

Martin Curtler, of Worcester Esquire have contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of three thousand pounds sterling to be applied in and towards the provision of a church for the district hereinafter recommended to be constituted.

"And whereas the said sum of three thousand pounds sterling has been so contributed and paid to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of patronage of the said proposed district and of the nomination of the minister thereto or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the new parish which such district will or may hereafter become, should be assigned to the Bishop for the time being of the said diocese of Worcester.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Henry Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this scheme) we the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said parish of Claines which is described in the schedule hereunder written all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this scheme become and be constituted a separate district for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Rainbow Hill.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and of the nomination of the minister thereto, or (as the case may be) of the incumbent of the new parish which such district will or may hereafter become shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry, Bishop of the said diocese of Worcester and by his successors Bishops of the same diocese for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of any of them or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Rainbow Hill being:—

"All that part of the parish of Claines in the county of Worcester and in the diocese of Worcester wherein the present incumbent of such parish still possesses the exclusive cure of souls, which is bounded on the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the new parish of Saint George Claines in the said county and diocese from the parish of Claines aforesaid at the centre of Gregory Mill Bridge over the Worcester and Birmingham Canal and extending thence generally north-eastward along the middle of the said canal for a distance of one mile and three quarters or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said parish of Claines from the parish of Hindlip in the county and diocese aforesaid.

"All which said hereinbefore described part of the parish of Claines aforesaid, is bounded upon the remaining sides, other than upon the north-east as aforesaid, that is to say upon the north, upon the south-east, upon the south and upon the west as follows, upon the north by the parish of Hindlip aforesaid, upon the south-east by the parish of Warndon in the county and diocese aforesaid upon the south by the new parish of the Holy Trinity Worcester in the county and diocese aforesaid, and upon the west by the new parish of Saint George, Claines aforesaid."

And whereas drafts of the said scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore-mentioned Act, been transmitted to the patron and to the incumbent of the vicarage of the parish of Claines out of which it is intended that the district recommended in such scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such patron and incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such scheme.

And whereas the said scheme has been approved by Her Majesty in Council: Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Worcester.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four, and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Her Majesty chapter ninety-four duly prepared and laid before Her Majesty in Council a scheme or representation bearing date the fifth day of July, in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three, in the words following, that is to say:—

"We the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England acting under the provisions of the Act of the seventh and eighth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, of the Act of the thirteenth and fourteenth years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four and of the Act of the thirty-second and thirty-third years of Your Majesty chapter ninety-four, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following scheme or representation for altering the boundaries of the new parish of Saint Mary Summers Town in the county of Surrey and in the diocese of Rochester and of the new parish of Upper Tooting in the same county and diocese."

"Whereas by the authority of an instrument bearing date on or about the twentieth day of December in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, and being under the common seal of Your Majesty's late Commissioners for building new churches and also under the hand and seal of the Right Reverend Charles Richard then Bishop of the diocese of Winchester a part of the original parish of All Saints Wandsworth in the
