THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs a copy of a Despatch from Her Majesty's Consul at Alexandria, stating that the Maritime and Quarantine Sanitary Board have decided that owing to

the presence of cholera at Suez, all vessels from thence will be subjected to seven days quarantine in the Egyptian ports of the Red Sea, as well as in Egyptian ports on the Mediterranean Littoral.

THE Board of Trade have received through the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, from Her Majesty's Consul at Stockholm, the following translation of a Royal Decree issued in Sweden, with respect to quarantine:—

We, Oscar, &c., &c., make known, that in consequence of the breaking out of cholera in Egypt we have found good, after having obtained the opinion of the Board of Directors, of the Medical Board of Health, and the Board of Commerce, to issue the following orders to be observed provisionally:—

Vessels, having sailed from, or during the voyage called at, any harbour in Egypt or Turkey, in the Mediterranean or Red Sea, shall, before communication with the Swedish Coast, or its inhabitants, enter the Kånsö Quarantine Place for the inspection of health on board by the quarantine physician. Any such ship therefore endeavouring to enter any other harbour than Kånsö shall be immediately sent there.

Should the vessel, on inspection, be found to have had during the voyage, or has, on arrival, sick or dead of cholera or of any disease suspected to be that of cholera, or to have been in communication with vessels on board of which cholera

has existed, such vessel shall undergo quarantine with crew and passengers for a term of six days. For vessels on board of which cholera is found or breaks out, or on board of which any person should die of the disease, the term shall have to be counted from the day that the last sick or dead person is carried away; in any other case from the date of arrival.

Should the vessel, after inspection, be found fit to proceed to her port of destination, without undergoing quarantine, a certificate to that effect shall have to be issued.

The regulations contained in the decree of the 19th March, 1875, relative to the precautions against the introduction and spreading of contagious diseases amongst the inhabitants of the kingdom shall moreover have to be observed.

#### EXPLOSIVES ACT, 1875 (38 Vic., c. 17).

WHEREAS by Section 68 of the above-named Act, it is provided as follows:—

“The Council of any Borough which is assessed to the county rate of any county by the Justices of such county, and the Commissioners of any Improvement District, may, by order of a Secretary of State made upon the application of such Council or Commissioners, and published in the London Gazette, be declared to be a Local Authority for the purposes of this Act, and thereupon shall become a Local Authority accordingly for such part of their borough or district as is not included in any harbour, to the exclusion of the Justices in Petty Sessions.”

And whereas an application has been made to me by the Council of the borough of Great Torrington to be declared a Local Authority for the purposes of the said Act, in accordance with the provision aforesaid.

Now I, the Right Honourable Sir William Vernon Harcourt, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, do hereby, in virtue of the powers contained in the said section, declare the said Council of the borough of Great Torrington to be a Local Authority for the purposes of the said Act. *W. #### (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE.)

AT the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 20th day of August, 1883.

By Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

THE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The following Place (namely),—the sheds, yards, and out-buildings on Mr. Edward Bosworth's farm called The Mill farm, Castle Bromwich, Bir-

mingham Division, in the county of Warwick, together with two fields immediately connected therewith and bounded on the north by the river Tame, on the south by the footpath from Castle Bromwich Church to Haye House, on the east by the Old Chester-road, and on the west by the Stump field hedge,—which was declared by Order of Council dated the eighth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease, is hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and that Place shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be a Place infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.

In the parish of Tydd St. Mary, in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from Sharp's Bridge (across the Great South Holland drain) to Belsham's Three Crossways on the east, thence the highway to Summerson's-lane on the south, thence the said lane to the said drain on the west, and the said drain to Sharp's Bridge on the north.

(11.) In the parish of Sutton St. Mary, (Long Sutton,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the public footpath from Sutton Crosses to the Bourn and Lynn Joint Railway Line on the east, the said Railway Line to the Railway-station on the north, and thence the highway to Sutton Crosses on the west and south.

(12.) In the parish of Gedney, (Village,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the highway from the Railway-station on the Bourn and Lynn Joint Railway to Mr. Clark's Blacksmith's Shop on the west, the Holbeach and Long Sutton highway to the Tilery Cottage on the north, the Grass-lane up to the said Railway Line on the east, and the said Railway Line to the station on the south.

(13.) In the parishes of Gedney, and Sutton St. James, (Clark's Hill Gedney Fen,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the gravel highway from Red House Bridge (over the Great South Holland drain) passing Moore's Wood and Mr. Allen's Wind-Mill up to Mr.

Thomas Snushall's farmhouse on the east, thence Bullock's short Gate passing Mr. Larrington's Skin-yard up to and along the Clough-road to Ravens Clough Public-house on the north, thence Ravens Bank up to Clifton's Bridge on the west, and the said Great South Holland drain to Red House Bridge on the south.

