THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Brest, reporting that the following quarantine regulations are at present in force, viz. :—

1. All ships arriving from Cyprus, Malta, Egypt, Suez Canal, Red Sea, and Indian Ocean, whether they are provided with clean bills of health or not, are placed in observation quarantine during a period of four and twenty hours, followed by medical visits, &c.

2. All ships with a case of cholera or other disease on board, considered epidemic, are placed in quarantine during seven days followed by the rigorous sanitary measures prescribed by law or by ministerial orders, that is, if, after the expiration of the seven days, all suspicion has not been removed, they will be sent to the regular quarantine station (Lazaret).

3. All ships arriving from the coasts of Spain and Portugal from Mediterranean ports, as well as from Gibraltar, must now, in order to escape observation quarantine, be provided with a clean bill of health.

THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a Despatch from Her Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires at Rome, enclosing the following Memorandum on the Italian Law of July 6, 1883, sanctioning recent modifications of the General Customs Tariff :—

MEMORANDUM.

THE Official Gazette of the Kingdom of Italy of the 6th instant publishes the text of a law, signed the same day, to give effect to the modifications recently introduced into the Italian Customs Tariff by the Legislature.

M. Magliani, the Minister of Finance, and M. Berti, the Minister of Commerce, had presented a joint project to the Chamber of Deputies at the close of its last session, embodying some modifications which the Government desired to introduce into the General Tariff, accompanied by a number of documents in explanation and in support of their proposals.

When the Chamber next met this project was submitted to a Committee, who duly examined it, and sent in their report upon it in May last.

The law contains twenty-one articles. The first of these announces the suppression of two clauses (Nos. 2 and 10) of the 16th Article of the "preliminary dispositions of the Customs Tariff" issued on the 30th of May, 1878. In virtue of this suppression (1) furniture and effects, not new, inherited by Italian citizens, and (2) wedding trousseaux brought into the country by the brides of Italians, being foreigners, may no longer be imported free of duty. The Ministerial project had proposed to abolish the free importation of furniture and effects on change of residence allowed by the same "preliminary dispositions," but this proposal did not pass.

The next fourteen Articles, from Article 2 to Article 15 inclusive, contains rules for fixing "tare" upon the casks or cases in which sugar is conveyed (Articles 3 and 4); the amounts to be returned to importers of salts of chinchona (Article 2), spirits, wine (Articles 5 and 6), salted provisions, and cheese (Article 15), on account of the inland excise and factory dues already paid upon them; the kind and amount of such inland dues (Articles 7 to 12); a definition of salt for Customs' purposes, viz., any mixture of salts containing more than 15·2 per cent. of chlorine and 9·8 per cent. of sodium, with a permission to the Ministry of Finance to allow salt to be issued to proprietors of restaurants for iceing, at 25 francs a hundredweight, provided it is of such a quality as to serve no other purpose (Article 13); and finally a heavy increase in the amount of the fines leviable under the 33rd and 34th Articles of the law of the 15th of June, 1865, on the Royal monopoly of salt and tobacco, from masters of ships carrying tobacco, for presenting false or incorrect manifests, namely, 15 francs instead of 5 per kilogram in the case of leaf tobacco, and 30 instead of 10 in that of prepared tobacco.

Up to this point the law seems to affect only the home trade, and none but purely native Italian interests. All the changes which concern the foreign trade, properly speaking, are contained in the 16th Article, which is translated below in full, with the old dispositions of the Customs' Tariff placed opposite the new enactments :—

2. They are not greased.
3. On the under side they have always some trace of flesh.

Hides of this kind cannot pass immediately into use, because they are porous, not clean, and not always sufficiently flexible.

Miscellaneous goods.

In note at No. 297, instead of "when they are" are made altogether or in part of gilt, painted, "or coloured paper," read "when they are so" ornamented as to present a vignette, or figures, "or other similar design."

The Ministry of Finance is empowered to permit, under such rules and precautions as may be thought necessary, manufacturers of indiarubber wares, to import those special textures that serve exclusively for their industry free of duty, up to the value of one hundred thousand francs.

