PRESENT,

The *QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty* in Council.

**W**HEREAS by the 333rd section of "The Merchant Shipping Act, 1854," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for every Pilotage Authority by Bye-law made with the consent of Her Majesty in Council from time to time to do within its districts all or any of the things specified in that behalf in the said section :

And whereas the Harbour Commissioners of Burntisland incorporated by "The Burntisland Harbour Act, 1881," being a Pilotage Authority within the meaning of the said Merchant Shipping Act, have, in exercise of the powers in them vested by that Act, made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty certain Bye-laws with respect to pilotage within the jurisdiction of the said Pilotage Authority which were approved by an Order in Council dated the 30th day of November, 1882 :

And whereas the said Harbour Commissioners have, in exercise of the like powers, made and submitted for the consent of Her Majesty a supplementary Bye-law with respect to pilotage which is set forth in the schedule hereto annexed :

And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the said Bye-law so set forth is reasonable and proper :

Now therefore Her Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Her by the said Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, and by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, is pleased to approve and doth hereby approve and signify Her consent to the Bye-law set forth in the schedule hereto.

**SCHEDULE** to which the foregoing Order refers.

Supplementary Bye-law relative to Pilotage at the Harbour of Burntisland.

In addition to the qualifications of pilots licensed for the Harbour of Burntisland, contained in Article 4 of the Bye-laws dated 4th July, 1882, the Commissioners hereby enact that no person shall be licensed to act as a pilot before he has attained the age of twenty-two years, and has been for the space of five years or more actually engaged and actively employed as a seafaring man, and during that space of time has sailed for three years or longer in a square-rigged vessel. Every candidate must be free from colour blindness, and he

must have experience in relation to the navigating, piloting, and conducting of vessels, including knowledge of the recognised rules of the road at sea. He must be able to give a correct and seamanlike description of the Firth of Forth, and the Harbour of Burntisland and entrance channels leading thereto, and the dock and piers thereat, and the course and distance from any one place to another within the limits of the Commissioners' pilotage district. He must be able to navigate and pilot any vessel from and to the said Firth of Forth, to and from the said Harbour of Burntisland, entrance channels leading thereto, the said docks and piers thereat, and into, from, and throughout any part of the said pilotage district. He must be familiar with the rise and set of the tides, the depth and character of the soundings, the best anchorages, and where to stop for a tide, the sandbanks, rocks, shoals and other dangers, and the land-marks, buoys, lights, and signals. He must understand how to bring a vessel to anchor, to keep a clear anchor, to moor and unmoor, and to get under way in all situations, and also know the complete management of a vessel in bad weather in bad channels, and, where necessary, he must be able to set off a ship's situation or actual place on the chart.

**W**HEREAS by an Act passed in the first session of the Parliament holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to abridge the holding of benefices in plurality, and to make better provision for the residence of the clergy," after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may in some instances with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Arch-

"bishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop or Bishop shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent-charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates, and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and enquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to Her Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas by another Act of Parliament passed in the second and third years of the reign of Her present Majesty, intituled "An Act to make better provision for the assignment of Ecclesiastical Districts to Churches or Chapels augmented by the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne; and for other purposes," it is amongst other things, further enacted "That when, by any Order of Her Majesty in Council as aforesaid, a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the consent in writing, of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be thereby affected, become a perpetual curacy and benefice, and the minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such lands, tenements, tithes, rent-charges, and hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such perpetual curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the district parish formed under the Church Building Acts, for the church of such perpetual curacy sole and exclusive cure of souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the incumbent or incumbents of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid."

And whereas the Lord Bishop of Ely hath made a representation in writing to his Grace the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"To the Most Reverend Edward White Lord Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury.

"I the Right Reverend James Russell Lord Bishop of Ely do hereby represent to your Grace

that to the benefice (being a rectory) and parish church of Coveney in the county of Cambridge and my diocese of Ely belongs an ancient parochial chapelry known by the name of Manea the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That according to the last census the population of the parish of Coveney exclusive of Manea is four hundred and eighty-eight and the population of Manea is one thousand one hundred and fifty-one.