(14.) In the parishes of Pinchbeck, Surfleet, and Spalding, (in the Marsh,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the River Glen from Surfleet Railway-station (on the Great Northern Railway Loop Line) to its junction with the River Welland on the north, the River Welland up to Mr. F. GENERAL ORDER of the Local Government Board altering General Accounts Order: Appointment of Stocktaker.

Staines Union.

To the Guardians of the Poor of the Staines Union, in the county of Middlesex;—  
And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS by General Orders of the Poor Law Board, dated respectively the 14th day of January, 1867, and the 16th day of February, 1869, addressed (among others) to the Guardians of the Poor of the said Staines Union, it is required that certain Accounts relating to the provisions, clothing, and other stores in the Workhouse, when made up and balanced, shall be submitted to the Visiting Committee or to some Member thereof, who shall enter a memorandum at the foot of such Accounts, certifying to the same having been submitted, and to the correctness, or otherwise, of such Accounts as regards the stock remaining in store;

And whereas it is expedient to empower the said Guardians to appoint a competent person or persons to examine the stores at the Workhouse belonging to the said Union, and to perform the other duties herein-after set forth:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by the Statutes in that behalf, hereby order as follows:

ARTICLE I.—The Guardians of the Poor of the said Staines Union may, as and when they shall think fit to do so, appoint a competent person or persons to perform the duties of a Stocktaker as herein-after set forth.

ARTICLE II.—Every such appointment shall be made in the manner prescribed by the Regulations as to the appointment of Officers in force in the said Union for the time being.

ARTICLE III.—The Guardians shall pay to the person or persons appointed under this Order such salary or remuneration as the Local Government Board shall from time to time direct or approve.

ARTICLE IV.—Every person appointed under

this Order shall hold office until he shall die, or resign, or be dismissed by the Guardians subject to the consent of the Local Government Board, or be removed by the Local Government Board, or be proved to be insane by evidence which that Board shall deem sufficient; and the said Guardians shall give notice to the Local Government Board of every such death or resignation, and state the cause of such resignation, so far as it may be known to them.

Provided nevertheless, that the Guardians may, if they think fit, with the assent of the Local Government Board, appoint a person or persons, to discharge the duties hereby prescribed for the Stocktaker, for a limited period only.

ARTICLE V.—The Stocktaker shall, on the day next after the termination of each quarter, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the stores at the Workhouse and compare the same with the quantities of stock remaining in store as shown by the entries in the proper columns in the Accounts termed respectively the "Quarterly Balance of the Provisions Account" and the "Quarterly Balance of the Necessaries and Miscellaneous Account."

He shall also, on the day next after the termination of each half-year, and at any other time when required by the Guardians to do so, examine the Stock of Clothing at the Workhouse and compare the same with the balance appearing in the Accounts termed respectively the "Clothing Materials Receipt and Conversion Account" and the "Clothing Receipt and Expenditure Account."

ARTICLE VI.—After making the examination and comparison referred to in Article V, the Stocktaker, if he find the stock to be correct, shall sign a certificate at the foot of each of the aforesaid Accounts in the following form:—

"Submitted to me this \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ 188\_\_\_\_, and found to be correct as regards the quantities of stock remaining in store

"(Signed) \_\_\_\_\_

"Stocktaker."

If he find the stock to be in any respect incorrect, he shall make such addition to the said certificate as he may deem necessary, specifying the particulars in which he finds the quantities of stock to be incorrectly stated.

ARTICLE VII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall, when required by the Stocktaker to do so, on the days and at the times referred to in Article V., submit to him the stores and Accounts therein mentioned, and render to him such assistance as may be necessary for the purpose of such examination and comparison as aforesaid.

ARTICLE VIII.—The Master of the Workhouse shall lay each of the said Accounts before the Guardians, at their next meeting after the date of the entry therein of any such certificate as aforesaid.

ARTICLE IX.—So long as a Stocktaker is appointed it shall not be necessary for the Visiting Committee to examine the stores or to enter in any Account the memorandum required by the above-cited Order dated the 14th day of January, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-seven.

No carriage shall stop except at passing places or terminal stations, or when necessary to preserve the distance required by the Bye-law No. 3, or when changing horses, or when required to take up or set down a passenger, and then no longer than is absolutely necessary.

6. *Interference with Traffic.*

No person shall in any way wilfully impede or interfere with the traffic on the said tramway.

7. *Penalty.*

Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of the above Bye-laws or Regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence.

8. *Copy of Bye-laws.*

The conductor of each carriage shall carry with him a copy of these Bye-laws, and shall, on

request of any passenger, produce the same to, and shall permit the same to be perused by, such passenger during the passage of the carriage, but shall not stop the carriage for such purpose. A printed copy of these Bye-laws shall be affixed and kept affixed in the office of the Company, and in every waiting-room and other building of the Company situate within the borough.

These Bye-laws shall come into force on the 1st day of November, 1883.
