**T**HE Lords and others of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under The Contagious Diseases (Animals) Act, 1878, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :

1. The following Areas (namely),—(1.) in the parish of Holbeach, (Holbeach Drove,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, Dog Drove from the Great South Holland drain to Barr's-lane on the west, Barr's-lane and an imaginary direct line eastward over lands to Holbeach River on the south, the said River to the said drain on the east, and the said drain to Dog Drove on the north, and (2.) in the parish of Gedney, (Gedney Marsh,) in the petty sessional division of Elloe, in the Parts of Holland, Lincolnshire, comprised within the following boundaries, that is to say, the division line between Mr. Francis Wall Jeffrey's farm and Mr. Kilham Wright's adjoining farm up to Fleet Haven on the south, Fleet Haven in a northerly direction up to the next gravel highway on the west, and the said gravel highway down to the said division line on the north and east,—which were declared by Order of Council to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease, are hereby declared to be free from foot-and-mouth disease, and those Areas shall, as from the commencement of this Order, cease to be Areas infected with foot-and-mouth disease.

2. This Order shall take effect from and immediately after the twenty-fifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-three.