"That there is in Manea a new church on the site of an ancient church or chapel distant from the parish church of Coveney about six miles wherein Divine service is performed by the incumbent of Coveney or his curate.

"That baptisms marriages churchings and burials have been from time immemorial and are now solemnized and performed in the said church or chapel of the said chapelry and in the burial-ground thereto belonging and the same chapelry is for all civil purposes a separate and distinct parish from Coveney.

"That the net annual value of the said benefice with the said chapelry is one thousand and thirty-seven pounds or thereabouts of which seven hundred and seventy-eight pounds or thereabouts arises in respect of the endowments of or within the said chapelry.

"That there is a house of residence at Coveney but there is no house of residence at Manea.

"The present benefice of Coveney with the chapelry of Manea is subject to the following mortgages to Queen Anne's Bounty:

"That the said present benefice is subject to tenths to the amount of ten shillings payable to the See of Ely.

"That the patronage of the said benefice and parish of Coveney with the said chapelry of Manea belongs to the Honourable Magdalen Wellesey of 7 Stratford-place London in the county of Middlesex Widow and the Reverend Edward Thory Marshall is the present incumbent of the said benefice.

"That it appears to me that under the provisions of the Acts of Parliament passed in the sessions holden in the first and second years of the reign of Her present Majesty chapter 106 and in the second and third years of the same reign chapter 49 the said chapelry of Manea may be advantageously separated from the said benefice and parish church of Coveney and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes (as it has been in all other respects from time immemorial) and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That pursuant to the direction contained in the twenty-sixth section of the said first-mentioned Act I have prepared the following scheme which together with the consents thereto of the patron and incumbent of the said benefice I do submit to your Grace to the intent that your Grace may if on full consideration and enquiry you shall be satisfied with such scheme certify the same and such consent by your report to Her Majesty in Council."

And whereas the Scheme and Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

"The SCHEME above referred to.

"That the said chapelry of Manea shall be separated from the benefice and parish church of

Coveney and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice by the name or style of 'The Perpetual Curacy of Manea' of which the said church or chapel in the said chapelry shall be the parish church.

"That the proposed separate parish and benefice shall be subject to the same ecclesiastical jurisdiction as the said benefice of Coveney and the incumbent of such separate parish and benefice shall have exclusive cure of souls within the limits of the same.

"That two churchwardens shall be annually chosen in the customary manner and at the time when churchwardens are usually appointed in and for such separate parish and benefice.

"That all the glebe lands tithe rent-charges or other payments for or in lieu of tithes and all other endowments whatsoever belonging to or arising within or in respect of the said chapelry of Manea shall henceforth belong and be attached to the said proposed separate benefice of Manea for ever and be held received and enjoyed by the incumbent thereof for the time being.

"That the existing mortgages to the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne shall be apportioned as follows that is to say:

Mortgage No. 2 dated 21 October 1872 for securing £250 and interest and

Mortgage No. 4 dated 5 July 1876 for securing £720 and interest

shall be assigned to and remain charged exclusively upon the benefice of Coveney in exoneration of the proposed new benefice of Manea.

"That Mortgage No. 1 dated 1 October 1863 for securing £1200 and interest and Mortgage No. 3 dated 31 December 1873, for securing £750 and interest shall be assigned to and be charged exclusively upon the separate benefice of Manea in exoneration of the benefice of Coveney.

"That the incumbent of the benefice of Coveney shall be liable to pay the whole tenths to the See of Ely.

"That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for churchings marriages burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnized and performed within the said proposed separate parish and benefice of Manea and all such other ecclesiastical dues offerings and emoluments usually payable to the incumbent of a parish or benefice as shall arise within the said proposed separate parish or benefice shall belong to the incumbent thereof.

"That the patronage or right of nomination to the said proposed separate benefice of Manea shall be vested in the said Honourable Magdalen Wellesley her heirs and assigns for ever.

