(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 2nd day of August, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area (namely),—at Rood Street, in the parish of Epping, in the county of Essex, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Great Eastern Railway and a wood known as Rough Tallies on the south, and thence over the main-road leading from Epping to Ongar taking three fields along the side thereof in the occupation of William Simmonds, adjoining the said road, thence by an Old Green-lane to the road from Weald Church, continuing along that road towards and unto the main-road from Harlow to Epping, thence to Thornwood Gate, and including the whole of that part of Epping Forest known as Lower Forest,—which was declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Area shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 2nd day of August, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the whole of the Parts of Holland ; and the petty sessional divisions of Bourn, and Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven ;

Lincolnshire,—is, except such portions thereof as are included in the Areas described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire ; (2.) so much of the parish of Skirbeck, in the petty sessional division of Kirton and Skirbeck, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the public footpath from Rochford Tower to Workhouse-lane on the south, thence Workhouse-lane to Spilsby-road on the west, thence Spilsby-road and Wainfleet-road to Rochford Tower on the north and east ; exclusive of all boundary-roads but inclusive of all intersecting-roads ; (3.) so much of the parish of Leverton, in the petty sessional division of Kirton and Skirbeck, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, as lies within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Boston and Wainfleet highway commencing at or near Leverton Church up to the gravel-road that leads to Heronshaw Hall on the east, thence the said gravel-road to Heronshaw Hall on the north, and thence the gravel-road from Heronshaw Hall to its junction with the said Boston and Wainfleet highway on the west and south ; exclusive of all boundary-roads but inclusive of all intersecting roads ; and (4.) the petty sessional divisions of Bourn, and Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire,—shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the third day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
