ORDER of the Local Government Board.
 Cholera Regulations (Egyptian Rags): Port of
 London.

To the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of
 London;—

To all Officers of Customs;—

To the Medical Officer of Health of the said
 Port Sanitary Authority;—

To all Masters of Ships;—

And to all others whom it may contain.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government
 Board, by an Order bearing date the 12th day of
 July, 1883, made certain rules and regulations
 with a view to the treatment of persons affected
 with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of the
 disease;

And whereas Cholera is now prevalent in Egypt,
 and it is expedient that further rules and regula-
 tions should be made with reference to ships
 having on board bales of rags exported from
 Egypt and consigned to this country:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government
 Board, do, by this our Order, and in exercise of
 the power conferred on Us by Section 52 of the
 Sanitary Act, 1866, and Section 130 of the Public

Health Act, 1875, and every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following regulations, and declare that they shall be enforced and executed by the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of London :—

Definitions.

ART. 1.—In this Order—

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat :

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs :

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship :

The term "Sanitary Authority" means the Port Sanitary Authority of the Port of London :

The term "Medical Officer of Health" includes any duly qualified Medical Practitioner appointed by the Sanitary Authority to act in the execution of this Order.

ART. 2.—If any Officer of Customs, on the arrival of any ship in the Port of London, shall ascertain from the Master of such ship or otherwise that there are on board such ship Rags exported from Egypt which it is intended should be landed within the jurisdiction of the Sanitary Authority, such Officer of Customs shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Sanitary Authority.

ART. 3.—The Master of a ship shall not allow any such Rags to be landed therefrom until he has been furnished by the consignee of the Rags, or some person duly authorized by him, and acting on his behalf, with a certificate signed by the Medical Officer of Health to the effect that such such consignee or other person has given notice to the Sanitary Authority that he is prepared immediately on the Rags being landed to cause them to be conveyed, with such precautions as the Medical Officer of Health may deem necessary, to some place approved by the Medical Officer of Health, such place being specified in the said notice.

ART. 4.—The consignee or other person giving the notice aforesaid shall, immediately that the Rags are landed, cause them to be conveyed with such precautions as the Medical Officer of Health may deem necessary, to the place specified in the notice ; and the Rags shall not be removed therefrom except with the express authority in writing of the Medical Officer of Health.

ART. 5.—The Medical Officer of Health may give the authority referred to in Article 4 of this Order, either conditionally or unconditionally ; and if such authority is given subject to conditions as to the disinfection or otherwise of the Rags, either before or after their removal, or as to their destruction, the consignee of the Rags shall cause them to be removed and shall comply with such conditions, and it shall be the duty of the Medical Officer of Health to satisfy himself that the conditions are fully complied with.

NOTICE.—The Public Health Act, 1872, provides by Section 52, which is extended to the Metropolis by Section 53 of the Sanitary Law Amendment Act, 1874, that any person wilfully

Cholera Regulations (Egyptian Rags): General.

To all Port Sanitary Authorities, except the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of London ;—

To all Urban and Rural Sanitary Authorities whose districts include or abut on any part of a customs port, which part is not within the jurisdiction of any Port Sanitary Authority ;—

To all Officers of Customs ;—

To all Medical Officers of Health of the Sanitary Authorities aforesaid ;—

To all Masters of Ships ;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS We, the Local Government Board, by an Order bearing date the 12th day of July, 1883, made certain rules and regulations with a view to the treatment of persons affected with Cholera, and for preventing the spread of the disease ;

And whereas Cholera is now prevalent in Egypt, and it is expedient that further rules and regulations should be made with reference to Ships having on board bales of Rags exported from Egypt and consigned to this country :

Now therefore We, the Local Government Board, do, by this our Order, and in exercise of the power conferred on Us by Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and every other power enabling Us in this behalf, make the following regulations, and declare that they shall be enforced and executed by the several Authorities herein-after named :—

Definitions.

ART. 1.—In this Order—

The term "Ship" includes vessel or boat :

The term "Officer of Customs" includes any person acting under the authority of the Commissioners of Customs :

The term "Master" includes the officer or person for the time being in charge or command of a ship :

The term "Sanitary Authority" means every Port Sanitary Authority except the Port Sanitary Authority for the Port of London, and every Urban or Rural Sanitary Authority whose district includes or abuts on any part of a customs port, which part is not within the jurisdiction of a Port Sanitary Authority :

The term "Medical Officer of Health" includes any duly qualified Medical Practitioner appointed by a Sanitary Authority to act in the execution of this Order :

For the purposes of this Order so much of a customs port abutting on an Urban or Rural Sanitary District as is nearer to such District than to any other, and is not included within the jurisdiction of any Port Sanitary Authority, shall be deemed to be within such District.

ART. 2.—If any Officer of Customs, on the arrival of any ship, shall ascertain from the Master of such ship or otherwise that there are on board such ship Rags exported from Egypt which it is intended should be landed within the jurisdiction of any Sanitary Authority, such Officer of Customs shall forthwith give notice thereof to the

Sanitary Authority of the place where the Rags are intended to be landed.

ART. 3.—The Master of a ship shall not allow any such Rags to be landed therefrom until he has been furnished by the consignee of the Rags, or some person duly authorised by him and acting on his behalf, with a certificate signed by the Medical Officer of Health to the effect that such consignee or other person has given notice to the Sanitary Authority that he is prepared immediately on the Rags being landed to cause them to be conveyed, with such precautions as the Medical Officer of Health may deem necessary, to some place approved by the Medical Officer of Health, such place being specified in the said notice.

