and Silver Coins in the Pyx of the Mint, and which, according to accounts produced by the Officers of the Mint, were coined in the said Mint from the first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, both days inclusive. We ascertained that the number of coins, both of gold and silver, in each packet produced to us, corresponded with the number which the Officers of the Mint represented it to contain, and we took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Gold coins, making altogether fifteen half-sovereigns or ten shilling pieces, and we weighed each of the said coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy prescribed in the First Schedule of the Coinage Act, 1870. We found that there was no variation from the standard of weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act, on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said Gold coins so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the Standard Gold Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation thereof from the Standard of Fineness specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act was minus one-tenth (or .0001) and, therefore, that the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Gold coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from each residue five half-sovereigns, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-sovereigns weighed respectively,—the first 61.653, the second 61.638, the third 61.641, the fourth 61.635, and the fifth 61.633. We then assayed the said five half-sovereigns separately, we found the millesimal fineness of such half-sovereigns to be 916.4, 916.6, 916.4, 916.6, 916.5 respectively. We also took a coin or coins from each of such packets of Silver coins, making altogether eleven half-crowns, ten florins, eighteen shillings, eleven sixpences, one fourpenny piece, ten threepenny pieces, one twopenny piece, and one penny piece, and weighed each of the said Silver coins separately, so as to ascertain whether they were within the remedy of the said First Schedule of the said Coinage Act, 1870. We found that there was no variation from the Standard of Weight specified in the said First Schedule of the said Act on the whole of such coins. We then melted the said Silver coins, so taken out and weighed, into an ingot, and assayed such ingot, comparing it with the Standard Silver Trial Plate produced by the Board of Trade, so as to ascertain whether the metal was within the remedy as to fineness prescribed in the said First Schedule to the said Act, and we found that the amount of variation from the Standard of Fineness

specified in the said First Schedule to the said Act, was minus five ten-thousandths (or .0005), and, therefore, that the said metal was within the prescribed remedy as to fineness. We weighed the residue of the said Silver coins in bulk, and we ascertained that they were within the remedy as to weight. We then took from such residue one half-crown, one florin, one shilling, one sixpence, and one threepenny piece, and weighed and assayed them separately, and we found that such half-crown weighed 218.431, that such florin weighed 174.745, that such shilling weighed 87.162, that such sixpence weighed 43.466, and that such threepenny piece weighed 21.838. We then assayed the said florin, the said shilling, the said sixpence, and the said threepenny piece separately, and we found the millesimal fineness of such half-crown to be 924.91, of such florin to be 925.0, of such shilling to be 925.3, of such sixpence to be 925.5, and of such threepenny piece to be 925.8.

To the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the Parish of Folkestone, in the County of Kent:—

And to all others whom it may concern.

**WHEREAS** the population of the said Parish of Folkestone, according to the last Census, exceeds two thousand persons;

And whereas at a Meeting of the Vestry of the said Parish, held, pursuant to public notice in that behalf, it was resolved,—

“That the Local Government Board be requested to issue an Order under their Seal of Office directing that the Act passed in the 14th year of the reign of Her present Majesty (13 and 14 Vict., cap. 57), intituled ‘An Act to prevent the holding of ‘Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, ‘and for regulating the Appointment of ‘Vestry Clerks,’ shall be applied to and put in force in the Parish of Folkestone, with regard to that portion of it only which relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk, and that the amount of salary to be assigned to the Vestry Clerk be £20 per annum for the performance of the duties specified in clauses 1, 2, 3, 4, and 14 of ‘Section 7 of the said Act.’”

And whereas the Churchwardens of the said Parish have made application in writing to the Local Government Board, pursuant to the above resolution:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby Order as follows:—

**ARTICLE I.**—So much of the Act passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of Her Majesty, intituled “An Act to prevent the holding of “Vestry or other Meetings in Churches, and for “regulating the Appointment of Vestry Clerks,” as relates to the appointment of a Vestry Clerk,

shall forthwith be applied to and be put in force within the said Parish of Folkestone.

**ARTICLE II.**—The duties of the Vestry Clerk for the time being appointed under the authority of the statutes in that behalf and of this Order shall be as follows; and not, except as herein mentioned, any of the duties prescribed by section 7 of the said Act:

To give notice of and attend the Meetings of Vestry and Committees appointed thereat.

To summon and attend Meetings of the Churchwardens and Overseers when required, and to enter the minutes thereof respectively.

To keep the account of all Charity moneys which the Churchwardens or Overseers are authorized or are accustomed to distribute.

To keep the Vestry Books and the Parish deeds and documents and the Rate Books and Accounts which are closed, and to give copies of and extracts from the same to any person entitled thereto, such person paying for the same at the rate of Fourpence for every Seventy-two words or figures, and to permit any person or persons rated to the relief of the Poor of the said Parish, at all reasonable times to inspect the same or any of them, on pain of dismissal for neglecting to give such copies or permit such inspection.

To advise the Churchwardens and Overseers in all the duties of their office.

**ARTICLE III.**—The Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish shall pay to the person for the time being appointed to the office of Vestry Clerk, under the provisions of the above-mentioned Act and of this Order, a salary at the rate of Twenty Pounds per annum, or such other remuneration for the performance of the duties of that office as the Local Government Board may, with the consent of such person, from time to time direct or approve.

**ARTICLE IV.**—Such remuneration, in the case of an annual salary, shall be considered as accruing from day to day, and be apportionable in respect of time accordingly, in pursuance of the provisions of “The Apportionment Act, 1870,” and shall be paid quarterly, on the usual Quarter Days in each year, namely, Midsummer Day, Michaelmas Day, Christmas Day, and Lady Day.

**ARTICLE V.**—A copy of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette by the Churchwardens and Overseers of the Poor of the said Parish.
