And whereas the respective incumbents of the said two cures, and the patron of one of the same cures, namely the patron of the vicarage of the new parish of Saint John the Divine, Kennington, have respectively signified their assent to such scheme or representation.

And whereas one calendar month has elapsed since the draft of the said scheme or representation was so transmitted as aforesaid and the patron of the remaining cure, that is to say, the patron of the vicarage of the district parish of Saint George Camberwell, has not offered any observations upon or objections to such scheme or representation.

And whereas the said scheme or representation has been approved by Her Majesty in Council; now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said scheme or representation and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts; and Her Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said diocese of Rochester. *C.