"That the parishioners of the said proposed separate parish shall not be entitled to church accommodation in any other church than the church of the said proposed separate parish nor shall the parishioners of Coveney be entitled to any accommodation in the churches or chapels of the said separated benefice.

"Given under my hand this twentieth day of June in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three. "J. R. Ely.

#### "CONSENT.

"I the Honourable Magdalen Wellesley of 7 Stratford-place London in the county of Middlesex the patron or person entitled to present to the benefice (being a rectory) of Coveney above-mentioned with the said chapelry of Manea annexed in case the same were now vacant and I the Reverend Edward Thory Marshall the incumbent of the said benefice do hereby severally signify

our consent to the scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

In witness whereof we have hereunto set our hands this twenty-first day of June one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

"We the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne do hereby signify our consent to the four mortgages mentioned in the foregoing representation being apportioned as in the above-mentioned scheme is proposed.

And whereas the said Bishop of Ely hath transmitted the said scheme to the Archbishop of Canterbury for his consideration and the said Archbishop being satisfied with such scheme hath certified the same and such consents as aforesaid by his report to Her Majesty in Council dated the 28th day of June 1883, which report is in the words and figures following:—

"To the QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

"We the undersigned Edward White Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council.

"That the Right Reverend James Russell Lord Bishop of Ely has represented unto us (amongst other things)

"That to the benefice (being a rectory) and parish church of Coveney in the county of Cambridge and diocese of Ely belongs an ancient parochial chapelry known by the name of Manea the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and defined.

"That there is in Manea a new church on the site of an ancient church or chapel distant from the parish church of Coveney about six miles.

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said chapelry of Manea may be advantageously separated from the said benefice and parish church of Coveney and be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes and a perpetual curacy and benefice.

"That the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him the proposed alteration may be best effected and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction glebe lands tithe rent-charges and other ecclesiastical dues rates and payments and in respect to patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested which scheme together with the consents thereto in writing of the patron and of the incumbent of the said benefice and with the consent in writing of the Governors of the Bounty of Queen Anne to certain mortgages being apportioned as in the said scheme is proposed has been transmitted by the said Lord Bishop to us for our consideration.

"The representation and scheme of the said Lord Bishop and the consents before referred to are hereunto annexed.

"And we the said Archbishop being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said scheme do hereby pursuant to the Act of Parliament of the first and second years of Your Majesty's reign chapter 106 certify the same and such con-

sents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do make and issue an Order for carrying the said scheme into effect.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby declare a meadow situate on the east side of Whitlingham-lane, between Whitlingham-lane and Crown Point Park, at Trowse Newton, in the county of Norfolk, in the occupation of Richard Harris, used for lairage, to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Minister at Stockholm, reporting that vessels from Egyptian or Turkish Mediterranean Ports will be subjected in Sweden to a medical examination and other measures of sanitary precaution. Every vessel having had cholera or sickness suspected of being cholera on board, or having had communication with a vessel having cholera on board, will be sent to Kransö, in the Department of Gothenburg, to undergo six days quarantine.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Ambassador at Vienna reporting that, with a view of preventing the introduction of infectious diseases into the country, the Government of Austria-Hungary have forbidden for an indefinite period the importation and transit of rags, old clothes, used linen, and bedding coming from Egypt for trading purposes.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for the Colonies the following Notices in respect of quarantine, which have been issued by the Government of Cyprus:—

UNDER the powers vested in him by the Quarantine Ordinance, 1879, and in consequence of the outbreak of cholera in Egypt, his Excellency the High Commissioner is pleased to direct that:

1. All vessels arriving at Cyprus from Egypt shall undergo a quarantine of ten clear days, but if no cholera has appeared on board during the voyage, and the vessel is in a good sanitary condition, the quarantine will be diminished one day for every day passed on voyage.

2. Vessels only touching Egyptian ports to land passengers, mails, and merchandise, and not communicating, will not be considered as infected.

3. Passengers' baggage and merchandize must be landed in quarantine and there undergo the quarantine imposed and the disinfection considered necessary. Rags are repelled. Non-susceptible merchandize shall not be liable to quarantine.