Amongst objects of art (oggetti d'arte) are comprised objects of antiquity and art by deceased artists, viz. : coins, medals, and all other ancient objects in metal, marble, stone, wood, or any other material whatever, besides mosaics, paintings, miniatures, designs on cloth, wood, wall, copper, paper, &c. ; the exportation of which objects shall be subject to the formalities prescribed by the special laws in force in the various provinces as well as to the payment of the tax established by the present law.

N.B.—This clause does not refer to the india-rubber itself, that being already freed from duty under the head of "gums and resins."

"Objects for collections."

In the 1879 edition of the Customs' Tariff this note runs thus :—

"To this class belong objects not in commerce but interesting to science or as curiosities; specimens of objects of natural history, such as rare animals alive or stuffed, or otherwise preserved; empty shells, excepting mother-of-pearl, minerals, excepting precious stones; dried plants, or herbaria, &c. ; objects of antiquity; old armour, old furniture, mosaics, and objects of lava alone, of all dimensions; and everything belonging to numismatics, such as medals, cameos, and old engraved stones; amongst objects of collection are not comprised objects of art anterior to the nineteenth century, in metal, marble, stone, or other material, or paintings, miniatures, drawings on cloth, wood, wall, copper, paper, &c., the exportation of which is governed by special laws."

Thus the only change effected by the present tariff modifications in respect to works of art is the freeing of pictures by modern painters from the export duty of one per cent. hitherto levied on them. This was a part of the original ministerial project, and it was based upon the evident injustice of taxing modern paintings whilst permitting modern statues to pass free.

In addition to this the Government had proposed an universal export duty of 20 per cent. throughout Italy upon ancient works of art of all kinds, this having been hitherto subject to various rates and different conditions prescribed by the particular regulations in force in each province. This part of their proposal was, however, thrown out by the Committee, who desired to leave the question to be dealt with by a separate law, and eventually rejected also by the Legislature. But the Legislature restored to the Bill the new ministerial definition of "objects of art" as distinct from "objects for collections," which the committee had also suppressed. It differs from the former one chiefly by substituting the words "by deceased artists" for "anterior to the 19th century."

The rate of 20 per cent. seems to have been fixed upon as the highest existing scale, namely, that in force in the Roman Province, in virtue of an edict of the Pontifical Government devised so long ago as the 7th of April, 1820, by Cardinal Pacca, and maintained by the Italian Authorities since their occupation of the States of the Church.

The expediency of extending this very high rate of duty on the exportation of valuable works of art to the whole of the country had previously occurred to the Italian Government, and the question of establishing a general and uniform tax was brought forward on the occasion of the last complete revision of the tariff in 1878. The subject was then considered to deserve separate treatment, and a Bill was laid before the Chambers in which a payment of so much as 25 per cent. was proposed, but this has never passed the Senate. It may have been thought on the present occasion that an offer to place this duty at only 20 per cent. might find better favour, but the Committee, and the Legislature with it, seem to have decided that the whole matter was one of too complex a nature for any summary settlement, and that that which had been set aside for separate consideration five years ago on a complete revision of the tariff had best be left untouched now, when the revision is no more than a partial one.

The remaining Articles provide—1st, for the ratification of a few Decrees touching the Customs Tariff that have been issued since its last official publication, which relate to changes made in classifying goods of hemp, flax, and jute, to the abolition of the duty upon dried chicory, and to temporary importation and exportation,—2nd for a new official version of the whole tariff and excise laws in conformity with the present enactments,—and 3rd for the institution of a fresh Commission of Inquiry for farther revision. This Commission is to consist of nine members, three of whom are to be elected by the Senate, three by the Chamber of Deputies, and three named by the Government. Their nomination is to take place by Royal Decree, on a proposal by the Minister of Finance and the Minister of Agriculture, Industry, and Commerce, consequent upon a deliberation of the Council of Ministers. The Commission will choose its own President and Vice-President, will hold its meeting in Rome, and will present a complete report of its labours before the 1st of July, 1886.
