of Africa will be subjected to sanitary examination, and in all doubtful cases to quarantine observation of six days.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Tenerife, enclosing the following copy of a translation of a quarantine notice published in the Official Bulletin of that island:—

Official Bulletin.—July 16th, 1883.—Directory-General of Bienfaisance and Health.

In consequence of the breaking out of Asiatic cholera morbus in Damietta and other places, vessels arriving from all Egyptian ports which put to sea after the 22nd of June last are declared as being suspected.

Arrivals from ports in Candia, Morocco, Gibraltar, Ottoman ports in the Red Sea, and all the coast of Africa, excepting Malta, Algiers, Tunis, and Spanish possessions in Morocco, are subject to a quarantine of observation.

The foregoing order is abrogated as regards Gibraltar and Tangiers, and arrivals from those places are considered clean.

The sanitary employés are recommended to show the greatest zeal in the discharge of their duties.
