“ Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a district chapelry should be assigned to the said church of Saint Ilid, situate within the limits of the hamlet of Cray and ancient chapelry of Llanulid aforesaid.

“ Now therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (testified by his having signed and sealed this representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said parish of Devynock which is described in the schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a district chapelry to the said church of Saint Ilid situate within the hamlet of Cray and ancient chapelry of Llanulid as aforesaid, and that the same should be named ‘The District Chapelry of Saint Ilid, Cray.’

“ And with the like consent of the said William Basil Bishop of the said diocese of Saint David's (testified as aforesaid), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said church of Saint Ilid situate within the limits of the hamlet of Cray and ancient chapelry of Llanulid as aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

“ We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal consideration and to make such

Order with respect thereto as to Your Majesty, in Your Royal wisdom, shall seem meet.

“ The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

“ The District Chapelry of Saint Iiid, Cray, being :—

“ All that part of the parish of Devynock in the county of Brecon, and in the diocese of Saint David's which is comprised within and is co-extensive with that portion of the hamlet of Cray and ancient chapelry of Llanulid which is bounded on part of the east and on part of the north by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the hamlet of Maescar in the said parish of Devynock from the hamlet of Cray and ancient chapelry of Llanulid aforesaid at a point in the middle of the line of the Midland Railway and extending thence generally south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of one mile and forty-six chains or thereabouts thereby passing along the western side of the Treweren Valley, to the point opposite to the north-western end of the road which leads towards the house called or known as Nant-Madog and extending thence south-eastward to and along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of six chains or thereabouts to its junction at or near to the said house with the road which leads from Devynock along the said western side of the Treweren Valley aforesaid towards the church of Saint Iiid, Cray, and which is called or known as the Cray Main-road and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of twenty-four chains or thereabouts to its junction with the cross-road called or known as Treweren-road which leads across the said Treweren Valley past the house called or known as Llwynhrychedd into the Senny Valley and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of fifty-six chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said hamlet of Cray and ancient chapelry of Llanulid from the hamlet of Senny in the parish of Devynock aforesaid.

“ Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said parish of Claines which is hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

“ And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

“ And whereas certain hereditaments and premises situate within the limits of the said parish of Claines, have become vested in us under the provisions of and for the purposes of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts or of some or one of them, and we have, in respect of such hereditaments and premises, agreed to make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly hereinbefore-mentioned Act to the minister of the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted, so soon as a minister shall have been appointed and licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, and to his successors, a grant of one hundred and fifty pounds per annum, and also so soon as a church shall have been erected within and for such district, and shall have been approved by us and shall have been consecrated as the church of such district, and such district shall have thereupon become a new parish within the meaning of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, to make to the Incumbent of the said new parish and his successors a further grant from the said fund of fifty pounds per annum.

“ And whereas such grants as aforesaid will be made by an instrument or instruments to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

“ And whereas the Right Reverend Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester and

Martin Curtler, of Worcester Esquire have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of three thousand pounds sterling to be applied in and towards the provision of a church for the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted.

"And whereas the said sum of three thousand pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the minister thereto or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the new parish which such district will or may hereafter become, should be assigned to the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Worcester.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Claines which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Rainbow Hill.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and of the nomination of the minister thereto, or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the new parish which such district will or may hereafter become shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Rainbow Hill being:—

"All that part of the parish of Claines in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Worcester wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded on the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint George Claines in the said county and diocese from the parish of Claines aforesaid at the centre of Gregory Mill Bridge over the Worcester and Birmingham Canal and extending thence generally north-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of one mile and three quarters or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Claines from the parish of Hindlip in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described part of the parish of Claines aforesaid, is bounded upon the remaining sides, other than upon the north-east as aforesaid, that is to say upon the north, upon the south-east, upon the south and upon the west as follows, upon the north by the parish of Hindlip aforesaid, upon the south-east by the parish of Warndon in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the south by the new parish of the Holy Trinity Worcester in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the west by the new parish of Saint George, Claines aforesaid."

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.

"Now therefore with the consent of the Right Reverend Anthony Wilson Bishop of the said diocese of Rochester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme or representation) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly represent recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme or representation the boundaries of the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town shall be extended so that they shall include all that portion of the said new parish of Upper Tooting which is described in the schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the map or plan hereunto appended and is thereon coloured pink and that from and after the day of the same date and without any assurance in law other than such duly gazetted Order the said portions of the said new parish of Upper Tooting shall be dissevered from such new parish and shall be included in and shall become and be and form part of the said new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town.

