Bleached cotton goods have hitherto paid various rates, varying from 68 frs. 40 cts, to 120 frs. per quintal, according to fineness. They are now to follow the rates of unbleached goods, namely, from 66 frs. to 100 frs., with an addition of 20 per cent.

A change of designation.
This class formerly was rated at 100 frs. per quintal. It will now pay 50 frs., the duty attached to Class $c$.
