THE Board of Trade have received from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs the following translation of a Spanish Law, dated the 13th ultimo, modifying the duties on certain raw materials imported into Spain from the 1st instant:—

LAW for the Reduction of Custom-house Duties on certain Articles considered as Raw Materials.

ART. 1. From the 1st of August next the articles below mentioned, considered as raw materials for industrial purposes, shall, on their importation into Spain and the Balearic Islands, pay, instead of the present duties, the duties fixed in the accompanying Tariff:—

ART. 2. These duties shall be levied on the products of all nations, whether they have treaties or not, but, in so far as regards nations with treaties, it is understood that they are not to affect the rights acquired by such treaties.

ART. 3. The extraordinary (additional) duty of 20 pesetas per 100 kilogrammes established by the Law of the 21st of July, 1878, on liquid vegetable oils shall, with the exception of olive oil, be suppressed.

The duties established by virtue of Article 1st on vegetable oils shall be subject to the reductions hereafter to be made in accordance with the Law of the 6th of July, 1882, for the application of the fifth base.

ART. 4. The consular dues established by virtue of the Royal Order of the 18th of October, 1876, in substitution of the dues fixed in Articles 48,

49, 50, and 51 of the Consular Tariffs of the 15th of July, 1874, then annulled, are suppressed in so far as they refer to merchandise included in Article 1st.

ART. 5. Navigation dues for the loading and unloading of coal and coke in connexion with foreign trade are fixed at 25 centimes per ton of 1,000 kilogrammes, and at 10 centimes on coal, coke, and iron ore for the coasting trade.

ART. 6. The duties fixed on the articles mentioned in Article 1st shall be paid on the gross weight, excepting phosphorus, and combed and carded wool, and combed and carded waste silk, which shall pay on the nett weight.

Empty vessels for containing acids, whether common or ordinary hollow glassware, dark glass or earthenware (No. 10), as well as the baskets

made to hold them (No. 186), shall pay 20 centimes for every 100 kilogrammes.

Hides and skins, untanned, when salted, shall pay, if fresh salted, 60 per cent., and, if dry, 30 per cent. less than the duty fixed in the present Law.

ART. 7. The reductions which in accordance with the 26th Article of the Budget Law for 1878-79 are applied to raw cotton, untanned hides and skins, indigo, arriving direct from non-European foreign ports, shall be in future 1 peseta on cotton, hides, and skins, and 3 pesetas on indigo, per 100 kilogrammes.

ART. 8. Articles 5 and 7 notwithstanding, the present duties raised by the Corporations (Corporaciones y Juntas de Puertos) of Pasajes, Barcelona, Tarragona, Seville, Valencia, Santander, Palma, Gijon, Malaga, Carthagena, Huelva,

Corunna, Almeria, and Bilbao shall continue to be levied.

During the current year, 1883, the Minister of Finance, after hearing the said Corporations, shall have the right of revising the dues and surcharges which they have been authorized to levy, with a view to compensation or to bring them into harmony with the present Law, with the general interests of industry and commerce, and with the special interest of each port.

The result of this revision shall, however, not alter the sum total received by the Corporations during an average of the last three years, nor the direct form of levying them to which they have a right.

ART. 9. The Minister of Finance shall give the necessary orders for enforcing the present Law.

The Treaty in question has not yet been ratified; but according to a Despatch from Her Majesty's Secretary of Legation at Berlin, which has been communicated to the Board of Trade, an arrangement has been come to by which, pending the approval of the German Reichstag, the above Tariff will come into force from and after the 14th instant.

(FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 15th day of August, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Area declared by Order of Council to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease (namely),—the petty sessional divisions of Bourn, and Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire,—is, except such portions thereof as are included in the Areas described in Article 2 of this Order, hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and the Area above described, except as aforesaid, shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be an Area infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) the petty sessional division of Bourn, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire; (2.) in the petty sessional division of Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by the Holland-road, on the east by the Sleaford and Boston Railway, on the south by the road from Billingborough to Falkingham, and on the west by the road from Osbournby to Falkingham; (3.) in the petty sessional division of Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by the road from Helpringham to Screddington, thence on the north-east by the Great Northern and Great Eastern Joint Railway, thence on the east by a line running along the road from Helpringham to Swaton commencing at the Swaton-road Railway Bridge as far as the commencement of the parish of Swaton, thence running eastward along the boundary between the parishes of Helpringham and Swaton to the Carr Dyke, and thence along the Carr Dyke as far as the south of Swaton parish, on the south by the parish boundary between Swaton and Horbling, and on the west by the parish boundary between the parish of Swaton and the parishes of Horbling and Spanby up to the parish of Screddington, thence by a line running along the boundary hedge between Miss Clark's farm and the Screddington Glebe to the Gorse-road and along the Gorse-road to the Helpringham and Screddington-road; (4.) in the parish of Howell, in the petty sessional division of Sleaford, in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, a line commencing at the south-east corner of the fence on the south side of the Howell Fen-road at the junction of that road with the road from Ewerby Thorpe to Heckington and running in an easterly direction along the south side of the Howell Fen-road to the fence at the north-east end of the Home grass field, then in a northerly direction to the corner of the Levels in the occupation of Mr. Walter Dudding, thence in a westerly direction along a fence between Mr. Brown's Rush Close and Mr. Sardeson's Nine Acres to the fence on the east side of the Heckington-road, then in a northerly direction along the fence on the east side of the Heckington-road to the south-east corner of the fence at the south side of the Howell Fen-road at which the line commenced; and (5.) in the parishes of North Kyme, and South Kyme, in the petty sessional division of Sleaford,

in the Parts of Kesteven, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, on the north by a line extending from North Kyme village along Vachery-lane to the Decoy farm, on the east by a line extending from the Decoy farm through land in the occupation of William Robert Foreman to his old farm-house, and on the south and west by the road from South Kyme to North Kyme,—shall continue to be and are hereby declared to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

3. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the sixteenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) in the parish of Moulton, (Moulton Chapel,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the division line from Oxcroft Bank to Whaplode Bank between Mr. Fred Ward's and Mr. Henry Clark's farms on the south, Whaplode Bank on the east, and Oxcroft Bank on the west and north; (2.) in the parishes of Holbeach, and Fleet, (Fleet Fen,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the Grass-lane from Holbeach St. John's Church direct to the Great South Holland drain on the west, the said drain to Decoy Bridge on the south, thence the highway to Jekylls, otherwise Jerkins, Bank on the east, and the said Bank up to the said Church on the north; and (3.) in the parish of Whaplode, (Whaplode St. Catherine's,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Jekylls, otherwise Jerkins, Bank from Gelders Drove to Mill Gate on the south, Mill Gate to Mr. Charles Ashby's farmhouse on the east, an imaginary direct line across his farm to Gelders Drove on the north, and the said Drove up to the said Bank on the west,—which were declared by Order of Council to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the seventeenth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