"Whereas it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob Without sometime known as the district parish of the Holy Trinity Bristol and of the said consolidated chapelry or new parish of Saint Matthew Moorfields which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in manner hereinafter set forth.

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate district any consecrated church or chapel in use for the purposes of Divine worship.

"And whereas the said sum of three thousand pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should also make and pay out of the common fund created by the firstly herein named Act to the minister or incumbent for the time being of the said district or new parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a grant of fifty pounds per annum and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said district or new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof should be assigned to the Reverend Thomas Dehany Bernard a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Wells and now rector or incumbent of Walcot in the county of Somerset the Reverend Edward John Harford now vicar or incumbent of Bathford in the said county of Somerset Clerk in Holy Orders the

Reverend Horace Meyer now vicar or incumbent of Christ Church Clifton, near Bristol, Clerk in Holy Orders, the Reverend Nathaniel Heywood now rector or incumbent of Saint Michael's Bristol Clerk in Holy Orders and George Cooke of Bristol aforesaid Solicitor their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And whereas we have undertaken and agreed to make the said grant of fifty pounds per annum as aforesaid by an instrument to be executed by us under our common seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the twenty-ninth and thirtieth years of Your Majesty chapter one hundred and eleven.

"I. All that portion of the parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob Without (sometime known as the district parish of the Holy Trinity, Bristol) in the diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, which is bounded on the west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said parish of Saint Philip and Saint Jacob Without from the new parish (sometime district chapelry) of Saint Gabriel Bristol in the diocese aforesaid at the point where the road called or known as Clifton-place is joined by Clifton-street and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the last-named street for a distance of one hundred and thirty yards or thereabouts to its

"The territory to be annexed to the new parish of Saint John the Divine Kennington in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester being:—

BYE-LAWS and Regulations made by the Lea Bridge, Leyton, and Walthamstow Tramways Company, under the powers conferred on the Company by "The Tramways Act, 1870."

1. The Bye-laws and Regulations hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages of the Company, and to all places with respect to which the Company have power to make bye-laws or regulations.

2. Every passenger shall enter or depart from a carriage by the hindermost or conductor's platform, and not otherwise.

3. No passenger shall smoke inside any carriage.

4. No passenger or other person shall, while travelling in or upon any carriage, play or perform upon any musical instrument.

5. A person in a state of intoxication shall not be allowed to enter or mount upon any carriage, and if found in or upon any carriage shall be immediately removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

6. No person shall swear or use obscene or offensive language whilst in or upon any carriage, or commit any nuisance in or upon or against any carriage, or wilfully interfere with the comfort of any passenger.

7. No person shall wilfully cut, tear, soil, or damage the cushions or the linings, or remove or deface any number plate, printed or other notice, in or on the carriage, or break or scratch any window of or otherwise wilfully damage any carriage. Any person acting in contravention of this regulation shall be liable to the penalty prescribed by these bye-laws and regulations, in addition to the liability to pay the amount of any damage done.

8. A person whose dress or clothing might, in the opinion of the conductor of a carriage, soil or injure the linings or cushions of the carriage, or the dress or clothing of any passenger, or a person who, in the opinion of the conductor, might for any other reason be offensive to passengers, shall not be entitled to enter or remain in the interior of any carriage, and may be prevented from entering the interior of any carriage, and shall not enter the interior of any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor, and, if found in the interior of any carriage, shall, on request of the conductor, leave the interior of the carriage upon the fare, if previously paid, being returned.

9. Each passenger shall, upon demand, pay to the conductor or other duly authorized officer of the Company the fare legally demandable for the journey.

10. Each passenger shall show his ticket (if any) when required so to do to the conductor or any duly authorized servant of the Company, and shall also when required so to do either deliver up his ticket or pay the fare legally demandable for the distance travelled over by such passenger.

11. A passenger not being an artisan, mechanic, or daily labourer, within the true intent and meaning of the Acts of Parliament relating to the Company, shall not use or attempt to use any ticket intended only for such artisans, mechanics, or daily labourers.

12. Personal or other luggage (including the tools of artisans, mechanics, and daily labourers) shall, unless otherwise permitted by the conductor, be placed on the front or driver's platform, and not in the interior or on the roof of any carriage.

13. No passenger or other person not being a servant of the Company shall be permitted to travel on the steps or platforms of any carriage, or stand either on the roof or in the interior, or sit on the outside rail on the roof of any carriage,

and shall cease to do so immediately on request by the conductor.

14. No person, except a passenger or intending passenger, shall enter or mount any carriage, and no person shall hold or hang on by or to any part of any carriage, or travel therein otherwise than on a seat provided for passengers.