ART. 4.—The consignee or other person giving the notice aforesaid shall, immediately that the Rags are landed, cause them to be conveyed, with such precautions as the Medical Officer of Health may deem necessary, to the place specified in the notice; and the Rags shall not be removed therefrom except with the express authority in writing of the Medical Officer of Health.

ART. 5.—The Medical Officer of Health may give the authority referred to in Article 4 of this Order, either conditionally or unconditionally; and if such authority is given subject to conditions as to the disinfection or otherwise of the Rags, either before or after their removal, or as to their destruction, the consignee of the Rags shall cause them to be removed and shall comply with such conditions; and it shall be the duty of the Medical Officer of Health to satisfy himself that the conditions are fully complied with.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

(No. 200.)—BORNEO—NORTH-EAST COAST.

Shoal North-Westward of Peri Bank.

INFORMATION has been received from Commander Hope, H.M.S. "Fly," of the existence of shoal ground lying about N.W. by W. $\frac{1}{2}$ W., distant 11 miles from Peri Bank :—

Approaching this shoal from the westward the "Fly," obtained soundings of 12, 8, and $5\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, the bottom, of white sand (or coral) and rock, being clearly seen; the shoal then appeared to extend, crescent-shaped, in a north-east and south-west direction for about $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, the water being of a light green colour, and there being every sign of shoaler water than was indicated by the lead. From the depth of 5 fathoms the following bearings were taken :—

Summit of Bagahac Range, S. $\frac{1}{2}$ W.Double Hill, S.W. by W. $\frac{1}{4}$ W.

These bearings place the shoal in approximately, lat. $5^{\circ} 53' N.$, long. $118^{\circ} 47' E.$

GULF OF CUTCH—BEYT (BATE) HARBOUR.

(1.) *Alteration in Light on Sainia Island.*

INFORMATION has been received from Lieutenant Channer, India Marine Survey, that on 13th May, 1883, the following alteration was made in Sainia (Sayani) Island Light, Beyt (Bate or Bet) Harbour Entrance :—

The light is a fixed white light, elevated 71 feet above high water, and should be visible in clear weather from a distance of 13 miles. A sector of red light is shown over Chinri Reef, between the bearings of S. $37\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ W. and S. $67\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ W.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The lighthouse, 65 feet high, circular in shape, and constructed of stone, is situated in the centre of the island.

Position as given, lat. $22^{\circ} 29' 20'' N.$, long. $69^{\circ} 4' 40'' E.$

(2.) *Depth on Three-Fathoms Patch.*

Also, that a depth of $2\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms at low water spring tides has been found on the patch stated to have 3 fathoms on it, lying in the approach to Beyt Harbour, and bearing W. $\frac{1}{4}$ S. from Sainia Island Lighthouse, distant $3\frac{2}{3}$ th miles.

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation $1\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ Easterly in 1883.]

ARCHIPELAGO—HYDRA ISLAND.

Fixed and Flashing Light on Cape Zourva.

WITH reference to Notice to Mariners, No. 52 (10), of 23rd February, 1883, on the proposed establishment of a light on Cape Zourva, eastern extreme of Hydra Island :—

The Hellenic Government has given further notice, that on 27th June, 1883, a light was exhibited from a lighthouse erected 93 yards within the extremity of the Cape :—

The light is a fixed white light, varied by a flash every two minutes in the following order :—Feeble fixed light for ninety seconds, eclipse about ten seconds, flash of nine seconds' duration, followed by an eclipse of about ten seconds; it is visible seaward between the bearings of N. 37° E. and S. 2° W., elevated 118 feet above the sea, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 17 miles.

The illuminating apparatus is dioptric, or by lenses, of the fourth order.

The lighthouse, 36 feet high, and square in shape, is built above the keeper's dwelling.

Position, lat. $37^{\circ} 21' 45'' N.$, long. $23^{\circ} 35' 5'' E.$

[The bearings are magnetic. Variation $7\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$ Westerly in 1883.]

Isle of Wight Highways.

(Partial Repeal and Alteration of Act of 1813, for amending Roads and Highways in the Isle of Wight (53 Geo. III, c. 92); Constitution, Qualification, and Election of Highway Commissioners; Transfer of Powers, &c., of Existing Commissioners to New Commissioners; Altering Mode of Assessment and Collection of Highway Rates; Audit of Accounts; Application of Local Taxation Returns Acts, 1860 and 1877, to Commissioners, and of parts of the General Highway Acts to the Highways in the Isle of Wight; and for other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that a Bill containing provisions for the purposes hereinafter mentioned is now before Parliament. The Bill proposes—

1. To partially repeal and alter the Isle of Wight Highway Act, 1813 (53 Geo. III, c. 92).

2. To constitute a body of Highway Commissioners (consisting of ex-officio and elective Commissioners), and to transfer to such Highway Commissioners the powers, property, &c., of the Commissioners appointed under the Act of 1813.

3. To fix the number of elective Commissioners to be elected for each consolidated parish, to define the qualification of elective Commissioners, and to provide for the annual election of elective Commissioners by the persons entitled to vote at vestry meetings, and for the annual retirement of such Commissioners.

4. To provide for the assessment of the rates made under the Act of 1813 for highway purposes, according to the basis of the Valuation List made for the relief of the poor, and for the levy of such rates by the overseers, at the same time and in the same manner as the poor rate.

5. That the accounts of the Commissioners shall be balanced, and audited by the District Auditor, and that the Local Taxation Returns Acts, 1860 and 1877, shall apply to the Commissioners as if the Commissioners were a Highway Board.

6. To make certain provisions of the General Highway Acts applicable throughout the limits of the Isle of Wight Highway Acts.

7. The Bill also contains provisions subsidiary and incidental to the purposes mentioned above.