4. Mails will be landed in quarantine, disinfected and delivered to the Postal authorities with the greatest possible despatch. Mails from other countries arriving in vessels from Egypt in the proper quarantine cases shall be landed in quarantine, emptied into clean bags and handed at once to the Postal authorities.

5. The quarantine on all arrivals from Egypt shall be performed at Larnaca, mails only excepted, which may be landed at Limassol under the regulations contained in the preceding clause.

Under the powers vested in him by the Quarantine Ordinance, 1879, and in consequence of the existence of cholera in Egypt, his Excellency the High Commissioner is pleased to direct that, until further orders:—

All vessels arriving from Syria shall undergo a quarantine of inspection of three days.

This quarantine, as well as the quarantine of ten days imposed on all vessels arriving from Egypt, may be augmented if the Chief Superintendent of Quarantine is not satisfied that no fear of contagion exists.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Rome the following translation of a quarantine Ordinance issued by the Italian Government:—

1883.—ORDINANCE OF MARITIME HEALTH.

No. 10.

The Ministry of the Interior, with reference to the Law of March 20th, 1865, cap. C., on Public Health, and to the Ministerial Instructions of December 26th, 1871, having received information from official sources that cases of yellow fever have occurred daily for some time in the harbour

of Callao, and that others have taken place in various parts of Peru, decrees that vessels arriving after to-day's date from the coast of Peru shall be considered as having a foul patent on account of yellow fever, and shall be subjected to the quarantine treatment ordained by Ordinance No. 9 of May 29th, 1878.

The Prefects of Maritime Provinces are charged with the execution of this Ordinance.

#### TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. THE Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England, on Tuesday, the 7th proximo, at one o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Act 40 Vic., cap. 2, to the amount of £2,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £1,000, £5,000, or £10,000. They will be dated the 10th day of August, 1883, and will be payable at three or six months after date (at the option of the persons tendering), viz.:—on the 10th November or 10th February next, respectively.

3. The Tenders must specify the net amount per cent. which will be given for the amounts applied for; and the tenders of private individuals must be made through a London Banker.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same on Wednesday, the 8th proximo, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England not later than three o'clock, on Friday, the 10th proximo.

6. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

#### TREASURY WARRANT.

WE, the Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred on us by the 15th section of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do by this Warrant, made on the recommendation of the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Customs and of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by their respectively signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

1. Subject to the prohibitions and restrictions which under the Customs Acts, or any other Act, or any Order in Council may for the time being attach to the importation, exportation, or removal of goods, it shall be permissible by means of inland parcels conveyed by post:—

(a.) To export or remove from the Channel Islands or Isle of Man, and import or bring into Great Britain or Ireland;

(b.) To export or remove from Great Britain or Ireland, and import or bring into the Channel Islands or Isle of Man; and

(c.) To import and export to and from the Channel Islands, from and to the Isle of Man through Great Britain any goods upon which duty is payable under the Customs Acts.

2. The following shall be the regulations for permitting and regulating the exportation, importation, removal, and bringing in of such goods as above mentioned by means of inland parcels conveyed by post, viz.:—

(1.) Every parcel posted in Great Britain, Ireland, or the Isle of Man, and intended to be delivered at any place in the Channel Islands; and every parcel posted in the Channel Islands and intended to be delivered at any place in Great Britain, Ireland, or the Isle of Man, shall be accompanied by, or have affixed to it, a declaration of such kind, and stating the contents of the parcel in such manner and form, and with such other particulars as the Commissioners of Customs and the Postmaster-General may prescribe.

(2.) Every parcel shall either at the port of departure or of arrival, as the Commissioners of Customs shall direct, be produced by an officer appointed in that behalf by the Postmaster-General to the proper officer of Customs, and if the officer of Customs require it shall be thereupon opened by the officer of the Post Office, who is hereby empowered and authorized to open the same for Customs examination; and in any case where the contents of a parcel are found not to agree with the declaration which accompanies or is affixed to it, such parcel and all its contents may be considered and treated as goods not permitted under this Warrant, or be otherwise dealt with as the Commissioners of Customs may think fit.