15. When any carriage contains the full number of passengers which it is licensed to contain, no additional person shall enter, mount, or remain in or on any such carriage when warned by the conductor not to do so.

16. When a carriage contains the full licensed number of passengers, a notice to that effect shall be placed in conspicuous letters and in a conspicuous position on the carriage.

17. The conductor shall not permit any passenger beyond the licensed number to enter or mount or remain in or upon any part of a carriage.

18. No person shall enter, mount, or leave, or attempt to enter, mount, or leave, any carriage whilst in motion.

19. No dog or other animal shall be allowed in or on any carriage, except by permission of the conductor, nor in any case in which the conveyance of such dog or other animal might be offensive or an annoyance to passengers. No person shall take a dog or other animal into any carriage after having been requested not to do so by the conductor. Any dog or other animal taken into or on any carriage in breach of this regulation shall be removed by the person in charge of such dog or other animal from the carriage immediately upon request by the conductor, and in default of compliance with such request may be removed by or under the direction of the conductor.

20. No person shall travel in or on any carriage of the Company with loaded fire-arms.

21. No passenger shall wilfully obstruct or impede any officer or servant of the Company in the execution of his duty upon or in connection with any carriage or tramway of the Company.

22. The conductor of each carriage shall enforce or prevent the breach of these bye-laws and regulations to the best of his ability.

23. Any person offending against or committing a breach of any of these bye-laws or regulations shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings.

24. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant in the employment of the Company, and having charge of a carriage.

25. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use a printed copy of these bye-laws and regulations.

26. These bye-laws shall come into force on the 5th day of October, 1883.

NOTICE is hereby given, that at a Meeting of the Town Council of the Borough of Saint Helens, in the county of Lancaster, held on Wednesday, the 1st day of August, 1883, the said Council did make the following Bye-laws, viz. :—

BYE-LAWS made by the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the borough of St. Helens, acting by the Council as the Local Authority for the said borough, at a Meeting of the Council held on Wednesday, the 1st day of August, 1883, with respect to the tramways within the said

borough, under the powers conferred upon them by the Tramways Act, 1870, and the St. Helens and District Tramways Act, 1879, and every other power enabling them in this behalf.

Application of Bye-laws.

1. The bye-laws hereinafter set forth shall extend and apply to all carriages using any tramway within the borough of St. Helens, and to the drivers and conductors of such carriages, and to all places with respect to which the Corporation have power, under the Tramways Act, 1870, and the St. Helens and District Tramways Act, 1879, to make bye-laws and regulations.

Conductor.

2. The expression "conductor" shall include any officer or servant having charge of a carriage.

Speed of Carriages.

3. No carriage shall be driven at a less speed than five miles, nor more than eight miles in the hour, upon the average.

Distance from other Carriages.

4. No carriage shall be driven so as to follow a preceding carriage at a less distance than 30 yards along any portion of a line of tramway.

Stopping for Passengers.

5. Every driver or conductor of a carriage shall stop the same when required to do so by any passenger desirous of leaving the carriage, or by any person desirous of travelling by the carriage, and for whom there is room, and to whose admission no reasonable objection is made.

Railway Bridge, Warrington New-road.

6. The driver of any carriage carrying outside passengers using any tramway laid in Warrington New-road, or in Peasley Cross-lane, in the said borough, shall, before driving any such carriage, or permitting any such carriage to pass under the bridge of the London and North Western Railway Company, which crosses the said road at or near its junction with Peasley Cross-lane aforesaid and Warrington Old-road, stop such carriage, or cause the same to be stopped, whereupon the conductor of such carriage shall warn all outside passengers thereon not to rise in their seats when such carriage is passing under the said bridge, and the driver shall not drive such carriage, or permit the same to pass under the said bridge until the conductor has given the said warning.

Enforcing Bye-laws.

7. The conductor of each carriage shall, to the best of his ability, enforce and prevent the breach of any of these bye-laws.

Penalties.

8. Any driver or conductor of a carriage, or other person who offends against any of the foregoing bye-laws, shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding forty shillings for each offence, and in case of the continuance of such offence to a penalty not exceeding ten shillings for every day during which such offence continues.

Copy of Bye-laws.

9. The conductor of each carriage shall carry with him a copy of these bye-laws, and shall on request of any passenger produce the same to and shall permit the same to be perused by such passenger, and every Tramway Company shall affix and keep affixed in their office and waiting rooms within the borough, a printed copy of the same for the use of the public.

10. These bye-laws shall come into force on the first day of November, 1883.