(3.) The officer aforesaid of the Post Office shall deliver to the proper officer of Customs such entries of the contents or other documents as the Commissioners of Customs shall prescribe.

(4.) If the addressee of a parcel refuses to pay any duty payable under the Customs Acts in respect of the goods contained in such parcel, the Postmaster-General may retain the parcel, and may either pay to the Commissioners of Customs the duty payable, and recover the same from the addressee or other person liable to pay the same, in the same manner as if such duty were a rate of postage, or may, at the expiration of seven days

from the day on which such parcel was presented at the place of address, send the parcel to the Queen's Warehouse at the Custom House, London, or to such other place as the Commissioners of Customs shall appoint for that purpose.

(5.) Any parcel sent by the Postmaster-General to the Queen's Warehouse or other place appointed as aforesaid, under the provisions of this Warrant, together with all goods contained therein, shall be treated as goods not permitted under this Warrant.

(6.) The duties payable on goods contained in any parcel to which this Warrant applies, and which may not be sent to the Queen's Warehouse or other appointed place as aforesaid, shall be paid over by the Postmaster-General to the Commissioners of Customs or their proper officers, or shall be transferred to the account of the said Commissioners at the Bank of England, at such times and in such manner as shall be from time to time agreed upon between the two Departments.

3. Subject to the exception and modification made by this Warrant, the prohibition contained in the above-mentioned section of the Post Office (Parcels) Act, 1882, shall remain in force in manner and to the effect therein specified.

4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

Beyond the limits of this sector and especially towards the harbour, a faint white light is perceptible.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this

behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

*Short Title.*

1. This Order may be cited as **THE SCOTLAND (MOVEMENT OF ANIMALS) No. 8 ORDER OF 1883.**

*Commencement and Duration.*

2. This Order shall commence and take effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of July, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three; and shall cease to have effect from and immediately after the thirty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, without prejudice to the institution or prosecution of any proceeding in respect of an offence committed on or before that day.

*Interpretation.*

3. In this Order—

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area means an Area for the time being declared by the Privy Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place means a Place for the time being declared by a Local Authority or by the Privy Council to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Circle means a Circle for the time being an Infected Circle under The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Infected Circles) Order of 1883.

Other terms have the same meaning as in The Animals Order.

*Restriction on Movement.*

4. No animal shall be moved by land or by water from any place or port in England or Wales to any place or port in Scotland except as expressly authorized by this Order.

*Exception in favour of Movement from England or Wales into Scotland.*

5. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of any Local Authority in England or Wales to a farm or premises in Scotland with a licence of the Local Authority of the district in Scotland into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority—

(i.) that the animals to be moved are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease: and

(ii.) that there is not, at the time of the granting of the licence, a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place in the district of the Local Authority out of which the animals are to be moved.

*Further Exception in favour of Movement from Northumberland or Cumberland or Berwick-upon-Tweed into Scotland.*

6. Animals may be moved by land from a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the county of Northumberland or the county of Cumberland or the borough of Berwick-upon-Tweed, not in a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Area or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Place or a Foot-and-Mouth Disease Infected Circle, to a farm or premises in the district of the Local Authorities of the county of Berwick or the county of Dumfries or the county of Roxburgh with a licence of the Local Authority of the county into which the animals are to be moved (if that Local Authority think

fit to grant a licence for that purpose): Provided that no such licence shall in any case be granted until satisfactory evidence has been adduced to that Local Authority that the animals to be moved—

(i.) either have been bred on the farm or premises from which they are to be moved, or have been pastured or fed thereon for a period of at least one month: and

(ii.) have not within one month immediately before the granting of the licence been exposed in any market, fair, exhibition, or public sale in England or Wales: and

(iii.) are not affected with foot-and-mouth disease, and have not been in contact with animals affected with or suspected of that disease.

*Offences.*

7. If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person or company moving or conveying the animal, and the owner and the charterer and the master of the vessel in which it is moved, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been so moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1878.
